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| 1. Abbeville  | 2/97: Smoking prohibited in all City buildings.<br>7/11: Tobacco use prohibited in both indoor and outdoor recreational facilities, except in designated smoking areas.  |                  |
| 2. Adamsville | 8/91: Smoking prohibited in workplaces under control of City, except in designated smoking areas. If accommodation cannot be reached between smoking and nonsmoking employees in a given work area, preferences of majority prevail.   |                  |
| 3. Alabama    | 4/7/1995 (009): Regulation not obtained. Relates to smoking and tobacco use in facilities of Dept. of Corrections.<br>6/19/2003 (Sec. 22-15A-1 et seq.): Workplaces, both public and private, may adopt smoking policies by 12/1/03. Smoking prohibited in government buildings and public places generally, except in private offices and designated smoking areas, generally not to exceed 25% of square footage, unless clientele dictates otherwise. In government buildings and specified public places, designated smoking areas must be enclosed and well ventilated. A restaurant that considers itself too small to have a smoking area may decide to be either a smoking or nonsmoking facility (Red Light/Green Light). All bars and retail tobacco stores are exempt.<br>12/17/2004 (009): Smoking prohibited in all Dept. of Corrections buildings, facilities, and vehicles. Designated smoking areas are permitted outside buildings, but not within 10 feet of entrances.<br>1/4/2010 (115-10): Use of tobacco products prohibited in all Dept. of Mental Health facilities, vehicles, and parking lots, with the exception of Partlow due to Medicaid regulations.<br>5/16/2019 (Secs. 13A-12-3.1; 28-11-19): Use of ESDs containing any substance prohibited in any indoor public place, Childcare facilities and vehicles, k-12 schools and off campus events, 2 and 4 year universities, state parks/park buildings, and other specified outdoor recreation areas, sports stadiums, bus stops, and parking decks, public or private. Use also prohibited on grounds and in buildings of healthcare facilities except designated areas, and in workplaces except designated areas. Existing ESD retailers exempt.<br>5/17/2021 (Title 20 Ch. 2A): Use of medical marijuana prohibited on dispensary premises. |                  |

Alabaster      | 5/93: No use of tobacco products in buildings owned, operated, or leased by City.<br>11/10: All restaurants and bars must be designated as either smoking or nonsmoking (Red Light/Green Light provision). Smoking prohibited within 25 feet of entrances to smokefree establishments. Other enforcement agency = City Magistrate. Other penalty = costs.   |                  |
| 5. Albertville    | 6/10: Smoking prohibited in all workplaces, restaurants, bars, and public places generally. Smoking prohibited within 10 feet of entrances to enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited and at all parks, playgrounds, and school grounds.   |                  |
| 6. Alexander City | 8/93: Workplaces must have smoking policy. Smoking permitted in private enclosed offices. Smoking prohibited in specified public places, defined to include places of work, and including restaurants, except in designated smoking areas. Restaurants are exempt during certain hours of operation: 12 midnight to 5 am. All bars are exempt.<br>6/08: Smoking prohibited in all workplaces; restaurants, including attached bars; and public places generally. Smoking prohibited within 10 feet of enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited and in seating areas of outdoor stadiums. Freestanding bars, private clubs that have no employees and are not open to public, and retail tobacco stores are exempt.<br>1/17: PHA policy. Smoking, defined to include e-cigarettes, hookah, and marijuana, also prohibited in PHA offices/work areas and within 25 feet. Eviction upon third violation. Other penalty: costs/warning. |                  |

Andalusia      | 6/96: Smoking prohibited in all municipally owned buildings.<br>4/98: Tobacco use prohibited in any City owned and operated building or property, except in designated outdoor areas. Penalty added.<br>2/07: Smoking prohibited in specified public places, except in places that do not admit minors and in designated smoking areas for employees. Smoking prohibited within 25 feet of public doorways to buildings where smoking is prohibited and in outdoor stadiums. Contains nonretaliation provision. Other penalty = costs; suspension or revocation of license for repeated violations.   |                  |

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| 8. Anniston  | <p>9/93: Workplaces with 5 or more employees must have smoking policy. Smoking permitted in private enclosed offices. Smoking prohibited in specified public places, defined to include places of work, and including restaurants, except in designated smoking areas. Restaurants are exempt during certain hours of operation: 12 midnight to 5 am. Taxis and limousines all of whose occupants consent to smoking and public places too small to allow practical separation of smokers and nonsmokers are exempt.</p> <p>5/06: Nonretaliation clause added. All restaurants and bars must be designated as either Smokefree or Smoking (Red Light/Green Light provision). Smoking prohibited in public places generally, except in separately ventilated smoking areas. Smoking prohibited in outdoor service lines. Other enforcement agency = Fire Dept. Other penalty = suspension or revocation of license; injunction; abatement of nuisance; costs. Fines for smokers are lower.</p> <p>4/13: Smoking, including use of e-cigarettes, prohibited in all workplaces, including outdoor areas where 2 or more employees are required to work; restaurants; bars; gambling facilities; private clubs; and public places generally. Smoking prohibited within 15 feet of entrances, etc. to enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited; in outdoor property adjacent to City buildings; in and within 15 feet of outdoor dining areas of restaurants and bars, except in designated smoking areas at least 7 feet from entrances, etc. to enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited; in outdoor stadiums and in and within 15 feet of bleachers and grandstands; and in and within 15 feet of playgrounds, transit stops, and outdoor service lines. Other penalty = costs. Violation of nonretaliation provision is misdemeanor, punishable by fine of \$500.</p> <p>12/15: Cigar bars are exempt, provided they are in freestanding structure and do not admit minors under age 21.</p> |                  |

| 10. Ashville | 2/96: Smoking prohibited in Town Hall.  |                  |
| 11. Athens   | <p>9/04: Red Light/Green Light provision. All restaurants and bars must declare themselves to be smokefree, smoke-restricted, or smoking. Contains nonretaliation clause. Other penalty = suspension or revocation of license.</p> <p>3/17: PHA policy; includes offices and within 25 feet. Termination upon 2nd violation.</p>  |                  |

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| 12. Atmore         | 10/08: Smoking prohibited in all workplaces, restaurants, bars, and public places generally. Smoking prohibited within reasonable distance of enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited and in seating areas of outdoor stadiums. Retail tobacco stores are exempt.  |   |
| 13. Auburn         | <p>4/92: Workplaces with 5 or more employees must have smoking policy. Smoking permitted in private enclosed offices. Smoking prohibited in specified public places, defined to include places of work, and including restaurants, except in designated smoking areas. Restaurants are exempt during certain hours of operation: 12 midnight to 5 am. All bars, taxis and limousines all of whose occupants consent to smoking and public places too small to allow practical separation of smokers and nonsmokers are exempt, and retail tobacco stores are exempt.</p> <p>11/03: Smoking prohibited in workplaces with 5 or more employees; in restaurants; in bars; and in public places generally.</p> <p>9/06: Smoking prohibited within 10 feet of enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited. Bay Minette    | <p>9/02: Smoking prohibited in all City owned buildings; within 30 feet of entrances to those buildings; and in parks and outdoor recreation areas.</p> <p>10/07: Smoking prohibited in workplaces, except in private offices not located in restaurants or retail stores. Smoking prohibited in restaurants, in public places generally, within 10 feet of enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited, in Simmons Field, and in seating areas of all outdoor stadiums. Private clubs are exempt, except when open to public.</p>  |                  |
| 16. Bayou La Batre | <p>6/90: Smoking prohibited in municipal buildings and facilities that have been designated as no smoking areas. Other enforcement agency = Fire Marshall. Other penalty = community service.</p> <p>5/07: Smoking prohibited in all workplaces, including vehicles; restaurants; bars; and public places generally, including private clubs when open to public. Smoking prohibited within 20 feet of enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited; at all City parks; and in seating areas of outdoor stadiums. Retail tobacco stores, beaches, and outdoor dining areas are exempt. Other enforcement agency = Mayor. Other penalty = injunction; abatement of nuisance; suspension or revocation of license.</p>   |                  |

Bessemer       | <p>7/94: Smoking prohibited in any enclosed area in city building used as place of employment or that is public meeting area.</p> <p>11/07: Smoking prohibited in private workplaces, except in separately ventilated smoking rooms. However, single-tenant commercial office buildings and tenants who wish to allow smoking in private, non-common areas of multi-unit commercial office buildings are exempt. Smoking prohibited in restaurants, including attached bars, and public places generally, except in separately ventilated smoking rooms. Smoking prohibited in real property associated with libraries and other government buildings. Freestanding bars, private clubs, and retail tobacco stores are exempt.</p> <p>8/12: Smoking, including use of e-cigarettes, prohibited in all workplaces, restaurants, bars, gambling facilities, private clubs, and public places generally. Smoking prohibited within 10 feet of entrances, etc. to enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited; in and within 20 feet of outdoor dining areas of restaurants, bars, and transit stops; in outdoor stadiums and in and within 20 feet of bleachers and grandstands; and in outdoor service lines. Other enforcement agency = City Inspections Officers. 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| 18. Birmingham    | <p>5/87: Workplaces must have smoking policy. Smoking permitted in private enclosed offices. Smoking prohibited in public places generally, defined to include places of work, and including restaurants, except in designated smoking areas that are proportionate to preferences of users. Public places that cannot meet that requirement may designate entire area as smoking. All bars and retail tobacco stores are exempt.</p> <p>3/90: Smoking prohibited in acute care hospitals, except for patients under specified conditions.</p> <p>4/95: Workplace provisions replaced by provision that smoking is prohibited in place of employment unless employer, employer representative, or other person in charge has declared in posted writing that smoking is allowed. Smoking prohibited in all buildings, vehicles, and other facilities owned or operated by City.</p> <p>4/05: Smoking prohibited in all restaurants, including attached bars, and public places generally. Freestanding bars and private clubs are exempt.</p> <p>4/12: Smoking prohibited in all workplaces, bars, gambling facilities, and private clubs that have employees or are open to public. Smoking prohibited within 7 feet of entrances, etc. to enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited; in outdoor dining areas of restaurants and bars on public property; in outdoor stadiums and in and with 30 feet of bleachers and grandstands; in and within 7 feet of transit stops; and in outdoor service lines. Cigar bars and hookah bars that do not admit minors are exempt. Other penalty = costs. Violation of nonretaliation provision is misdemeanor, punishable by fine of \$1000.</p> |  |
| 19. Blount County | 1/12: Tobacco use prohibited in County Health Dept. buildings and vehicles and at all campus outdoor areas. Other enforcement agency = Supervisors. Other penalty = disciplinary procedures for employees.  | 1/12: Policy applies only to County facilities; it does not affect incorporated areas of County. |
| 20. Boaz          | 2/95: Smoking prohibited in all City owned buildings and structures.  |  |

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| 21. Brent        | 6/96: Smoking prohibited in common areas of public workplaces. City employees may designate own work area as nonsmoking and nonsmokers have preference. Smoking prohibited in all public places owned by City. Other enforcement agency = City Clerk. Copy of ordinance obtained is incomplete.<br>9/16: PHA Policy. Smoking, including use of e-cigarettes and hookahs and smoking marijuana, prohibited in Housing Authority offices, maintenance facilities, and vehicles. Other penalty = costs of repairing smoke damage.  |                  |
| 22. Brewton      | 6/96: Smoking prohibited in City Buildings on Douglas Ave. Other enforcement agency = City Clerk. Other penalty = for employees -- disciplinary action; for public -- 1st violation -- asked to leave building; 2d violation -- pursuant to state law.<br>8/06: All restaurants and bars must choose to be either nonsmoking or smoking, with minors excluded (Red Light/Green Light provision). Smoking prohibited in specified public places, including government facilities and vehicles, except in designated smoking areas for employees; within 25 feet of entrances to those places; and in outdoor sports arenas. Smoking prohibited within 30 feet of entrances to public places and in parks, including Town Hall grounds, bleacher areas, swimming pools, and skate parks, except in designated smoking areas. Freestanding bars, private clubs, and retail tobacco stores are exempt. Other penalty = fine pursuant to State law. |                  |

| 26. Carbon Hill  | 9/16: PHA policy. Smoking, defined to include e-cigarettes, hookah, and marijuana, also prohibited in PHA offices and within 25 feet. Other Penalty: costs.   |                  |
| 27. Center Point | 2/06: Smoking prohibited in all workplaces, restaurants, and public places generally. Smoking prohibited within 15 feet of entrances, etc. to enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited, and in parks and recreation areas, including swimming pools, but excepting parking lots at parks. All bars, private clubs, and retail tobacco stores are exempt.  |                  |
| 28. Chelsea      | 2/06: Smoking prohibited in City buildings and vehicles and on City land, except in designated smoking areas. Other penalty = disciplinary action for employees; removal from premises for public.  |                  |

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| 29. Cherokee County | 1/12: Tobacco use prohibited in County Health Dept. buildings and vehicles and at all campus outdoor areas. Other enforcement agency = Supervisors. Other penalty = disciplinary procedures for employees.   | 1/12: Policy applies only to County facilities; it does not affect incorporated areas of County. |
| 30. Chickasaw       | 12/88: Smoking prohibited in City Hall, Davis Municipal Auditorium, and Civic Center, except in designated smoking areas. Other penalty = hard labor and community service.<br>3/10: Housing law. Smoking prohibited in offices of Chickasaw Housing Authority.<br>11/13: Smoking prohibited in all workplaces, restaurants, bars, gambling facilities, and public places generally. Smoking prohibited within 15 feet of entrances, etc. to enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited; in and within 15 feet of playgrounds and transit stops; in outdoor stadiums and in and within 15 feet of bleachers and grandstands; and in outdoor service lines. Private clubs and retail tobacco stores are exempt. |  |
| 31. Childersburg    | 1/94: Smoking prohibited in City-owned buildings and vehicles, except in smoking areas designated by Dept. heads.  |  |
| 32. Citronelle      | 8/99: Smoking prohibited in all buildings owned or controlled by City, except for designated smoking area in restaurant at golf course. Other penalty = costs.<br>12/05: Smoking prohibited in all workplaces, restaurants, bars, and public places generally, and within 10 feet of entrances to enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited and of outdoor service lines. Other enforcement agency = City. Other penalty = suspension or revocation of license.   |  |
| 33. Clanton         | 3/99: Smoking prohibited in City Hall and City shops and enclosures used in connection with and under control of City, except in designated smoking areas.<br>2/05: All restaurants and bars must be designated as either smokefree or smoking - Red Light/Green Light. Restaurants and bars may provide separately ventilated smoking lounges. Contains nonretaliation provision. Other enforcement agency = City. Other penalty = suspension or revocation of license.   |  |



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| 34. Clay       | 11/11: Smoking, including use of e-cigarettes, prohibited in all workplaces, restaurants, bars, gaming facilities, and public places generally. Smoking prohibited within 20 feet of entrances, etc. to enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited; in outdoor stadiums; in and within 20 feet of outdoor dining areas of restaurants and bars, playgrounds, and transit stops; in outdoor property adjacent to City buildings; and in outdoor service lines. Private clubs with no employees are exempt, except when open to public. Retail tobacco stores are exempt. Other enforcement agency = Building Inspector. Other penalty = costs.   |                  |
| 35. Cordova    | 10/13: Smoking, including use of hookahs, prohibited in all municipal buildings and vehicles, on all Municipals property, including parks; in specified public places; and in all other public places, except in designated smoking areas. Private clubs, a majority of whose directors vote to allow smoking, and retail tobacco stores are exempt. Other penalty= costs. Fines are minimums.  |                  |
| 36. Cottonwood | 12/05: Smoking prohibited in all enclosed structures, defined to include all workplaces, restaurants, bars, and public places generally. Smoking prohibited within 15 feet of entrances, windows, etc. of enclosed structures and in public parks and recreation areas, except in designated smoking areas. Other penalty = court costs.  |                  |
| 37. Creola     | 4/13: Smoking, including use of e-cigarettes, prohibited in all workplaces, restaurants, bars, gambling facilities, and public places generally. Smoking prohibited on City property adjacent to City buildings; within 15-20 feet of entrances, etc. to enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited; in and within 15-20 feet of outdoor dining areas of restaurants and bars, playgrounds, and transit stops; in outdoor stadiums and in and within 15-20 feet of bleachers and grandstands; and in outdoor service lines. Other enforcement agency = Building Inspector. Other penalty = costs. Violation of nonretaliation provision is misdemeanor, punishable by fine of \$1000. |                  |
| 38. Crossville | 5/05: Smoking prohibited in all buildings owned by or under control of Town; in all outdoor areas outside those buildings; and in all Town recreation areas, including parks and playgrounds. Other enforcement agency = Town officials.  |                  |

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| 39. Cullman   | <p>2/93: Smoking prohibited in buildings, structures, and facilities owned or operated by govt. entities, except for jails. Restaurants with more than 50 seats must have nonsmoking section to meet customer demand. Smoking prohibited in specified public places.</p> <p>6/05: Ordinance provides that smoking is prohibited in all workplaces, restaurants, and public places generally, but also provides that any establishment may be declared to be a smoking establishment (Red Light/Green Light provision). All bars and private clubs are exempt, but bars may not allow smoke to infiltrate into areas where smoking is prohibited. Smoking prohibited within 15 feet of entrances, etc. to enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited.</p>  |                  |
| 40. Dadeville | <p>3/95: Smoking prohibited in City Hall and Recreation Center, except in smoking areas. designated by Mayor and City Council.</p>  |                  |
| 41. Daleville | <p>9/06: All workplaces must have smoking policy and provide nonsmoking areas for nonsmoking employees to maximum extent possible. Employees may designate own work area as nonsmoking and nonsmokers have preference. Restaurants with liquor license and bars must be designated as either smoking or nonsmoking (Red Light/Green Light provision). Other restaurants may elect to be smoking establishment and bars that do not admit minors are exempt. Smoking prohibited in public places generally and within 15 feet of entrances, etc. to enclosed places where smoking is prohibited. Private offices and retail tobacco stores are exempt.</p>   |                  |
| 42. Daphne    | <p>6/93: Smoking prohibited in workplaces and public places, except in designated smoking areas. Restaurants with 20 or more seats must be at least 50% nonsmoking. Smaller restaurants have option to allow smoking, have nonsmoking section, or be nonsmoking throughout (Red Light/Green Light provision). Other enforcement agency = fire officers and Code Enforcement Officer.</p> <p>2/08: Smoking prohibited in all workplaces, restaurants, public places generally, and private clubs when open to public. Smoking prohibited within 20 feet of entrances to enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited, in seating areas of outdoor stadiums, and in parks. Freestanding bars that don't admit minors and retail tobacco stores are exempt. Other penalty = costs.</p> <p>8/14: Use of e-cigarettes prohibited in all City buildings and vehicles and within 20 feet of entrances to enclosed areas where e-cigarettes prohibited.</p> |                  |

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| 43. Decatur       | <p>6/93: All workplaces must have smoking policy. Nonsmokers have preference. Private offices are exempt. Smoking sections may be designated in most public places, but must use existing barriers and ventilation systems to minimize toxic effects of smoking in nonsmoking areas. Smoking permitted throughout restaurants during certain hours of operation: 12:00 Midnight to 5:00 A.M. Public places that are too small for separate sections are exempt.</p> <p>6/01: Smoking prohibited at aquatic center.</p> <p>8/03: Smoking prohibited in all workplaces, restaurants, bars, and public places generally. Smoking prohibited within 10 feet of enclosed areas where smoking is prohibited and in seating areas of outdoor stadiums. Other enforcement agency = Building and Inspection Dept. Other penalty = disciplinary procedures for employees.</p>  | <p>1/12: Policy applies only to County facilities; it does not affect incorporated areas of County.</p> |
| 45. Demopolis     | <p>1/91: Establishes designated smoking area in each public building, with exception of specified buildings that are to be smokefree. Civic Center is exempt.</p>  |   |

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| 46. Dothan       | <p>5/92: Smoking defined to include any combustible substance. All workplaces, including private clubs, must have smoking policy. Smoking prohibited in specified areas. Smoking prohibited in common work areas unless all employees agree to smoking area. Employees may designate own area as nonsmoking, and nonsmokers have preference. Private offices are exempt. Ordinance provides that restaurants must be at least 50% nonsmoking and prohibits smoking in public places generally, but also provides that owners, etc. of retail stores, areas available to and customarily used by general public, and restaurants may declare entire establishment as smoking establishment, provided proper signs are posted. Bars are exempt. Other penalty = community service.</p> <p>10/03: Workplace provisions amended by eliminating prohibition on smoking in specified areas. Red Light/Green Light provision for restaurants. Smoking prohibited in restaurants and attached bars must be separately ventilated unless restaurant chooses to be smoking establishment. Retail tobacco stores are exempt, provided that smoke does not infiltrate into areas where smoking is prohibited. Other penalty = injunction; suspension or revocation of license.</p>  |                  |
| 48. Elba         | <p>8/97: Smoking prohibited in all Municipally owned properties, buildings, and vehicles, except in designated smoking areas. Other enforcement agency = appointees of Mayor. Other penalty = pursuant to State law; disciplinary action for employees.</p>   |                  |
| 49. Enterprise   | <p>12/92: Smoking prohibited in specified City buildings, except in certain designated areas. Other enforcement agency = Fire Dept.
