



2010 Water Bodies With No Advisories August 2010

Fish from the following sites were analyzed and found to contain no contaminants at levels that required posting of advisories.

Fish from these bodies of water can be consumed with no restrictions.

County	Water Body
Colbert	Bear Creek, Cane Creek, Spring Creek, and Pickwick Reservoir
Jackson	South Sauty Creek, Widows Creek* (note safe area below), and Guntersville Reservoir
Lauderdale	Elk River, Pickwick Reservoir, Wilson Reservoir, and Wheeler Reservoir
Lawrence	Spring Creek
Limestone	Round Island Creek and Wheeler Reservoir
Madison	Wheeler Reservoir
Marshall	Guntersville Reservoir, Short Creek, Spring Creek, Town Creek, and Wheeler Reservoir
Mobile	Mobile Bay
Morgan	Bakers Creek and Flint Creek** (Note specific safe area of Flint Creek below.)
Washington	Tombigbee River

*No restrictions were issued for Widows Creek in Jackson County to 1.0 mile upstream of the confluence with the Tennessee River. A do not consume largemouth bass restriction, as well as a limited consumption of yellow bullhead catfish, has been issued for Widows Creek in the vicinity of the first bridge crossing (Million Dollar Bridge) upstream of the Tennessee River/Widows Creek confluence. A do not consume largemouth bass and limited consumption of freshwater drum restriction was also issued for Widows Creek upstream of Jackson County Road 96.

**No restriction for Flint Creek in Morgan county near Wheeler Reservoir and embayment approximately 1.0 mile downstream of County road 67 bridge. A do not consume Largemouth Bass restriction has been issued for Flint Creek in Morgan county downstream of the West Flint Creek confluence in the vicinity of US Highway 31.
