
 Surveys were completed in face to face interviews using a convenience sample n=479.
 The Hispanic Survey was conducted by four Hispanic Interest Coalition throughout Alabama.


The project is a result of a collaboration between these coalitions, the Office of Minority Health, and the Coalition for a Tobacco free Alabama.



#### How long have you lived in the U.S.?








# Smoking Status in Hispanics 2005




#### **Current Smokers**

## % of Smokers by Education




## Age of Initiation




## By Years in the United States


#### Current Smokers by Years in the US
