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Mission of the Alabama Office of Emergency Medical Services

OVERVIEW

The Department of Public Health Office of Emergency Medical Services (OEMS) is tasked with oversight of emergency medical services in Alabama. The OEMS is responsible for protecting the health, safety, and welfare of the public by assuring that emergency medical response agencies, training entities, and emergency medical services personnel meet or exceed established standards. The mission of the OEMS is to reduce preventable mortality and morbidity caused by trauma and other emergency medical conditions.

FORCE OF LAW

The Code of Alabama 1975, §22-18-1, set forth the authority of the OEMS to create rules and regulations. The legislation includes mandates for the State Emergency Medical Control Committee (SEMCC), and all regulatory processes (licensure, fees, compliance, operations, etc.) regulated by the OEMS.

ADMINISTRATIVE MISSION

The spectrum of tasks that the OEMS implements for the Alabama Department of Public Health (ADPH) and Alabama, at large, includes but is not limited to:

- Facilitation of the prehospital component of the Alabama Incident Management System (AIMS), which allows the ADPH to monitor hospitals, nursing homes, and ambulance resources during times of disaster.
- Facilitation of the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) staffing of Medical Needs Shelters for the Center for Emergency Preparedness, during times of disaster.
- Facilitation and administration of Alabama's electronic patient care reporting (ePCR) entreated by the federal government via the National Emergency Medical Services Information System (NEMSIS). The OEMS provides free software to facilitate licensed EMS provider data reporting. The software, Recording of Emergency Medical Services Calls and Urgent-care Environment (RESCUE), is compliant with the NEMSIS Version 3 platform for national EMS reporting. Otherwise, third-party software vendors are supplied upon request with the Alabama NEMSIS Version 3 schematron to enable their Alabama EMS provider service clients' ePCR process. Data uploaded by EMS provider services is retained in the Alabama NEMSIS repository and further uploaded to the national NEMSIS repository.

- Facilitation and administration of Alabama’s prehospital EMS provision; including standards, licensure, and compliance oversight for individuals, services, businesses, and departments engaged in provision of emergency medical care and/or transport of the sick and injured; oversight and guidance for universities, colleges, and schools engaged in EMS training; and the responsibility for quality assurance and quality improvement processes for Alabama EMS provider services through periodic inspection of deployed EMS vehicles and equipment and, for individuals and service providers, through definitive complaint investigation and adjudication.
- Facilitation and administration of Alabama’s arrangement with the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT) to oversee and guarantee integrity of the National Registry of EMTs examination process. National Registry certification is a prerequisite for licensure at the level of that certification in Alabama.
- Facilitation and administration of Alabama’s Acute Health Systems (AHS) which includes the Alabama Trauma System (ATS) and the Alabama Statewide Stroke System, as well as the Alabama Trauma Registry (ATR), which also closely monitors head and spinal cord injuries. The AHS are also currently developing to include data reporting and management of cardiac data, especially myocardial infarction pathologies. That component of the AHS (the Alabama ST-Elevation Myocardial Infarction, or STEMI system) is now online. Much of the data collection and management for AHS is facilitated through the University of Alabama at Birmingham. In all aspects of the AHS, the OEMS coordinates with area hospitals to facilitate uniform data recording of provided care to enable data follow-up of patients from the prehospital phase until well into the specialty hospital care process.
- Facilitation and administration of the Alabama EMS Regional Agencies. Alabama counties are assigned to one of six EMS Regions that are tasked by the OEMS with: providing an initial point of contact for EMS issues or concerns, organizing meetings, and providing effective communication between local communities and the OEMS, assisting constituent EMS personnel with rules compliance, providing local ongoing credentialing, and functioning as a clearing house for EMS education activities. Each regional agency also assists with coordination and implementation of the AHS components.
- Facilitation and administration of the federally funded Emergency Medical Services for Children (EMSC) Program. The purpose of the EMSC is to prevent and reduce child, youth, and adolescent disability and death resulting from severe illness and injury. To accomplish its goal, the program provides education for prehospital providers and ensures that the American Academy of Pediatrics/American College of Emergency Physicians (AAP/ACEP) guideline compliant equipment is available on prehospital emergency vehicles that transport children.

- Provision of EMS data management and analysis for the purposes of quality assurance and improvement, compliance investigations, public health investigations of illness and injury, and research to drive the development of EMS efficacy in Alabama.

Purpose and Methods

PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to present to our stakeholders a systematic overview of EMS calls occurring in Alabama in 2022. Data for this report was synthesized from the RESCUE database developed by the Center for Public Safety of the University of Alabama in Tuscaloosa based on NEMSIS V3 data standards.

METHODOLOGY

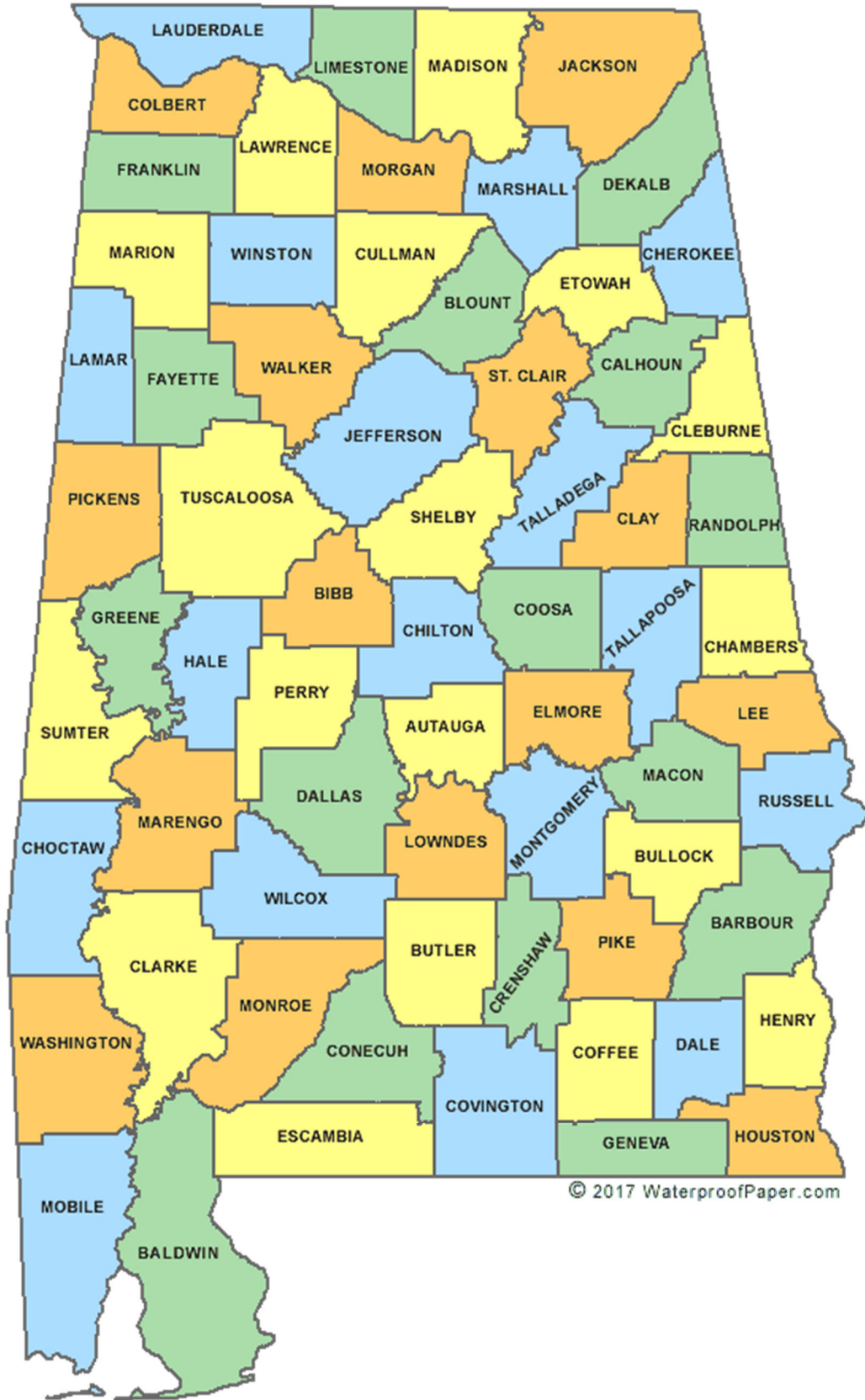
RESCUE captures prehospital care through both required and optional reporting elements and data are validated to meet (NEMSIS-3) standards. RESCUE captures agency information, patient demographics, response times, incident location, prehospital treatment, EMS transport, insurance, and patient disposition.

A total of 924,342 EMS runs were submitted to RESCUE from January 1, 2022, to December 31, 2022, as of May 18, 2023. The OEMS used the 2022 U.S. Census Bureau, Vintage 2022 Population Estimates www.census.gov/programs-surveys/popest.html figures to calculate EMS runs per 10,000 Alabama residents.

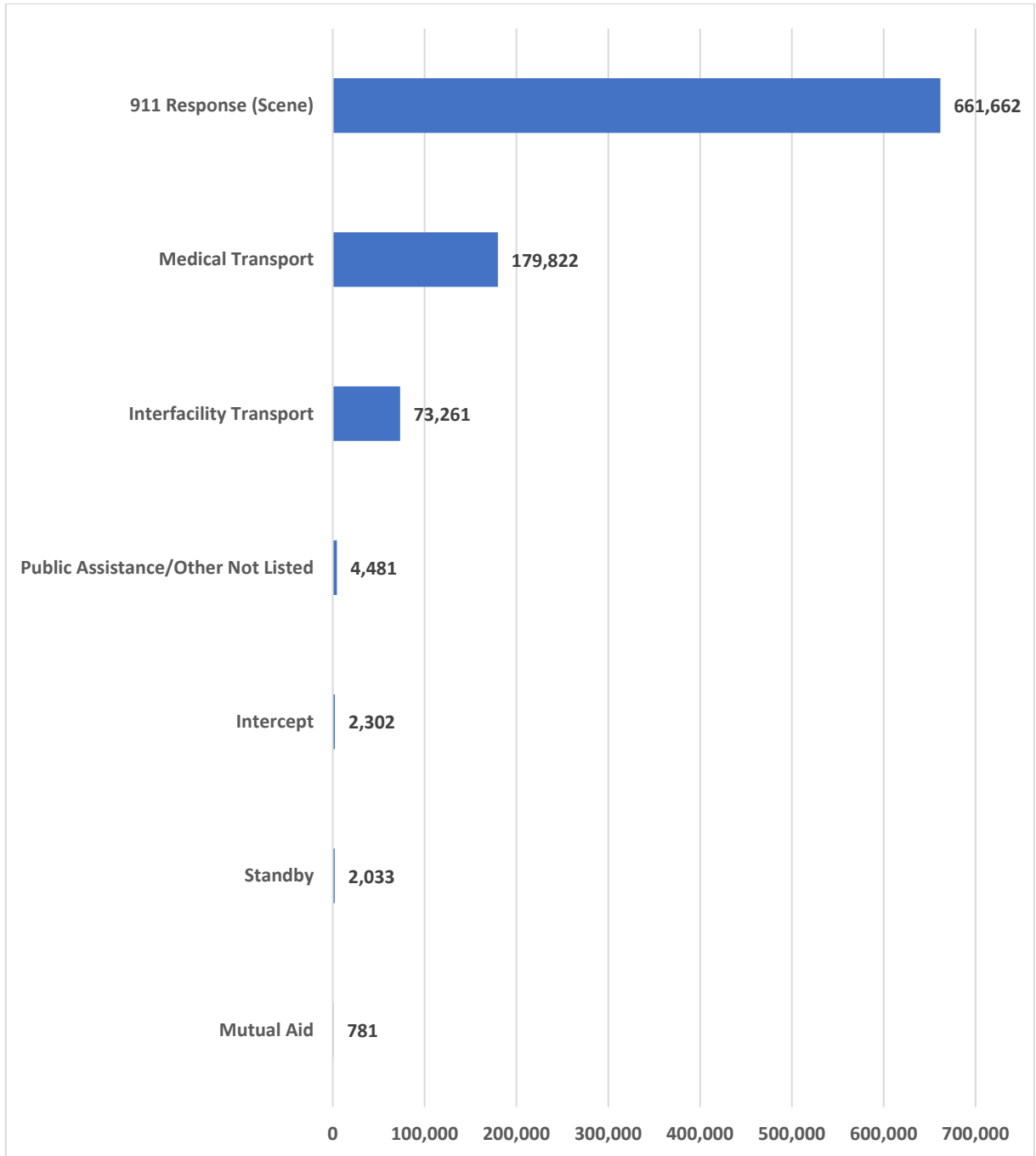


Chart 1 shows a breakdown of type of service requested. The predominant was emergency response dispatched through the 9-1-1 system at 72 percent (n = 661,662).

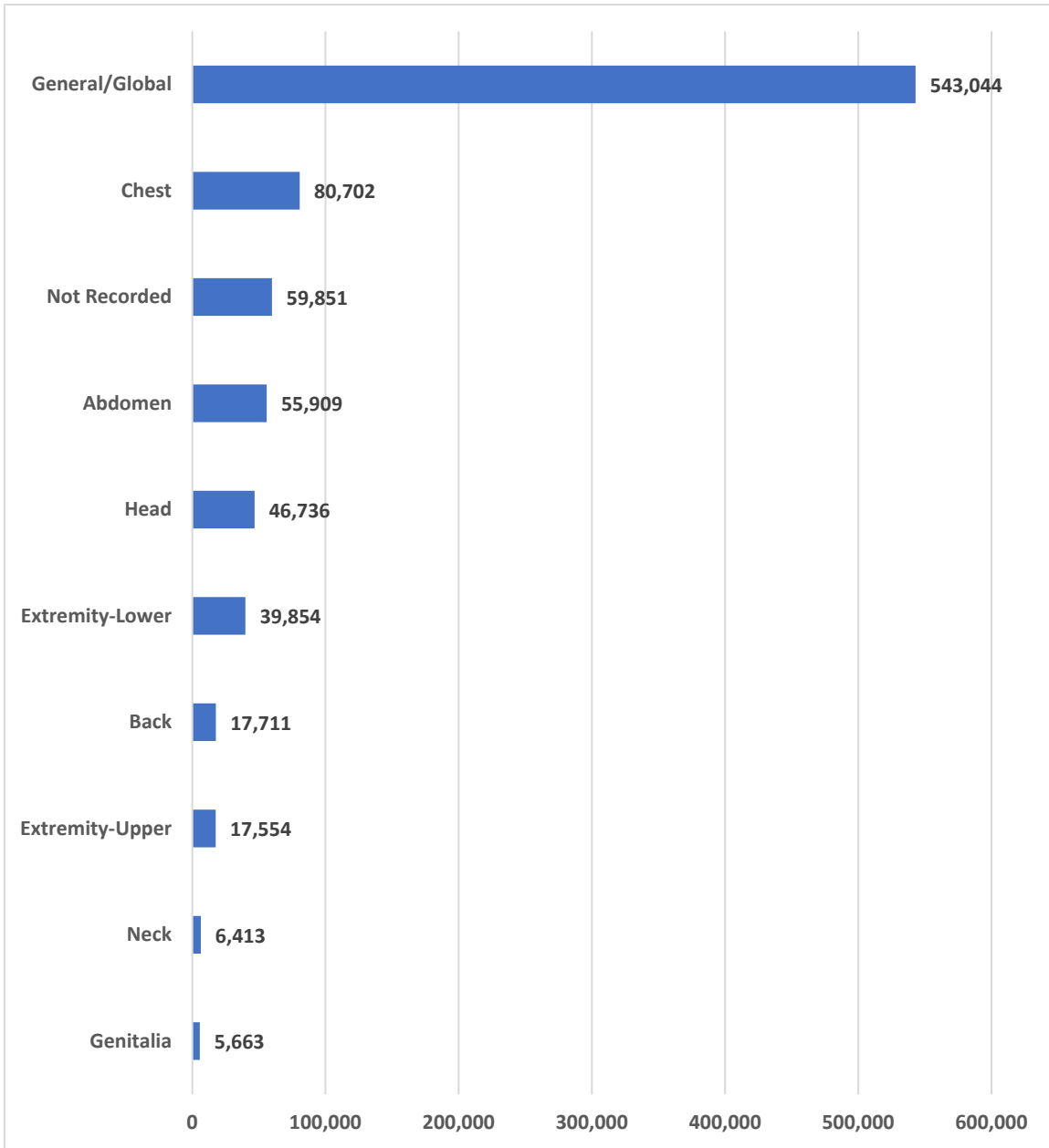


Chart 2-A shows chief complaint anatomic locations. The predominant was general/global anatomic location complaints at 62 percent (n = 543,044).

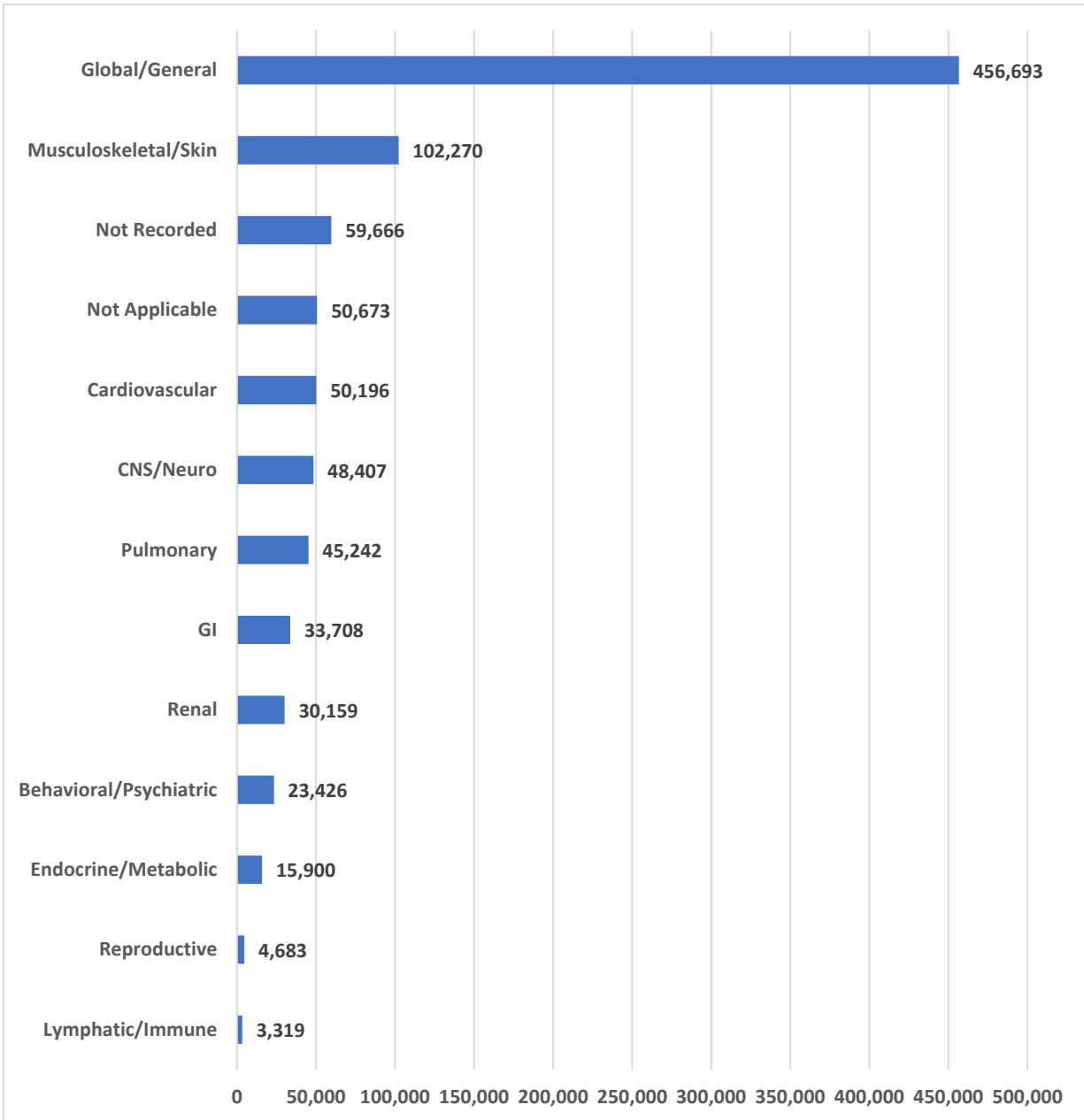
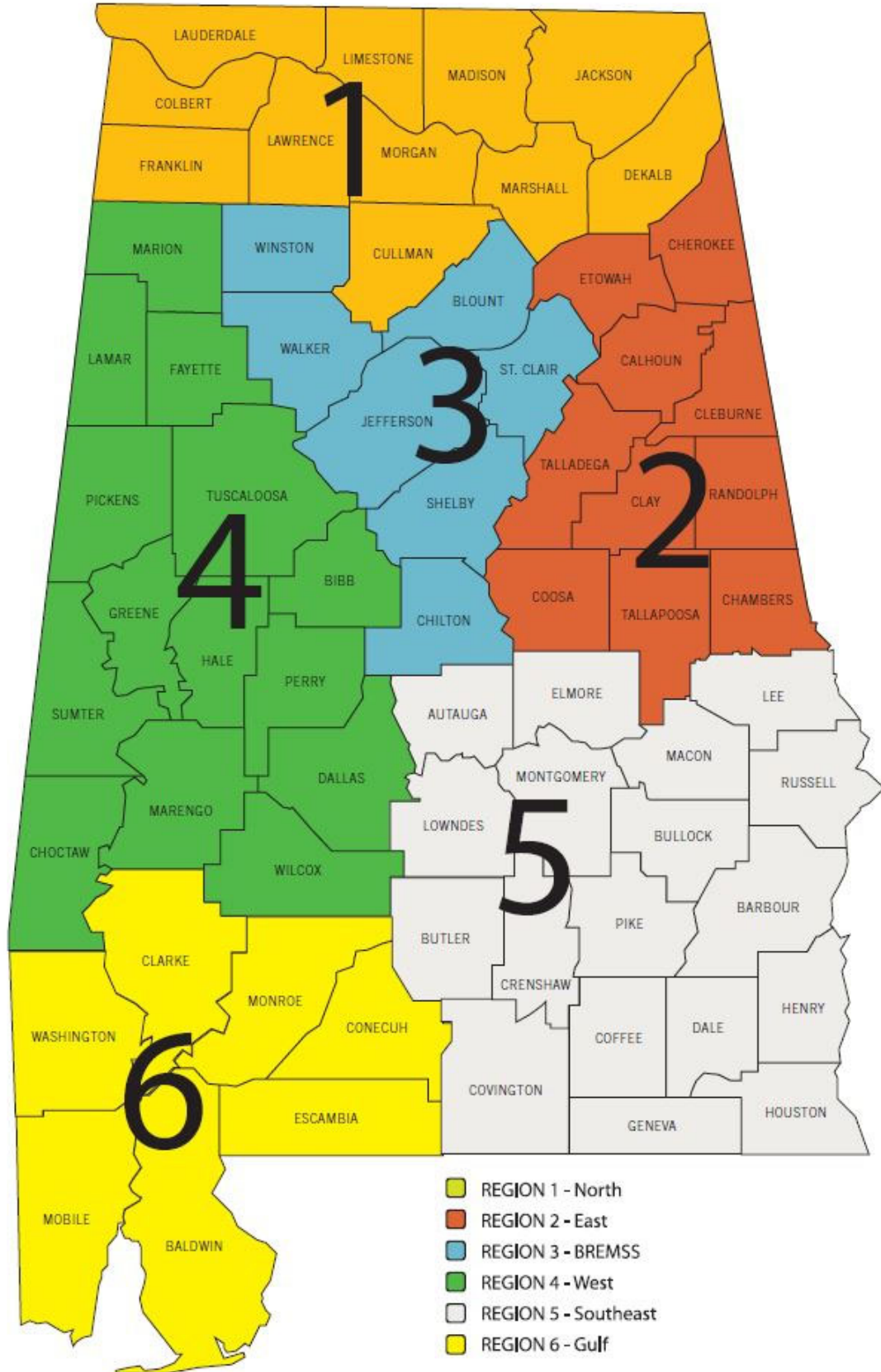


Chart 2-B shows chief complaint primarily involved organ systems. The predominant was global/general (systemic) complaints at 49 percent (n = 456,693).

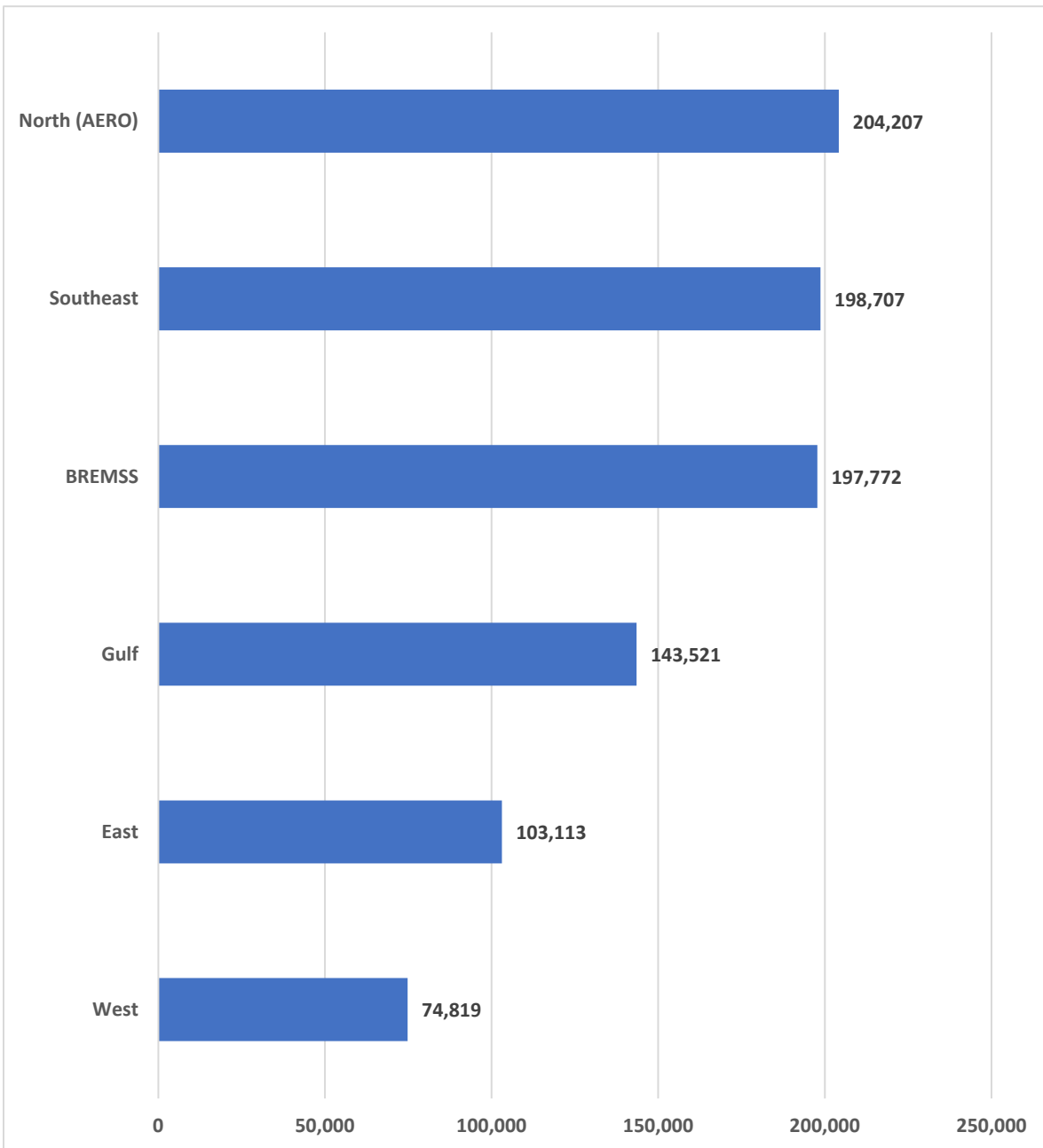


Chart 3 shows call volume by EMS Regions. The predominant was 22 percent (n = 204,207) in North (AERO) Region.

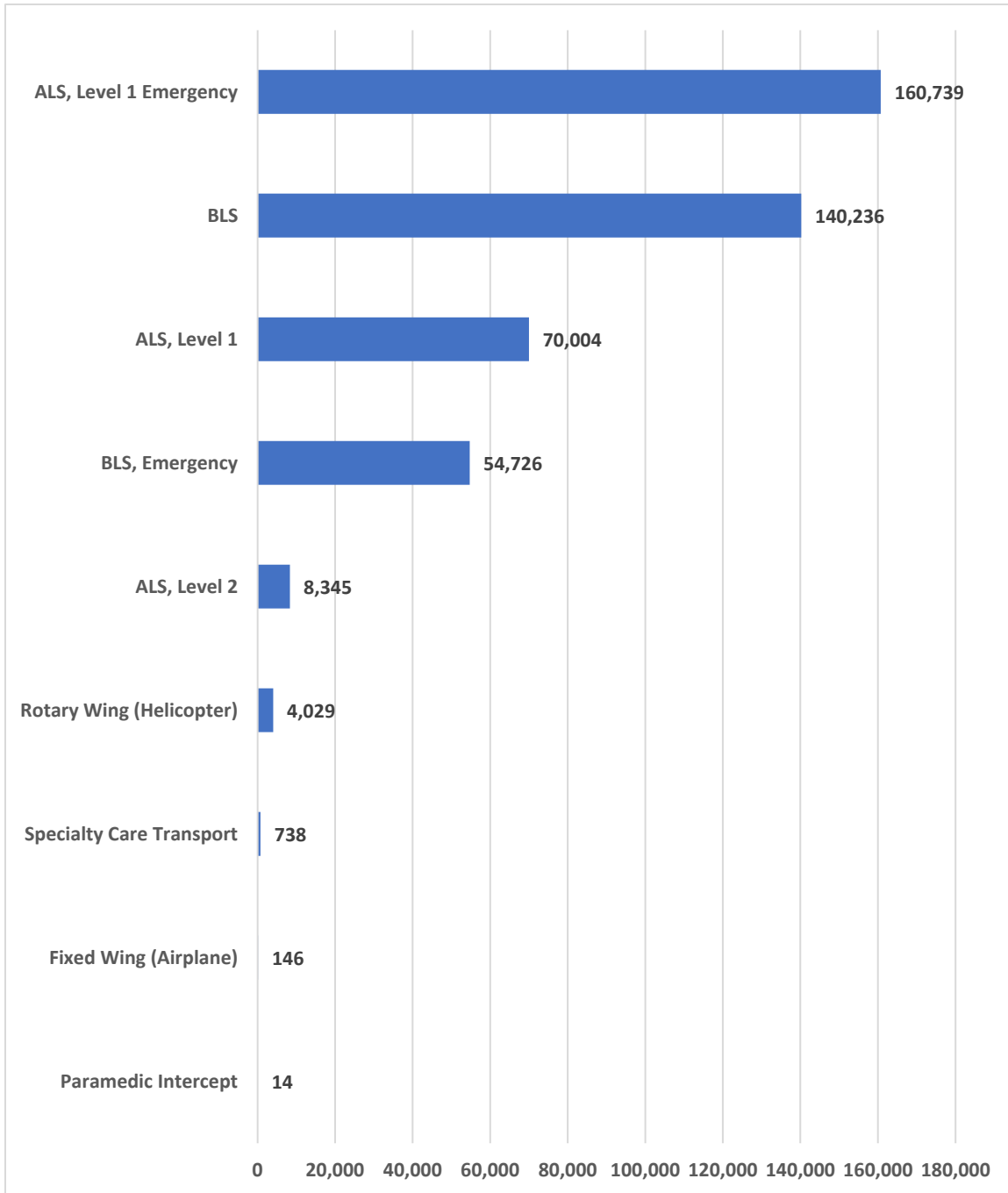


Chart 4 shows CMS service levels. The predominant was ALS, Level 1 Emergency at 37 percent (n = 160,739).

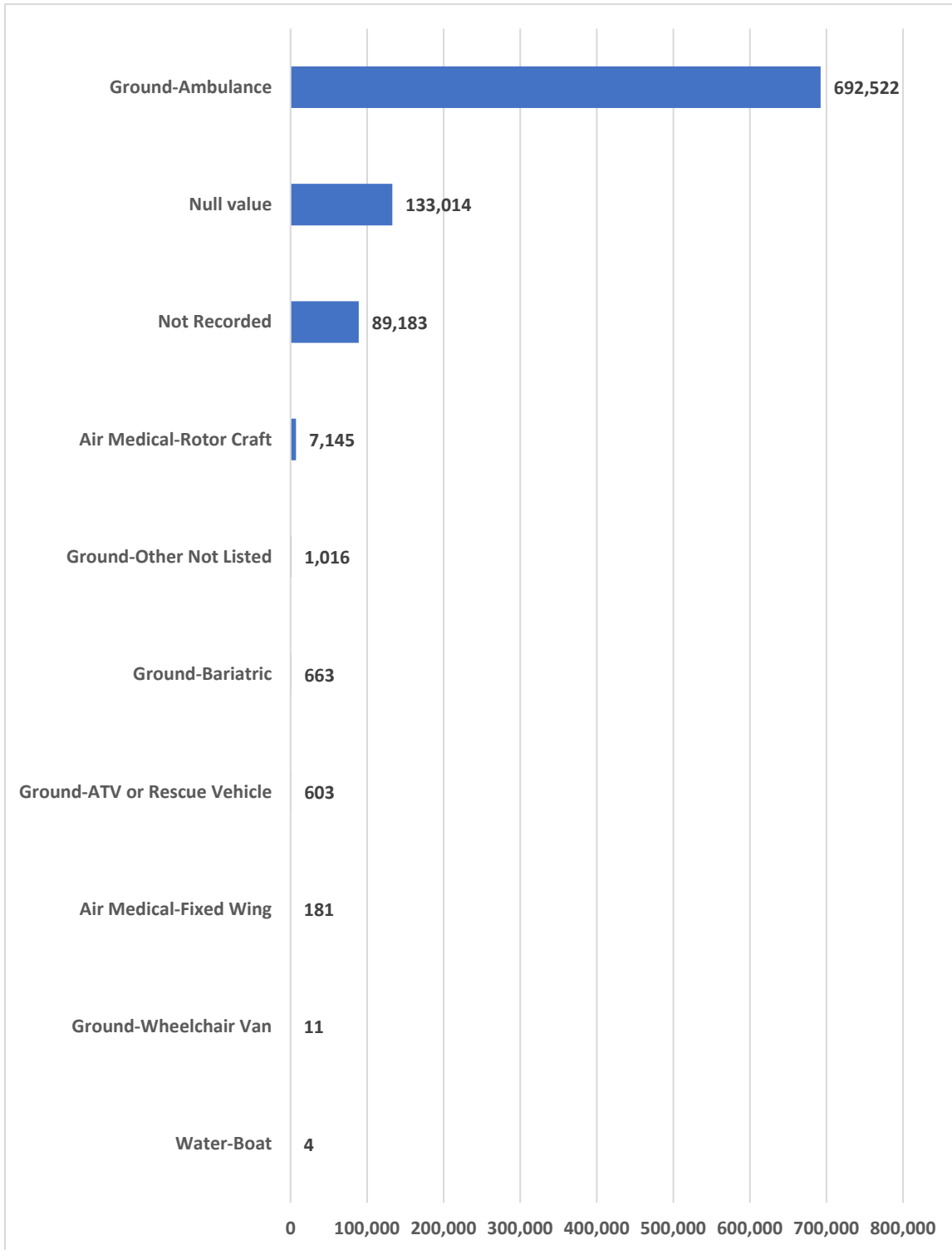


Chart 5 shows transport methods. The predominant method was ground ambulance at 75 percent (n = 692,522).

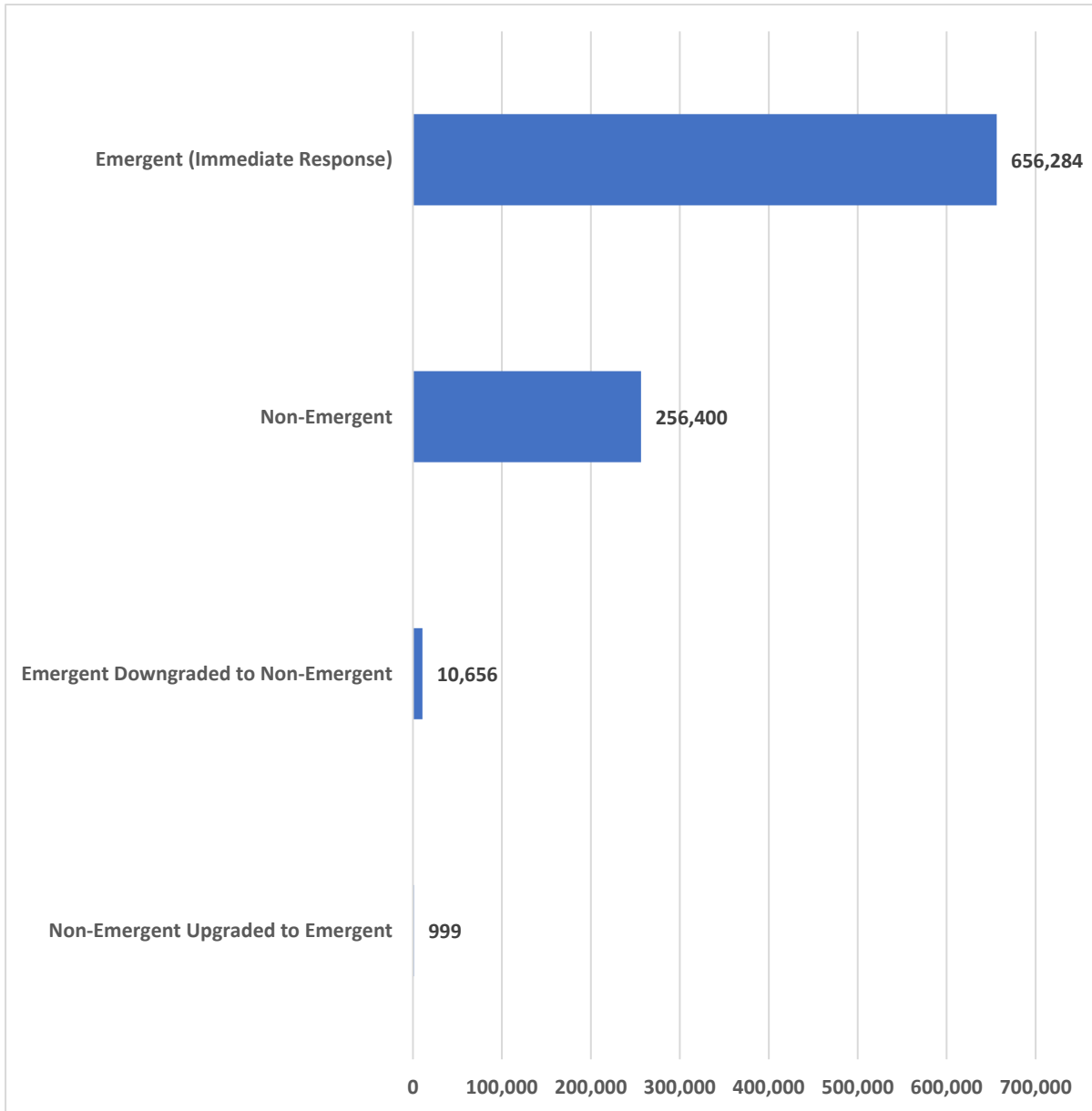


Chart 6 shows response mode to scene. The predominant mode was emergent (immediate response) at 71 percent (n = 656,284).

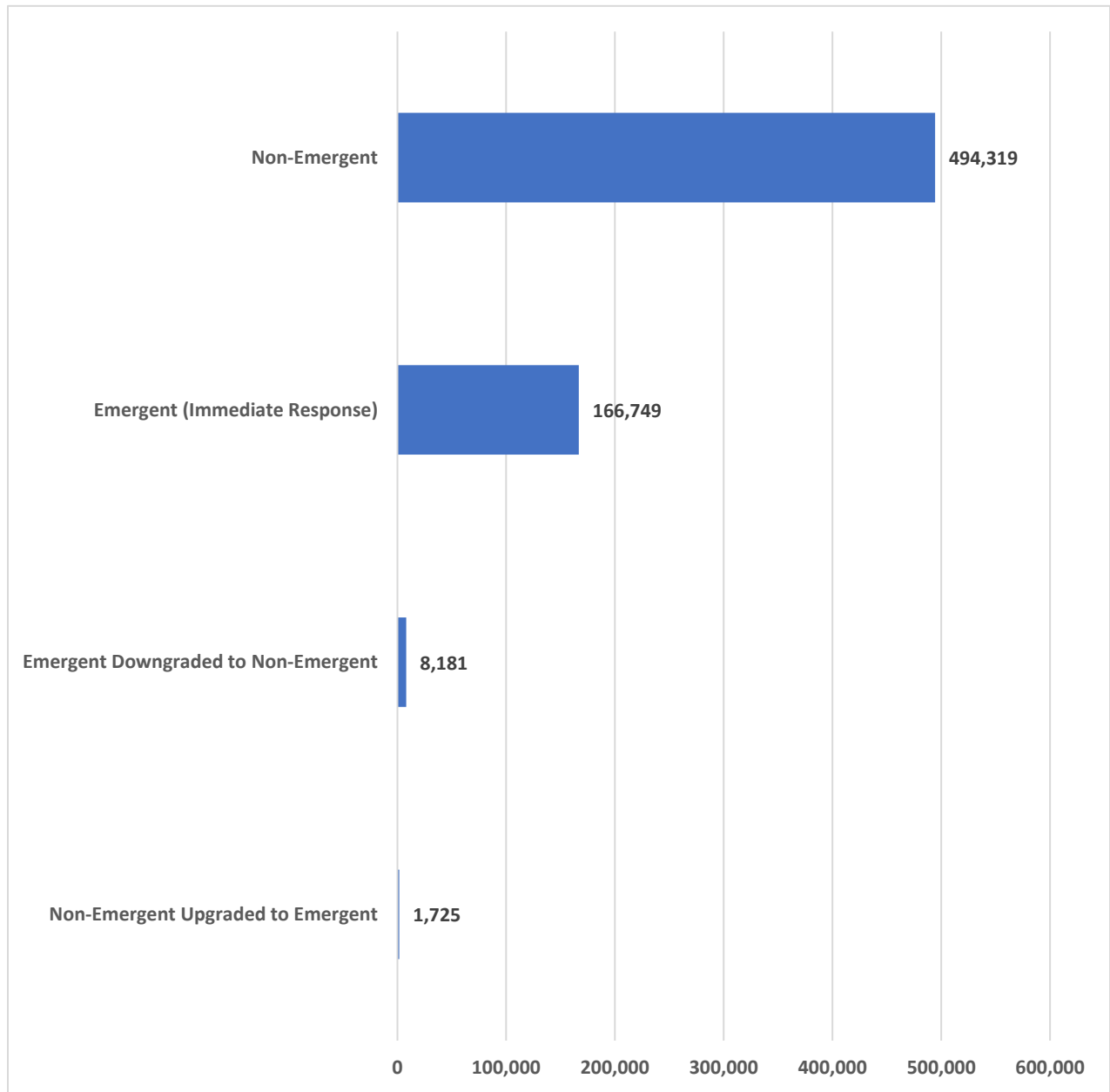


Chart 7 shows transport mode from scene. The predominant was non-emergent from the scene at 74 percent (n = 494,319).

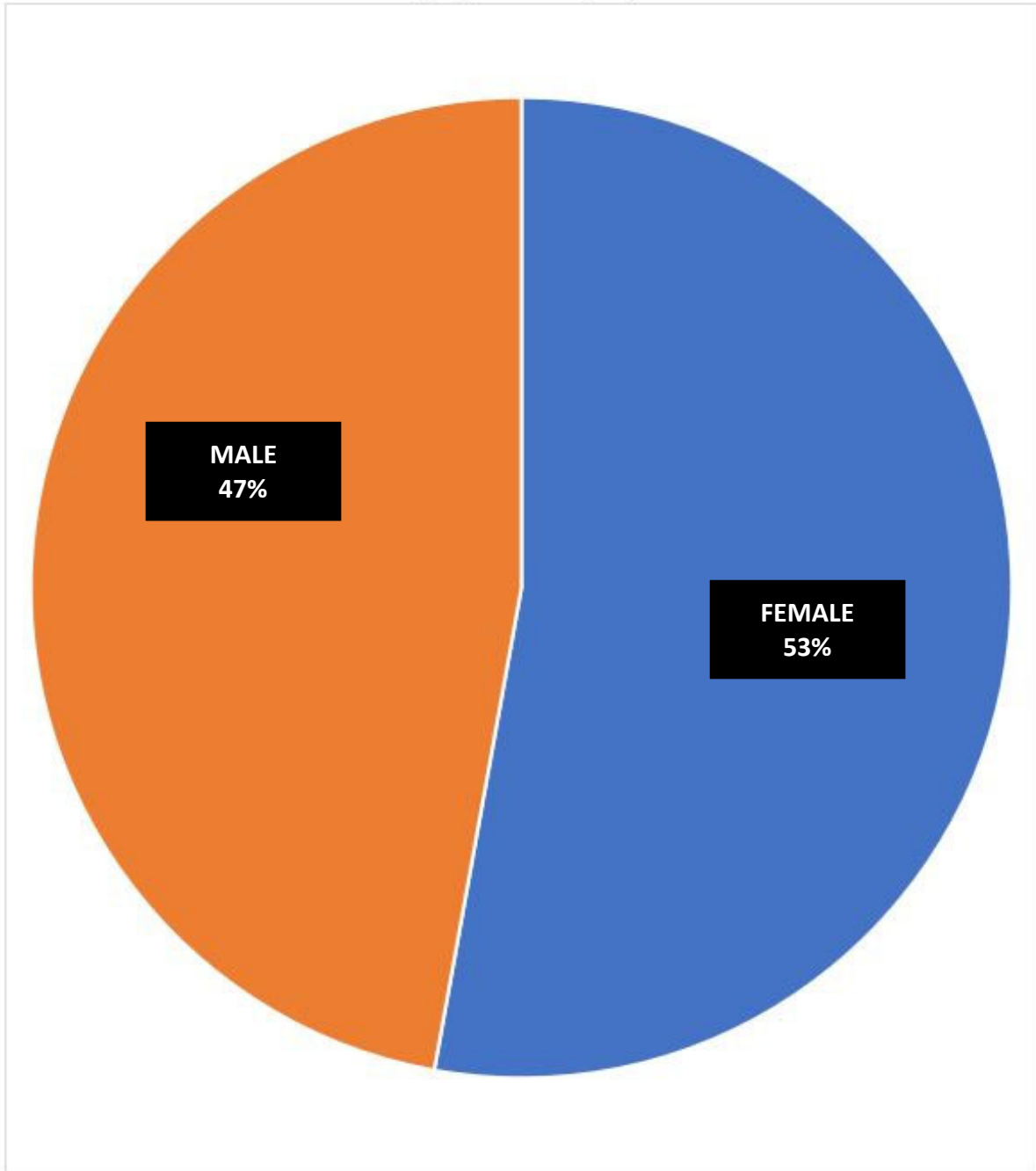


Chart 9 shows gender distribution of patients. EMS provided care to 53 percent females (n = 450,598) and 47 percent males (n = 402,064).

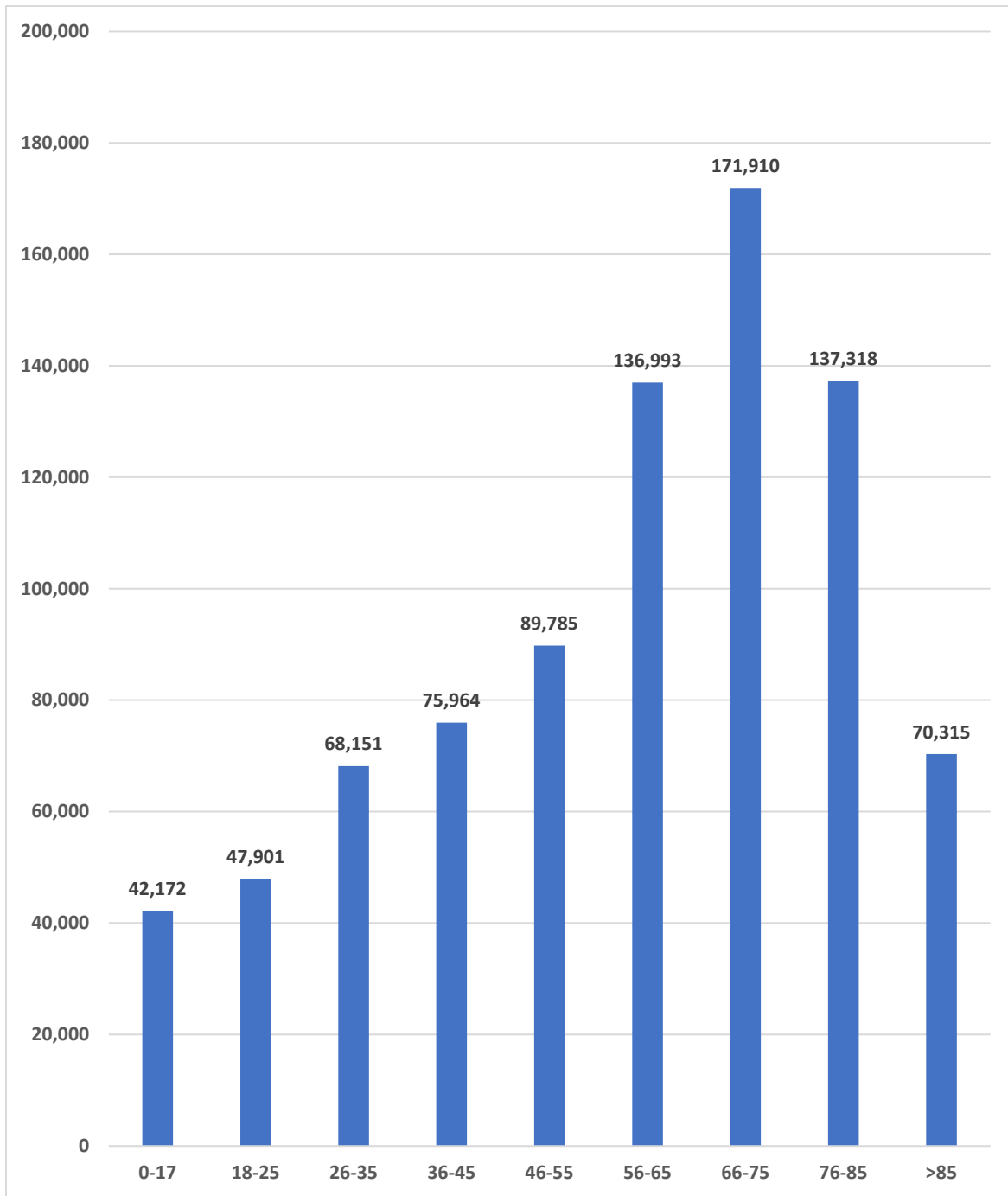


Chart 10 shows patients by age groups. The predominant was 20 percent (n = 171,910) for age group 66 - 75 years.

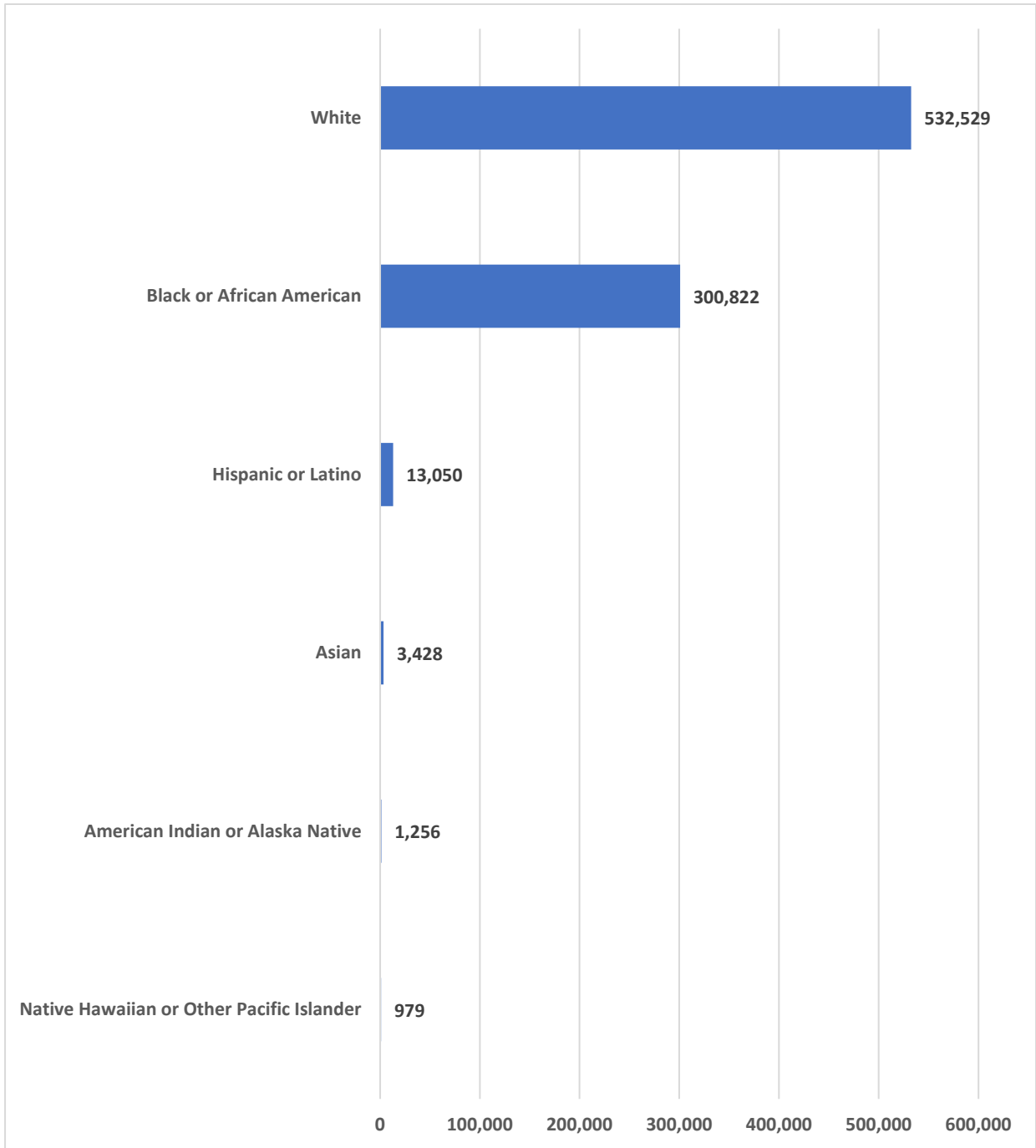


Chart 11 shows the racial categories of EMS patients. Whites were the predominant group at 62 percent (n = 532,529).

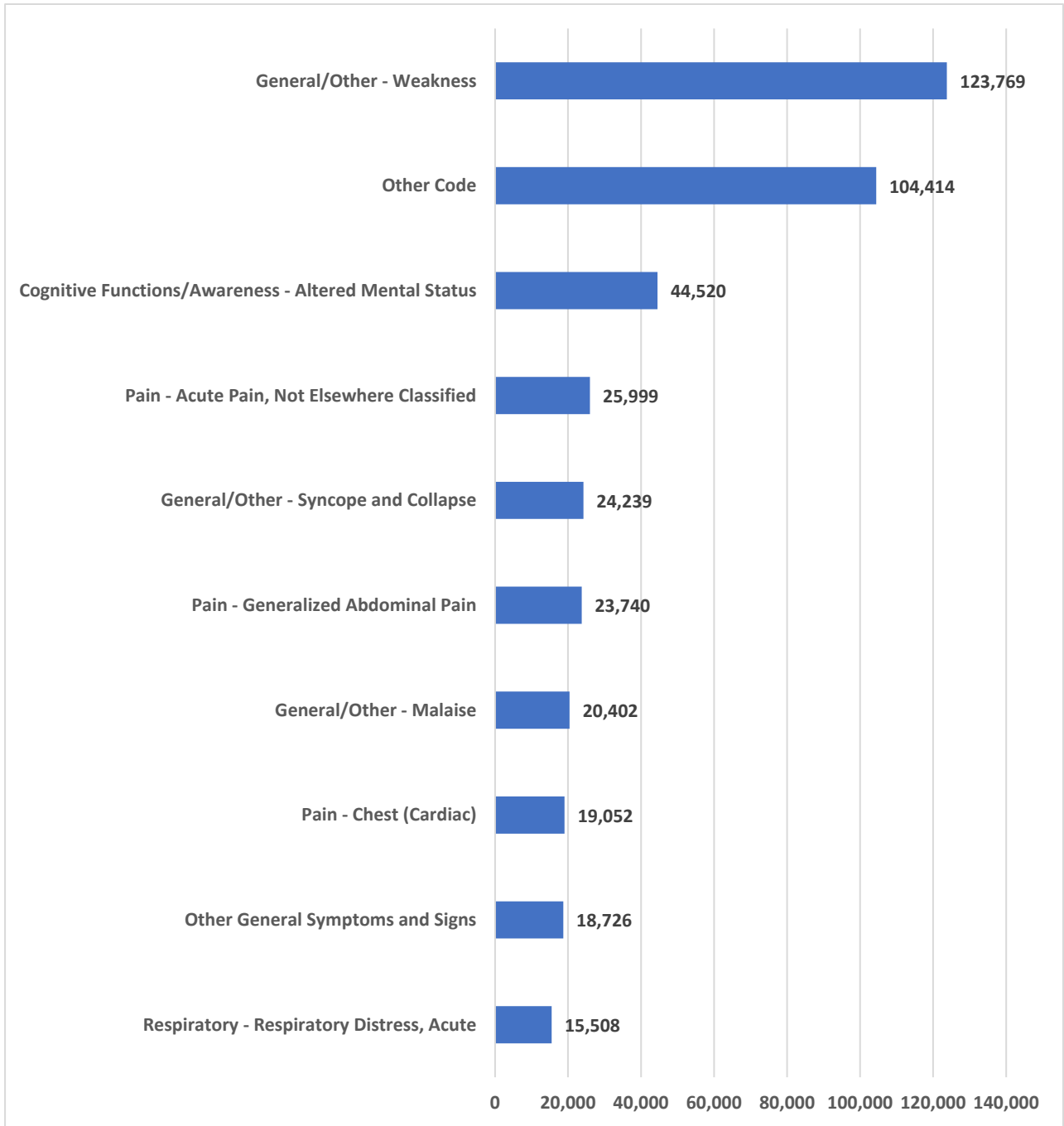


Chart 13 shows the top 10 provider's primary impressions. At 29 percent (n = 123,769), general/other – weakness was the predominant impression.

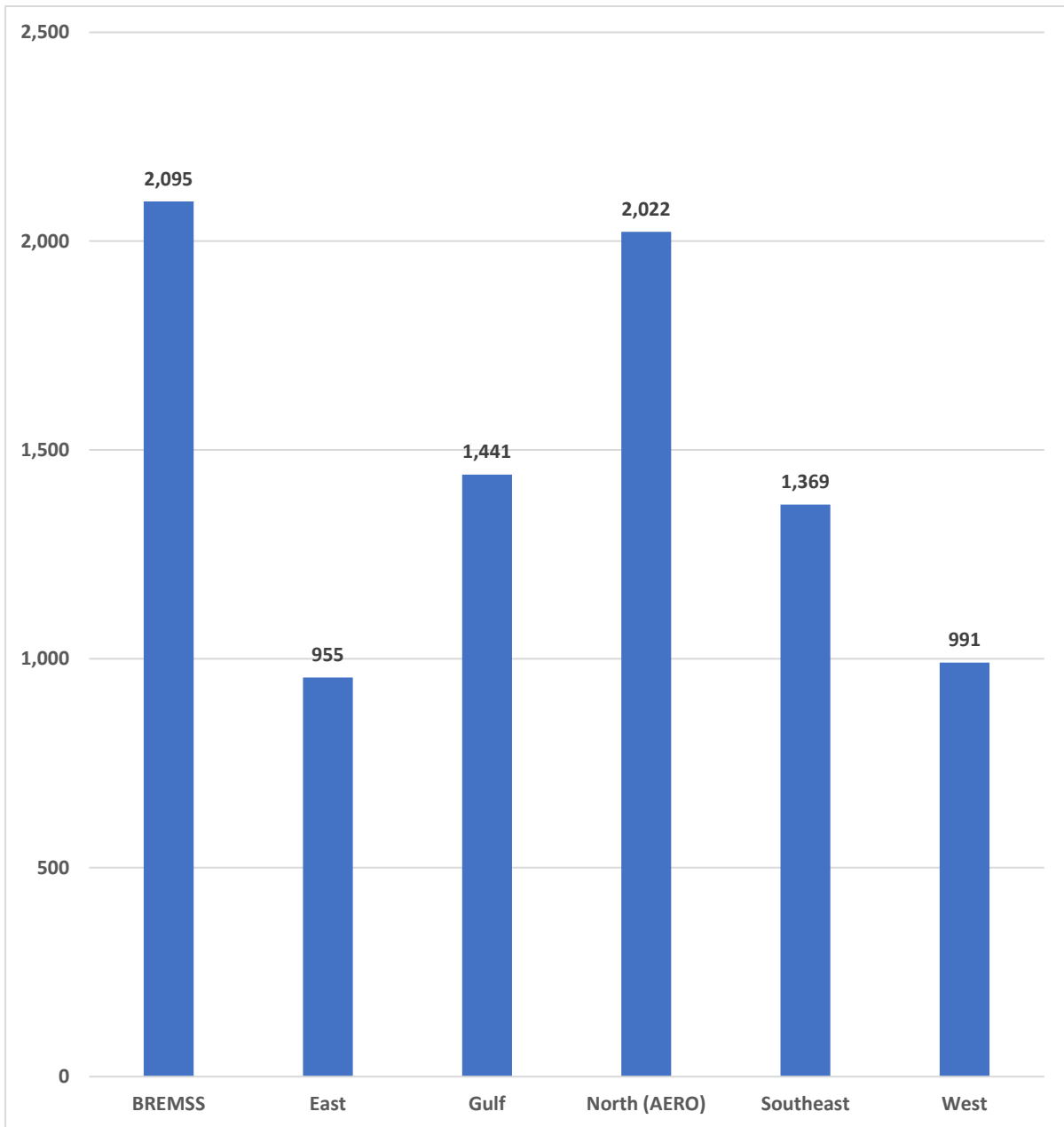


Chart 14 shows cardiac arrest calls reported by EMS regions. The predominant was 24 percent (n = 2,095) in BREMSS region.

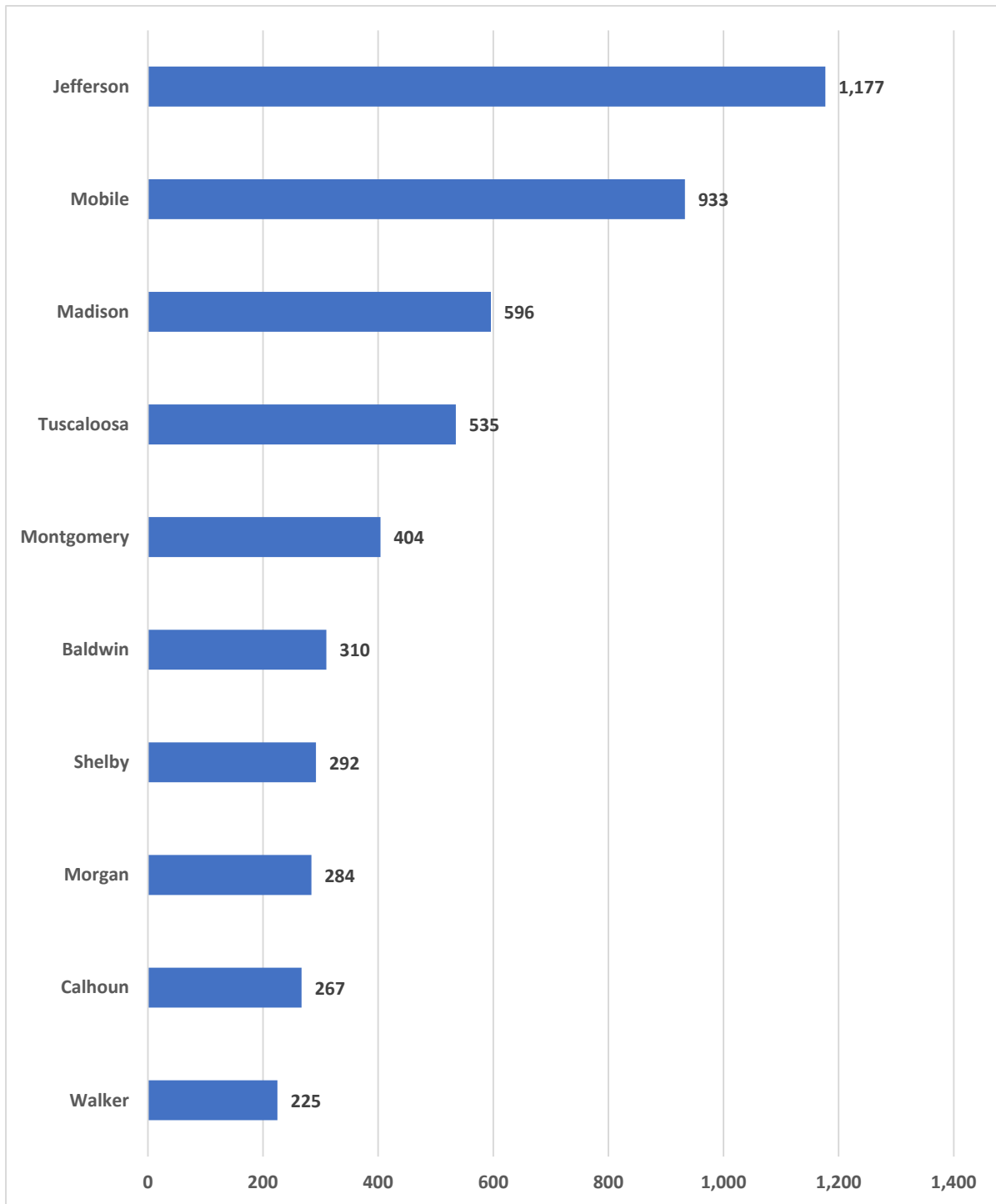


Chart 15 shows the top 10 counties by numbers of cardiac arrest calls. The predominant county by case was Jefferson at 23 percent (n = 1,177).

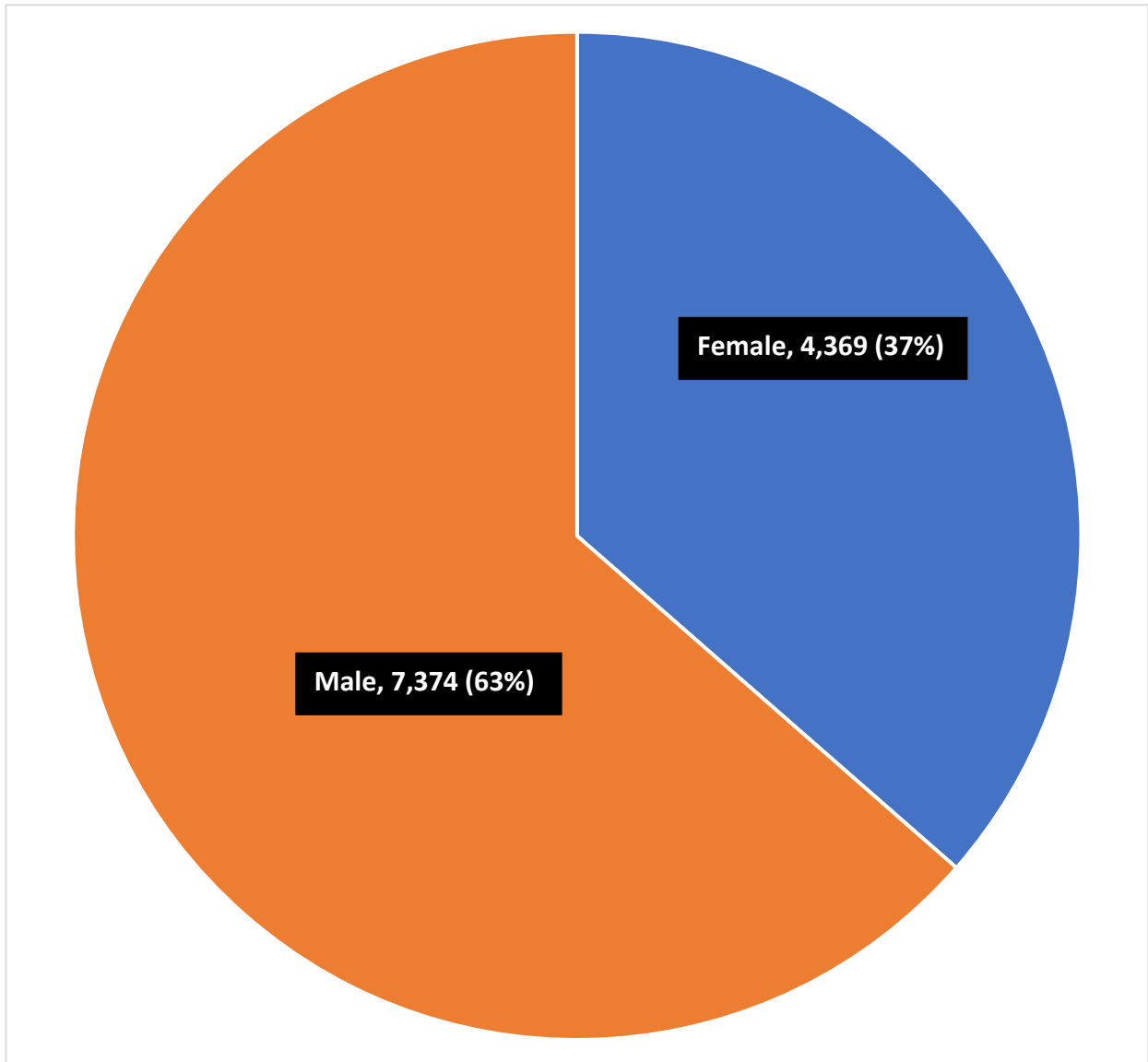


Chart 16 shows naloxone administration by gender. The predominant was given to males at 63 percent (n = 7,374).

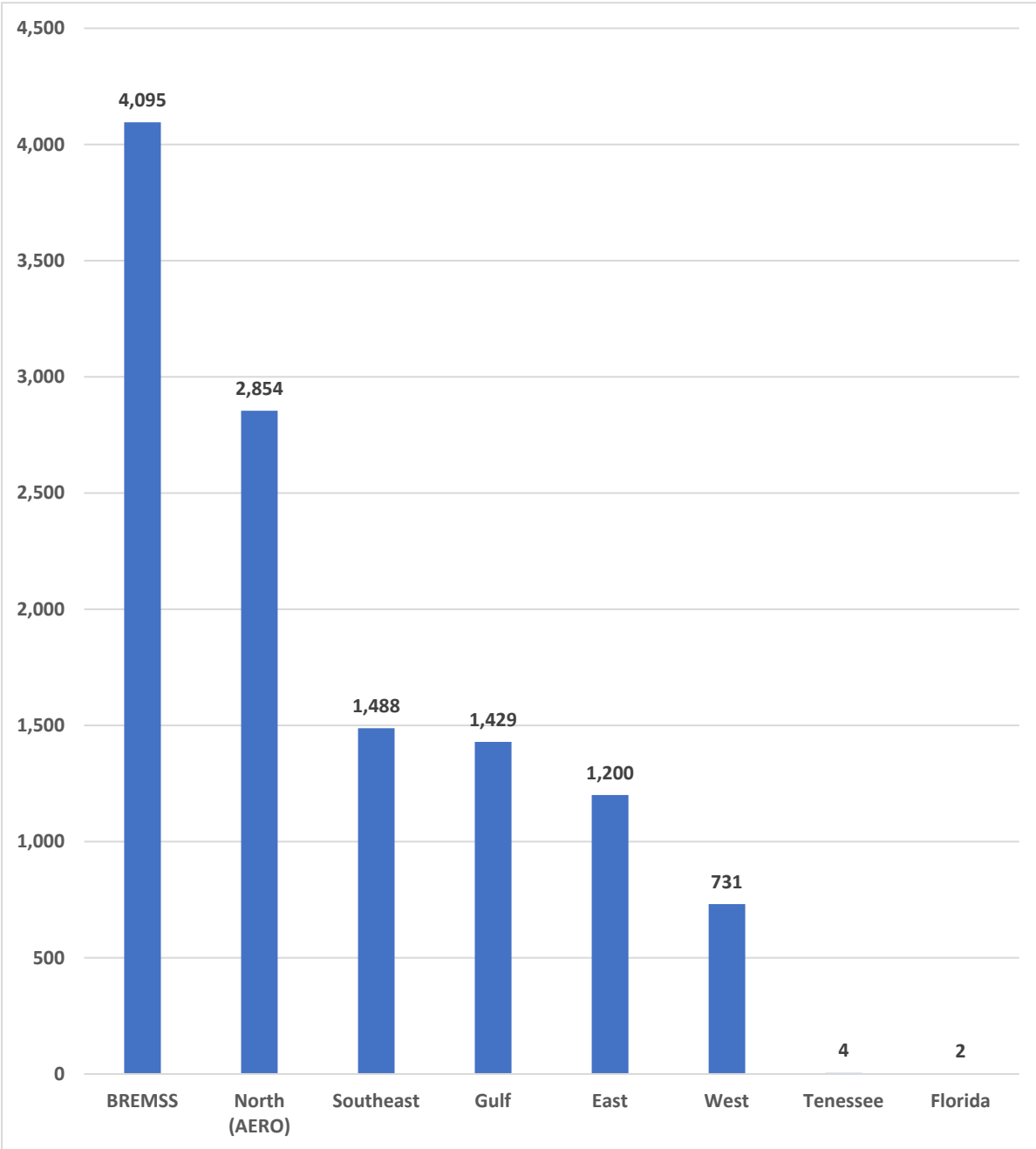


Chart 17 shows naloxone administration by EMS regions. The predominant was given in the BREMSS Region at 35 percent (n = 4,095).

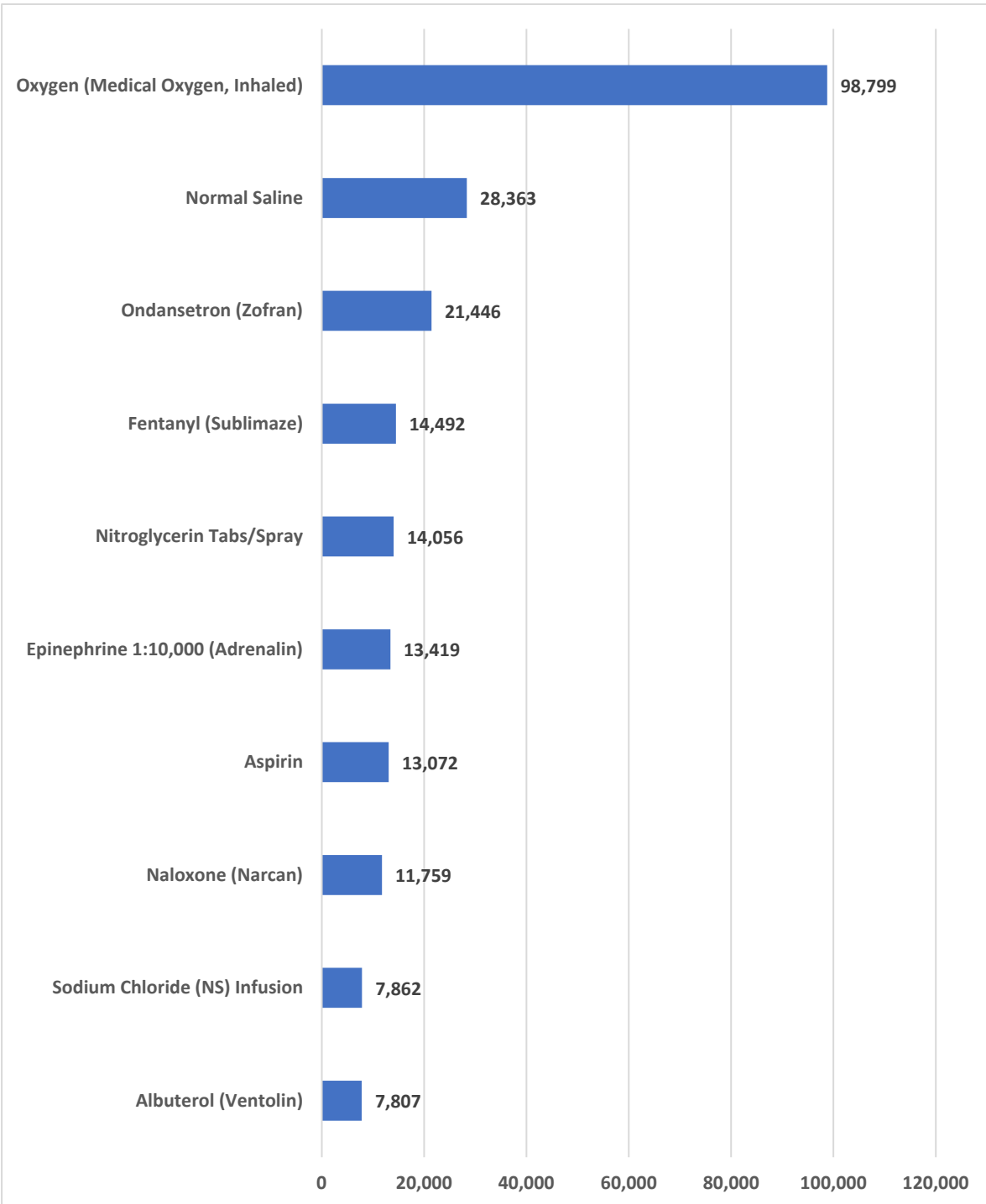


Chart 18 presents a breakdown of the top 10 medications administered by Alabama EMS. The predominant was oxygen, reported at 32 percent (n = 98,799).

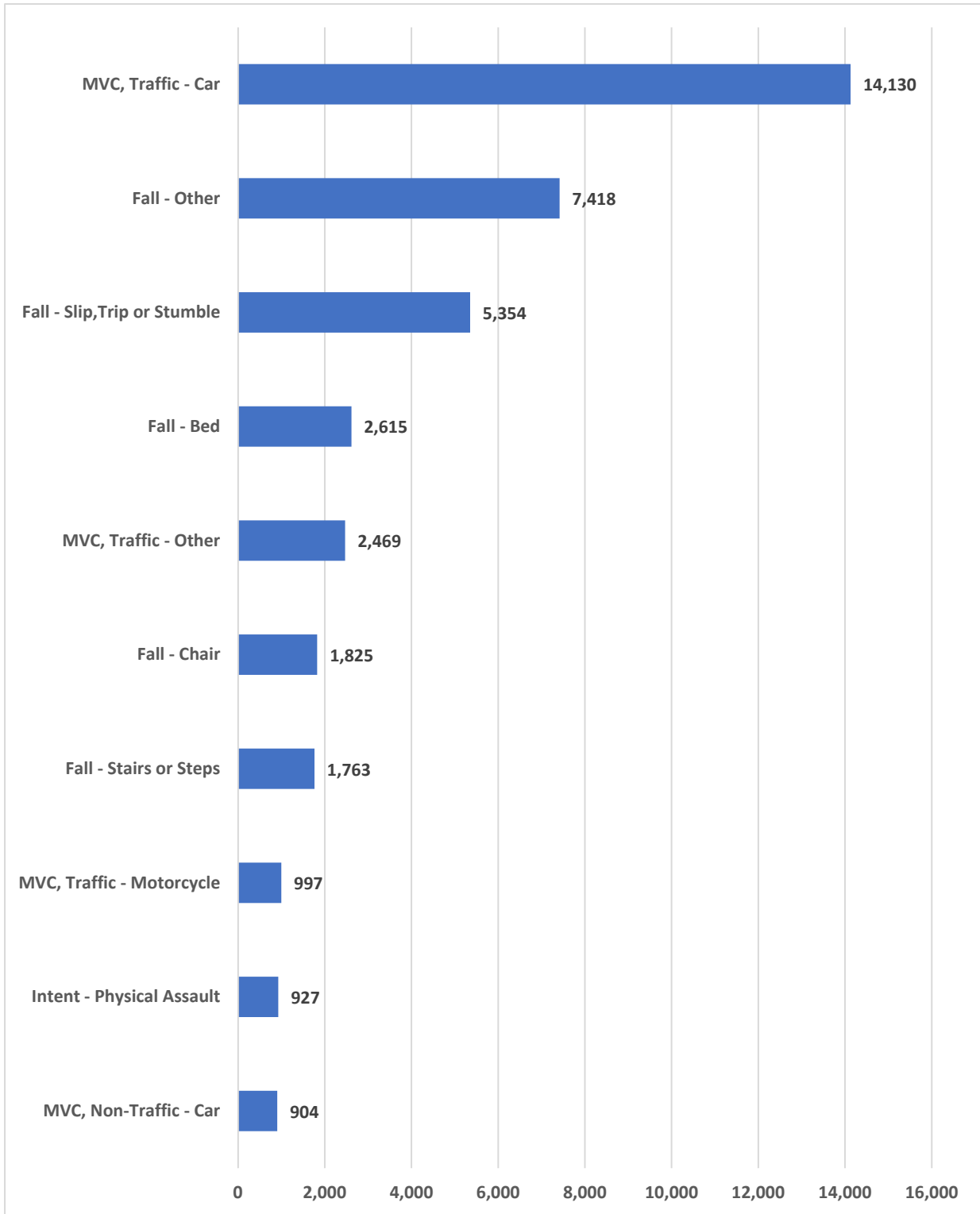


Chart 19 shows top 10 causes of injuries. The predominant was motor vehicle crash (MVC), traffic-car accidents at 28 percent (n = 14,130).

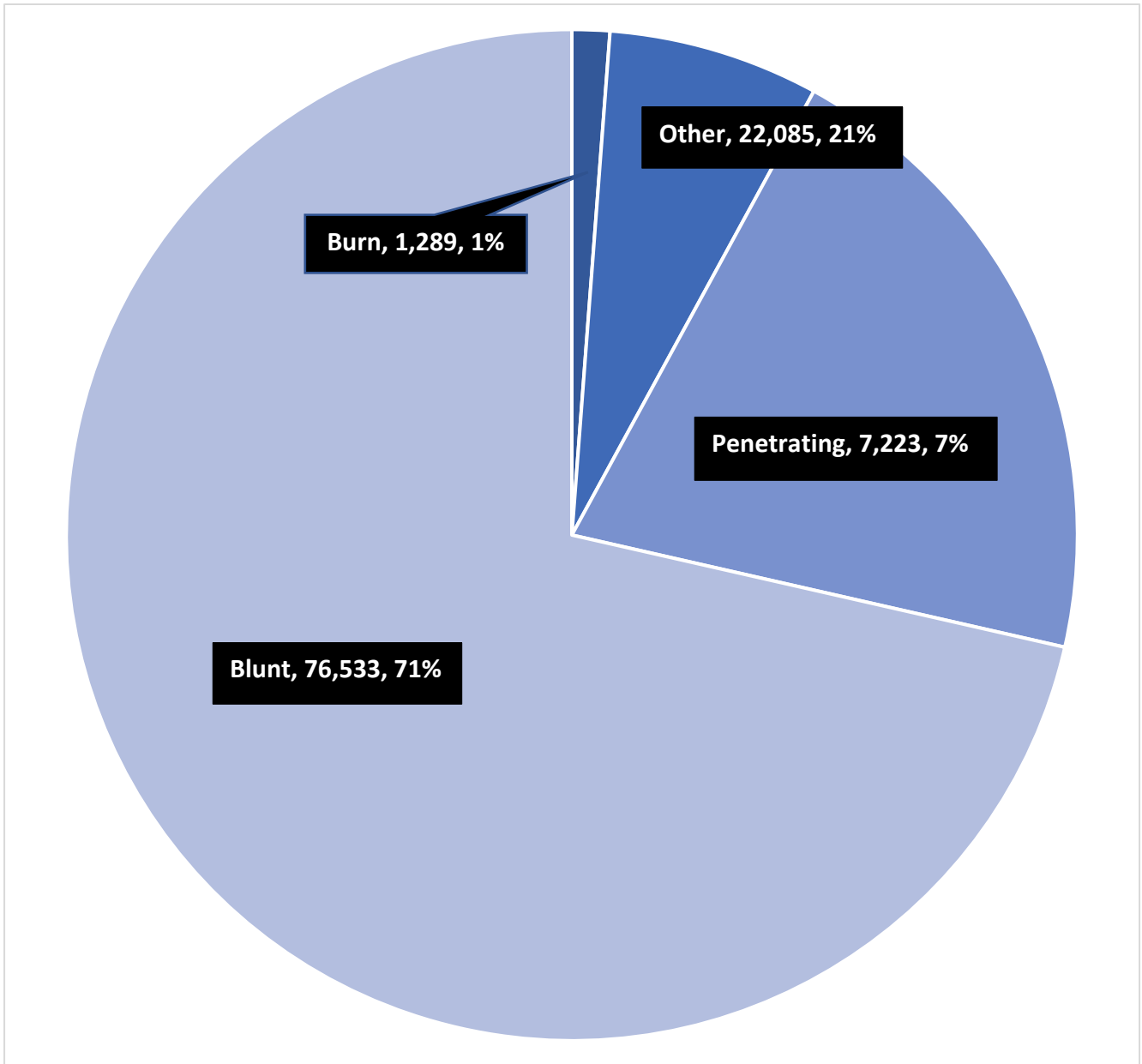


Chart 20 shows the mechanisms of injuries of EMS patients. The predominant was blunt force trauma at 71 percent (n = 76,533).

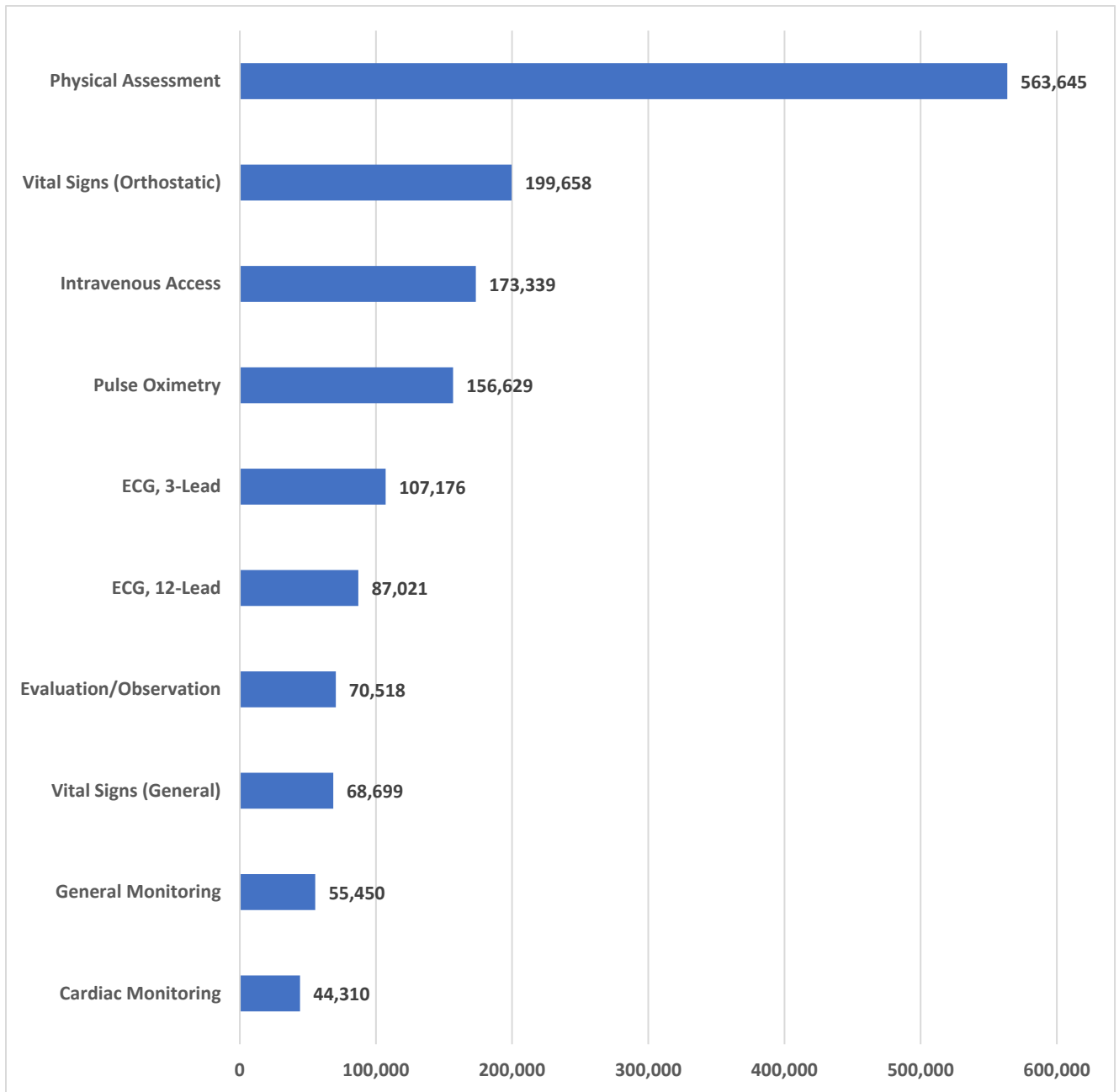


Chart 21 shows the breakdown of the top 10 procedures performed. Patient assessment was the predominant at 37 percent (n = 563,645).

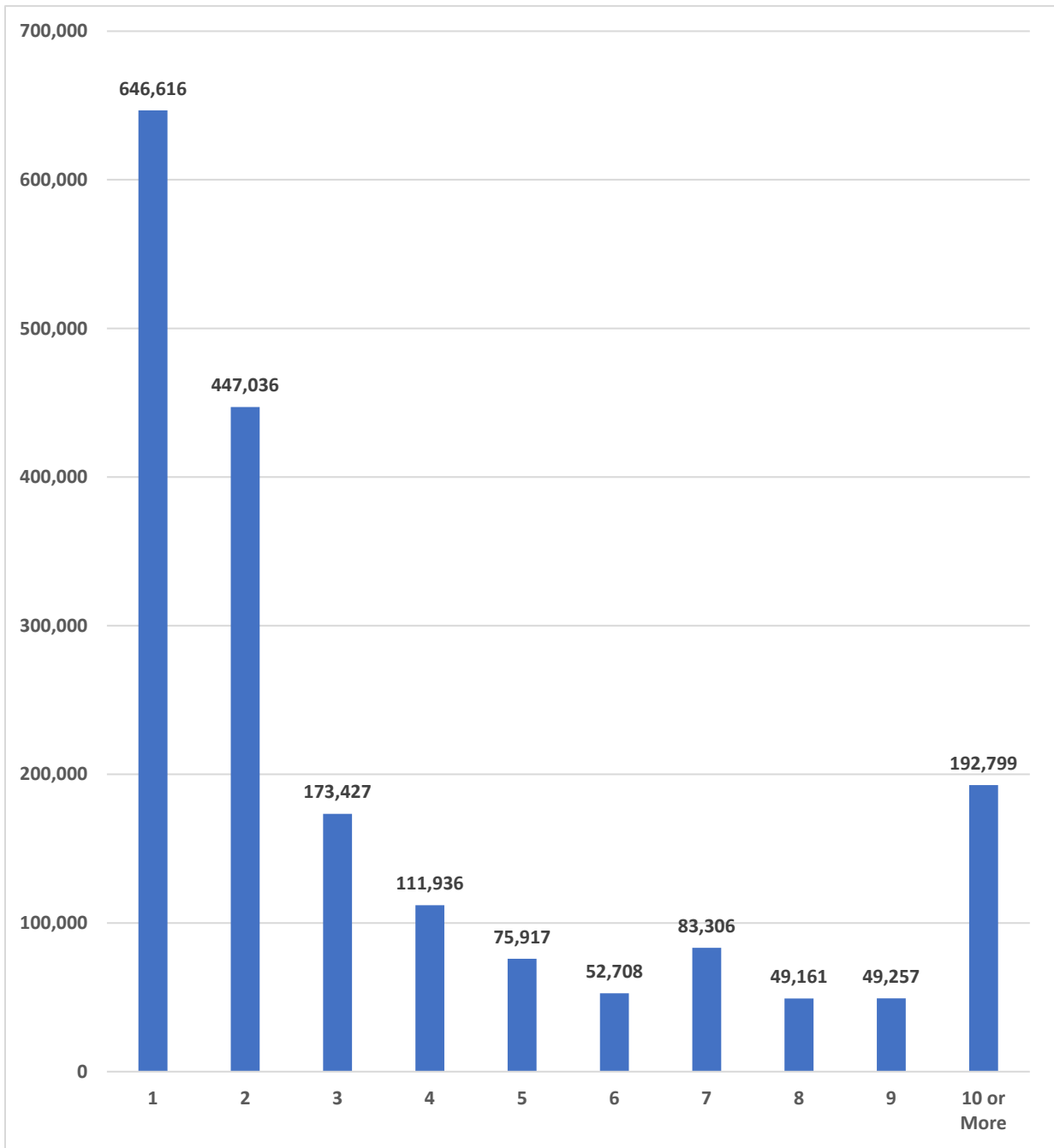


Chart 22 shows the number of times vital signs were taken. The predominant number was once (1) at 34 percent (n = 646,616).

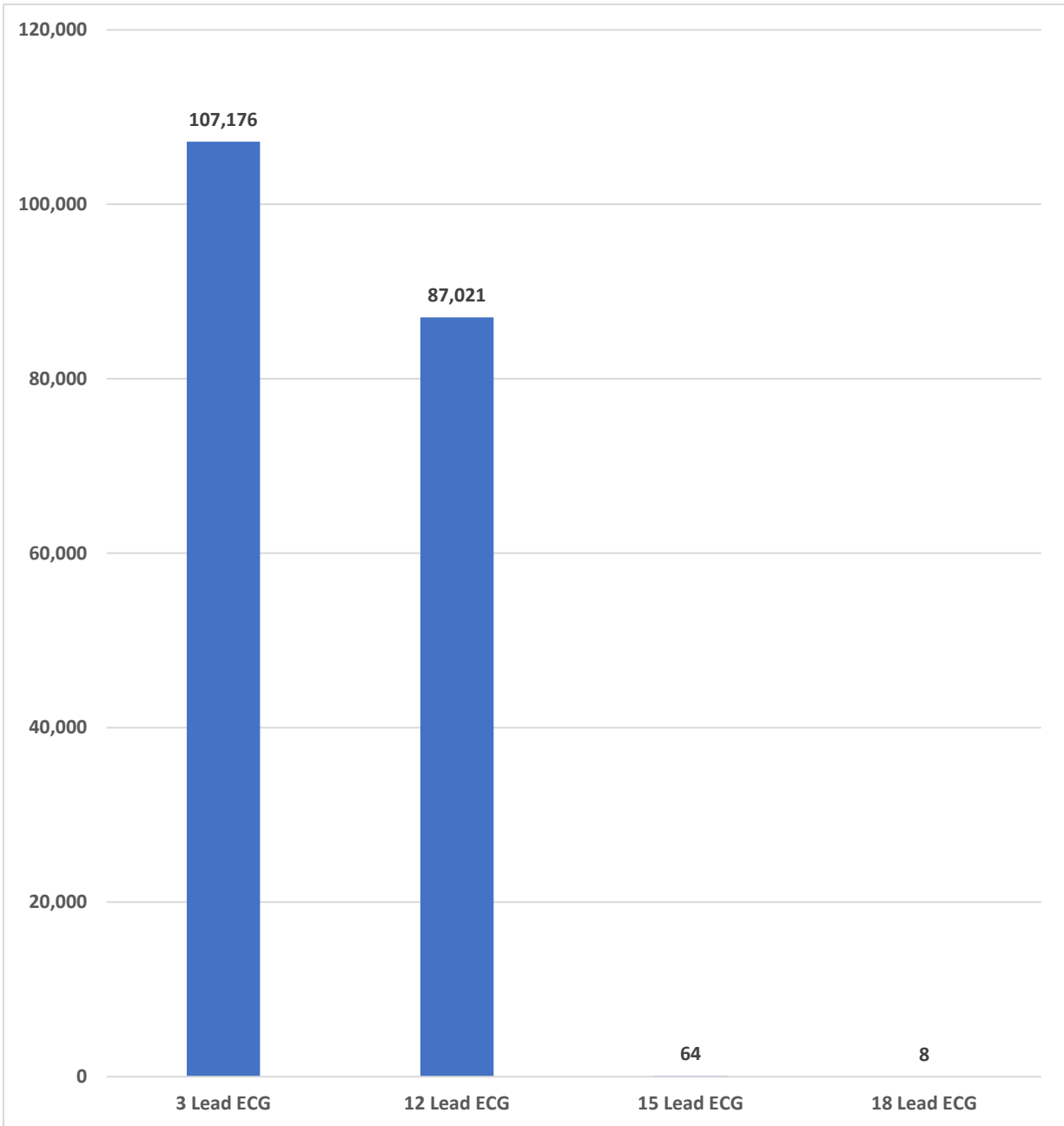

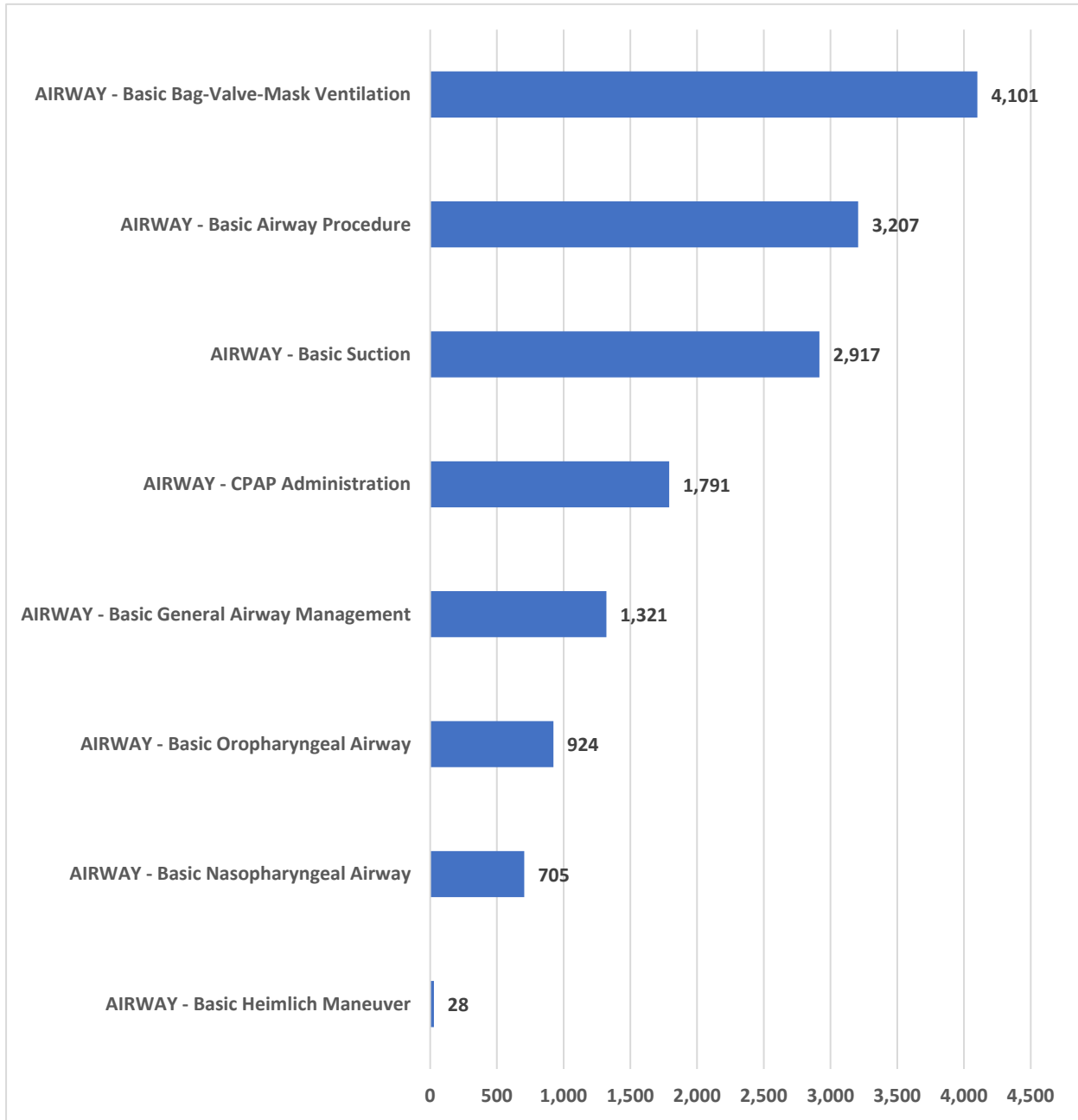


Chart 24 shows basic airway procedures performed. The predominant was airway-basic bag-valve-mask ventilation at 27 percent (n = 4,101).

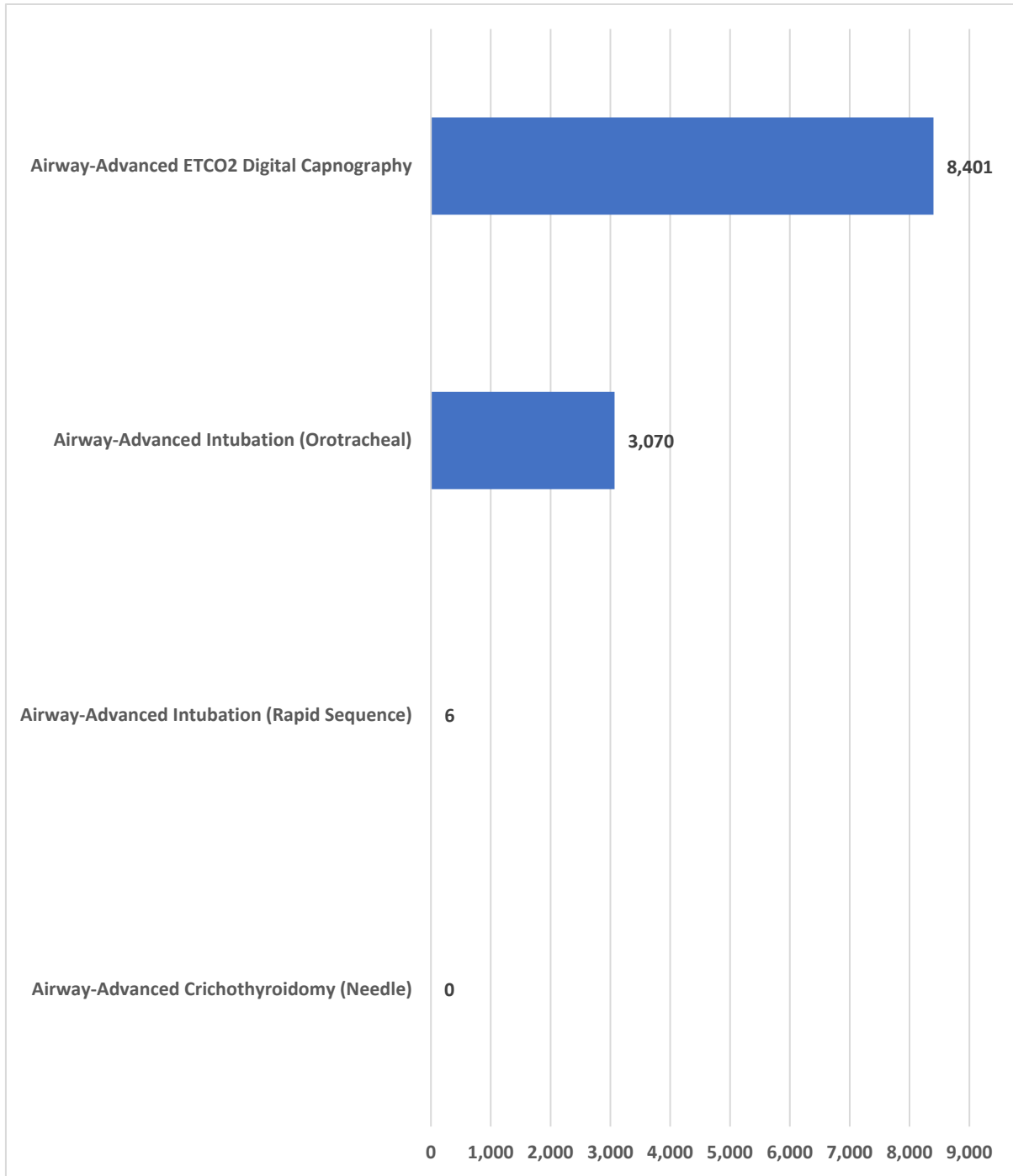

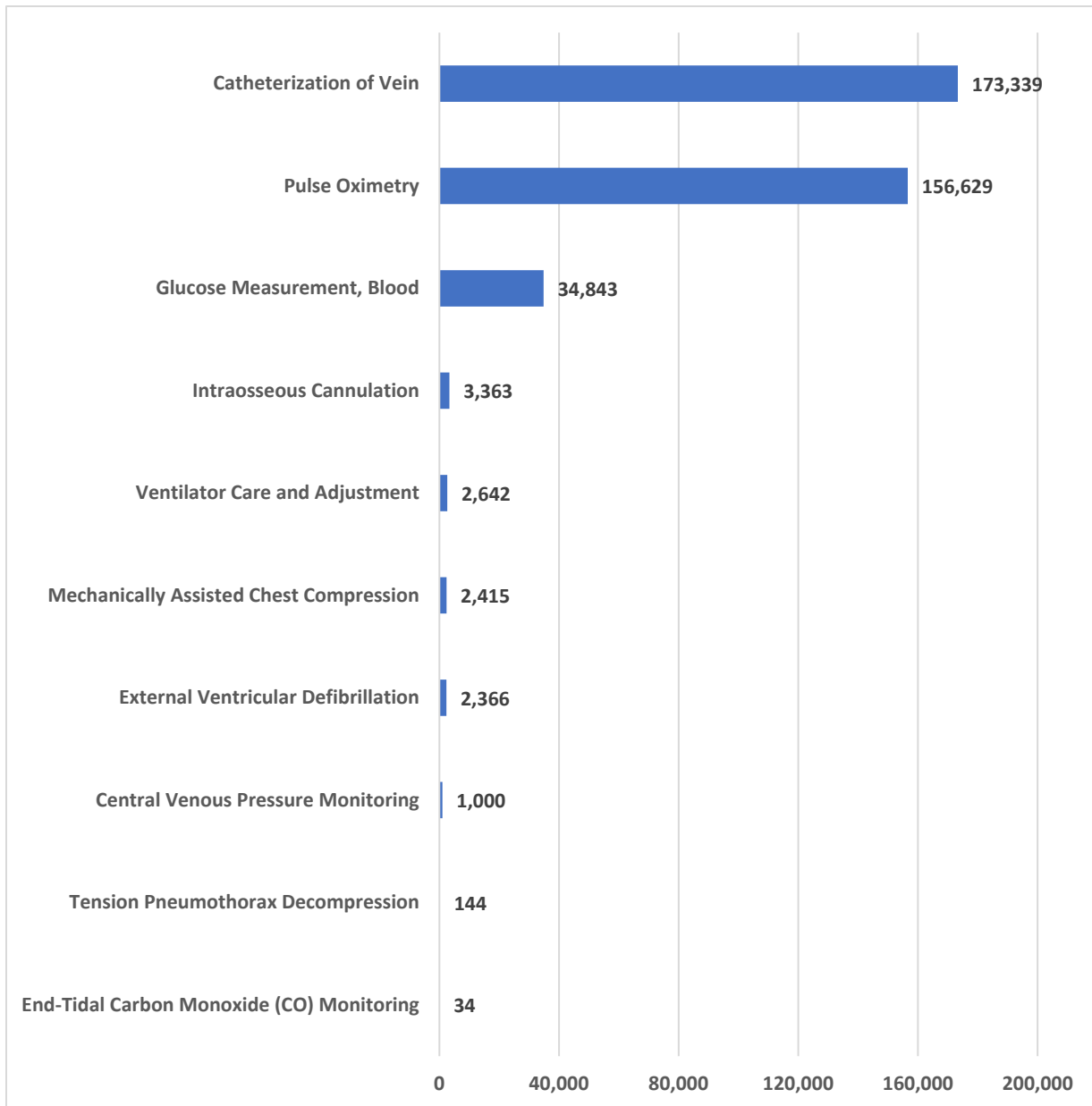


Chart 26 shows top 10 select reported procedures performed. The predominant was venous catheterization at 46 percent (n = 173,339).

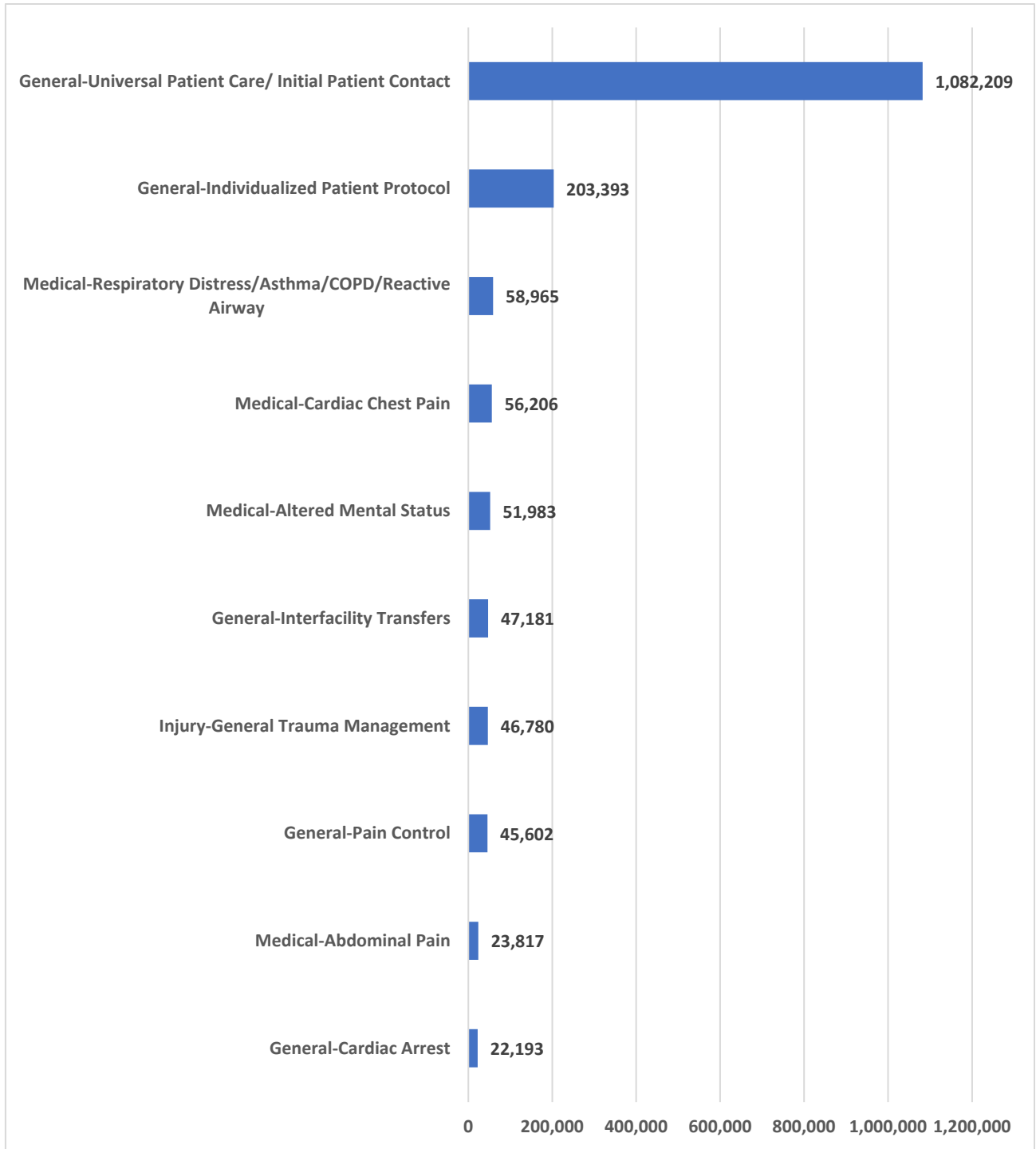


Chart 27 shows top 10 reported protocols used. The predominant was general-universal patient care/initial patient contact at 66 percent (n = 1,082,209).

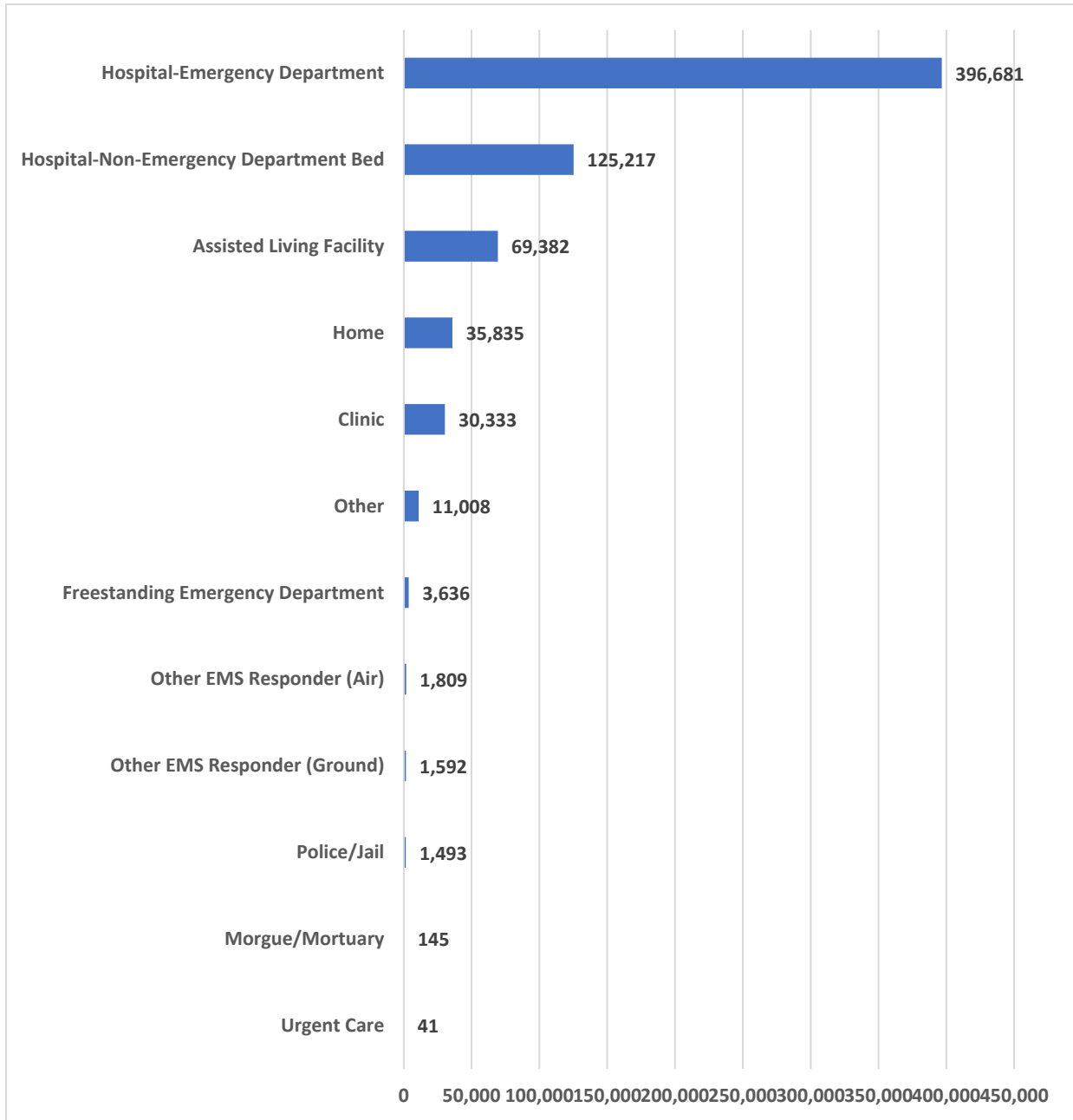


Chart 28 shows the types of locations that EMS patients were transported. The predominant destination was hospital emergency departments at 59 percent (n = 396,681).

Time Elapsed Unit Arrived on Scene to Patient Arrived at Destination

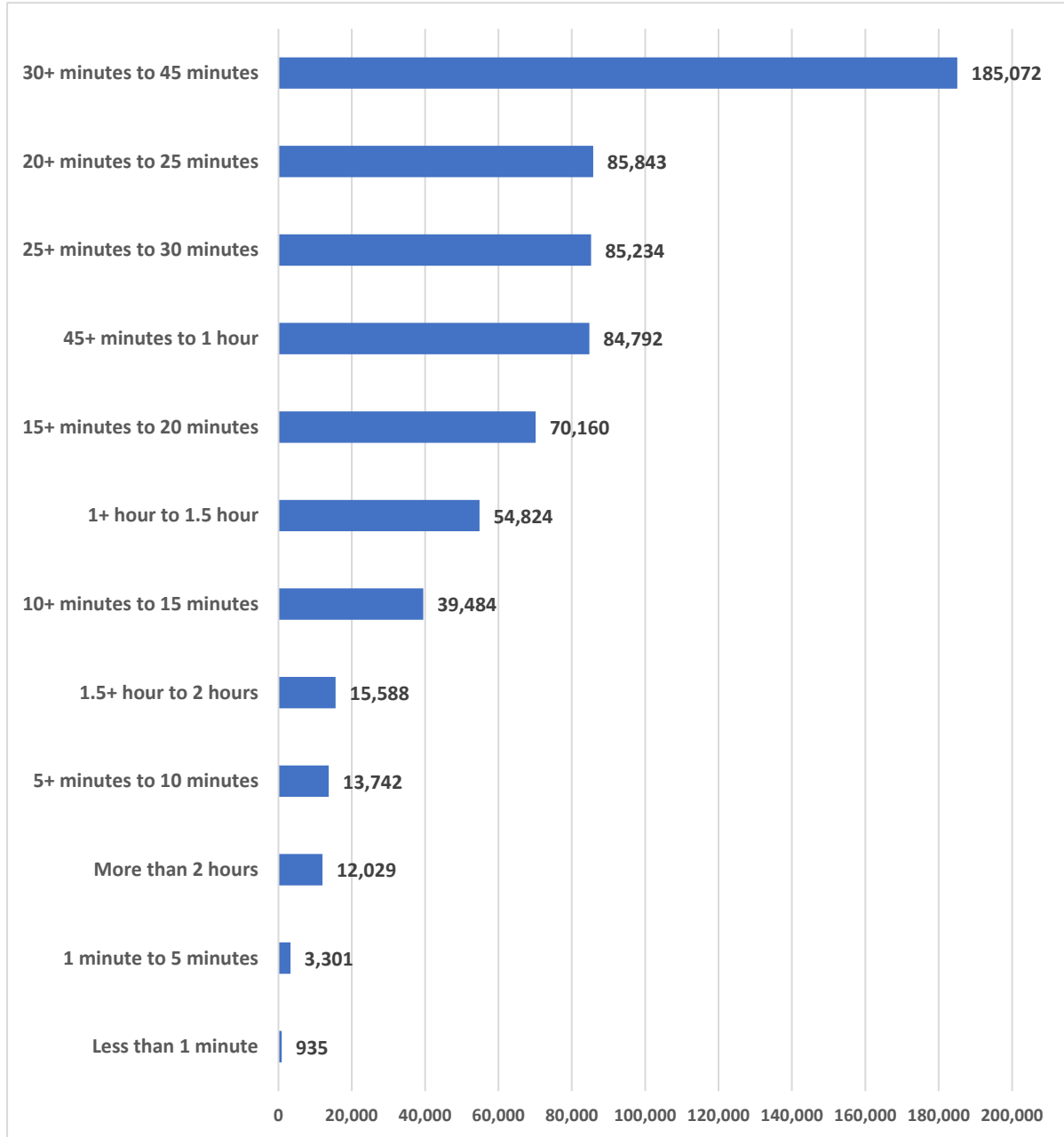

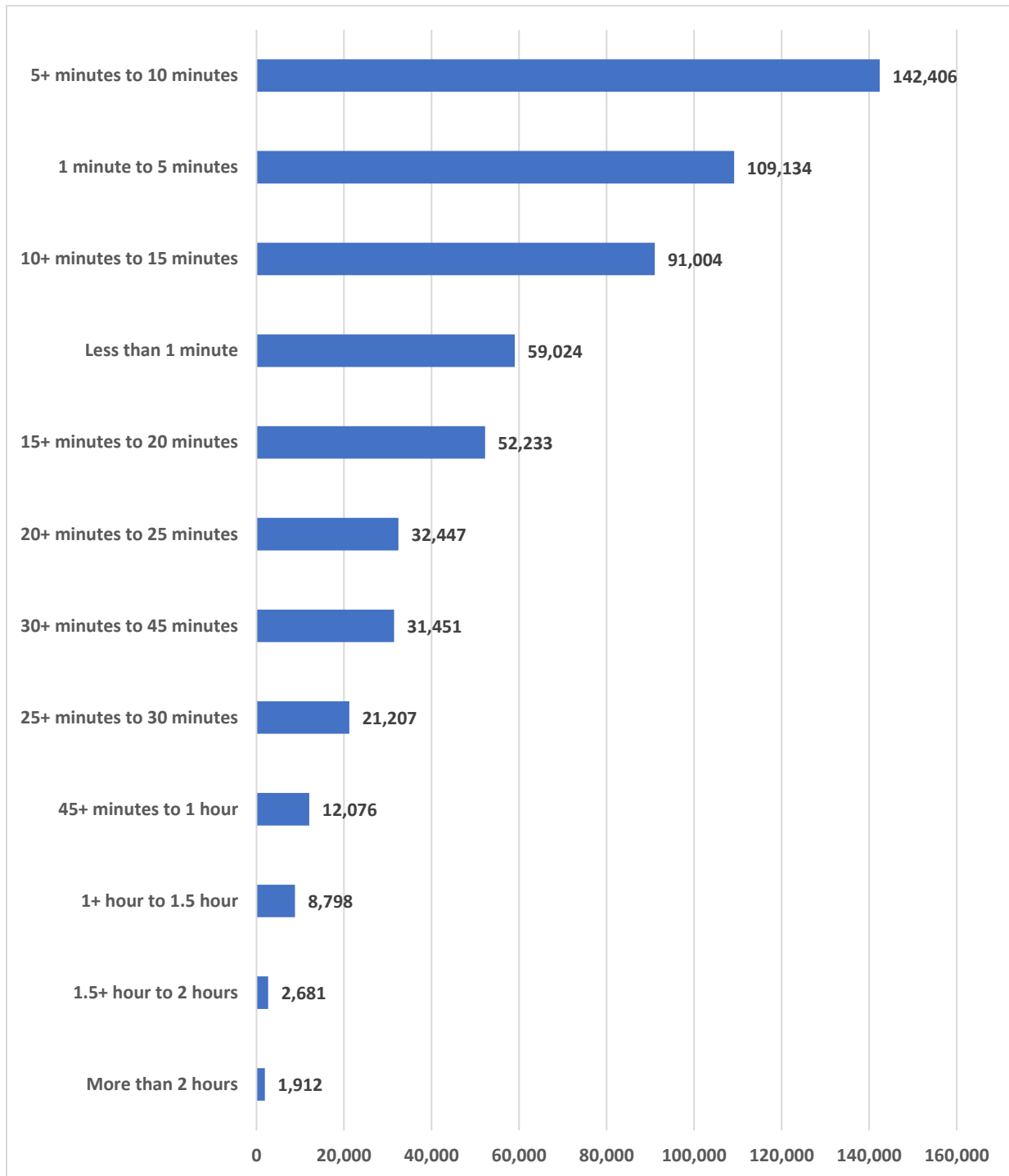

Time Elapsed Unit Notified to Unit En Route (Out of Chute)

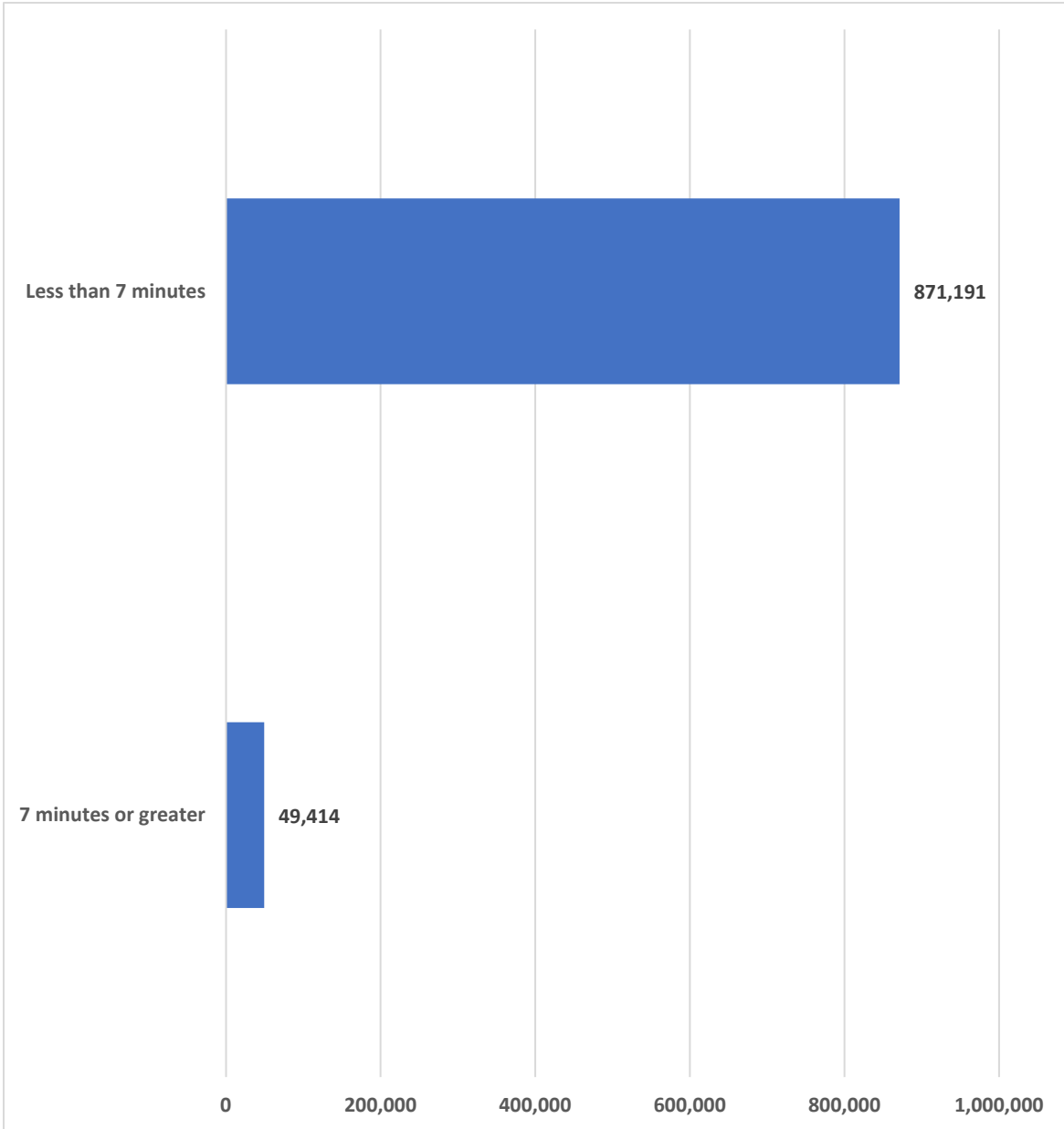


Chart 31 shows out of chute times. The predominant out of chute time was less than 7 minutes recorded at 95 percent (n = 871,191).

Time Elapsed Unit Arrived at Patient to Transfer of EMS Patient Care

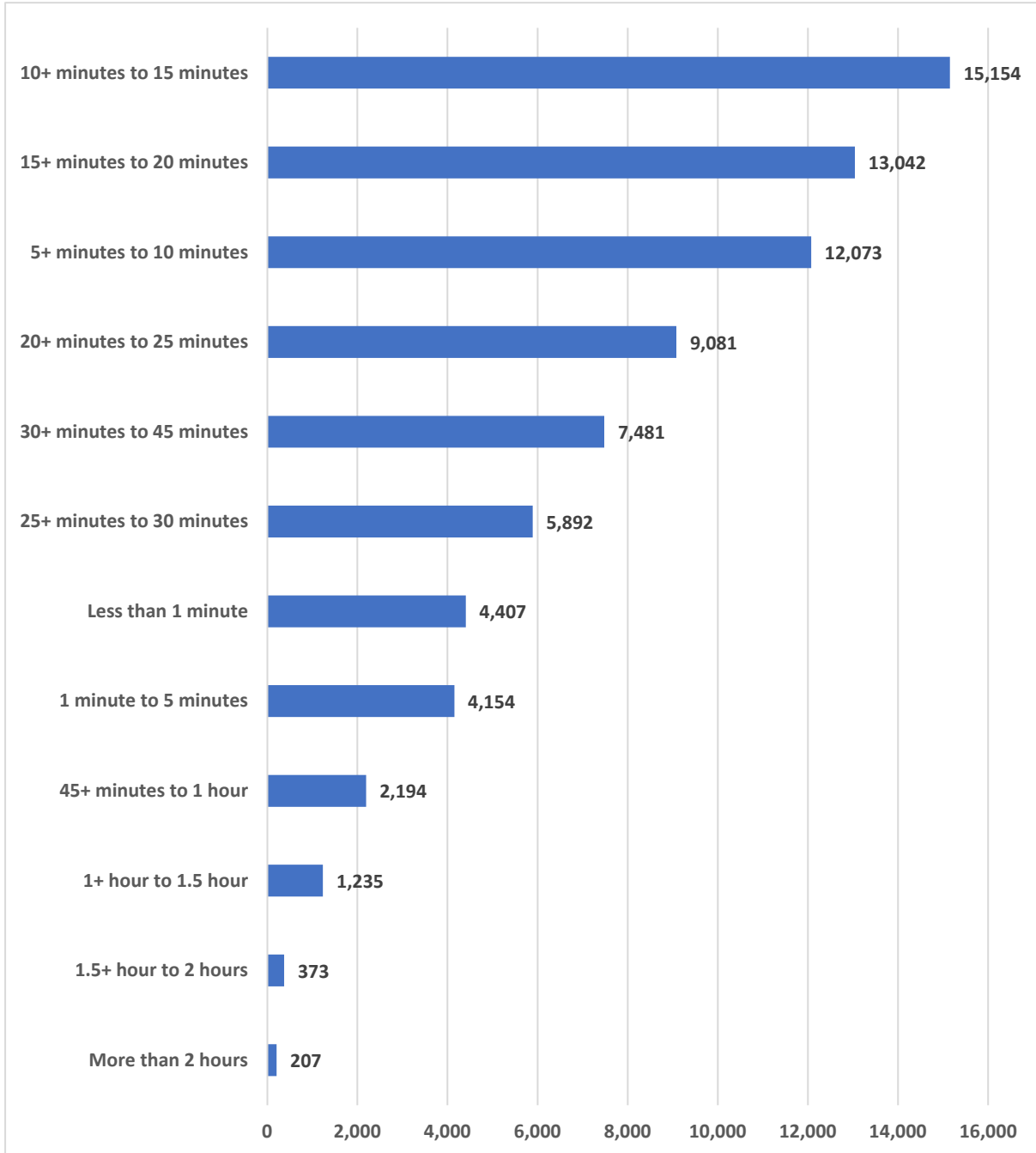

Time Elapsed Unit Arrived on Scene to Unit Left Scene

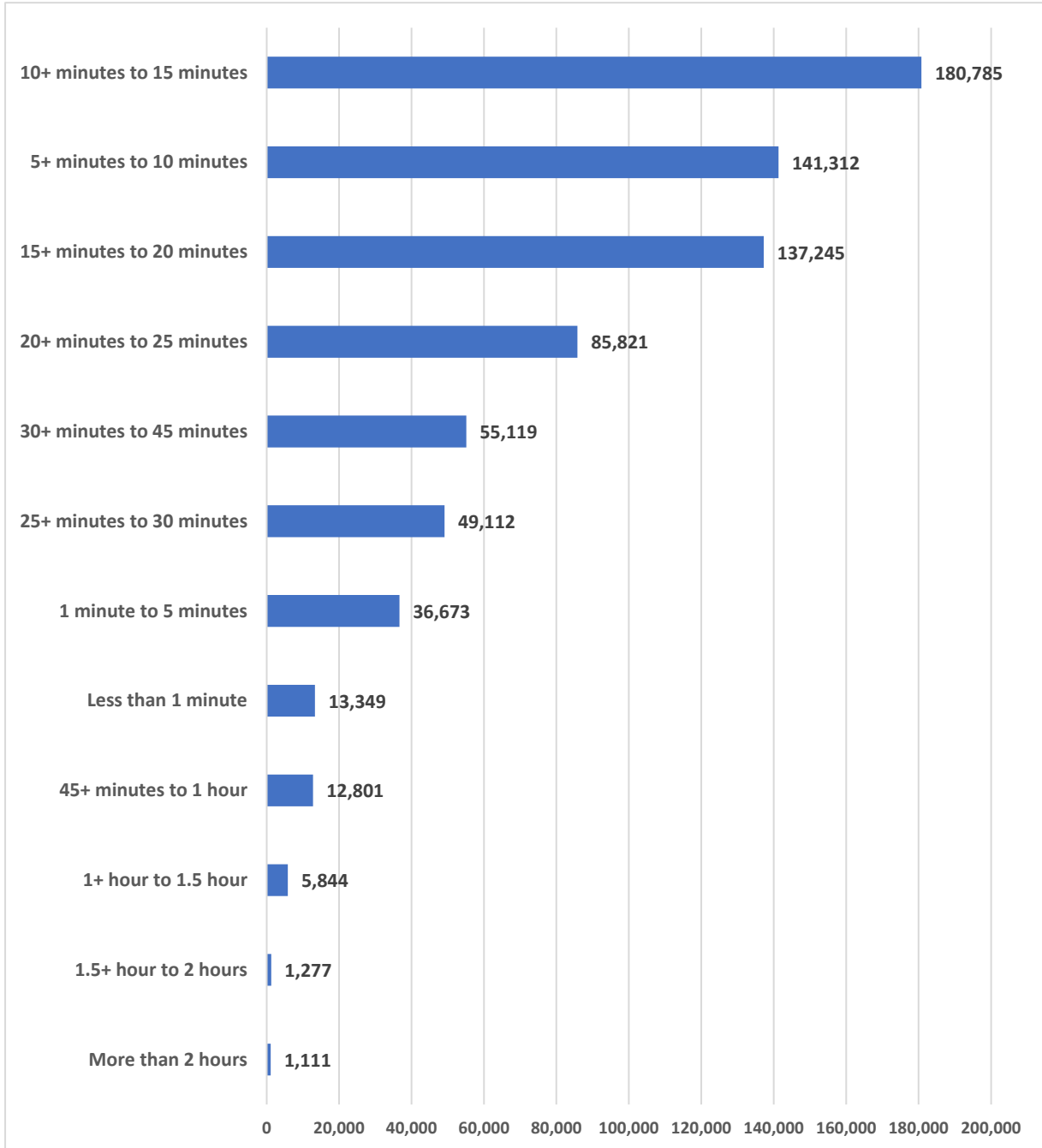

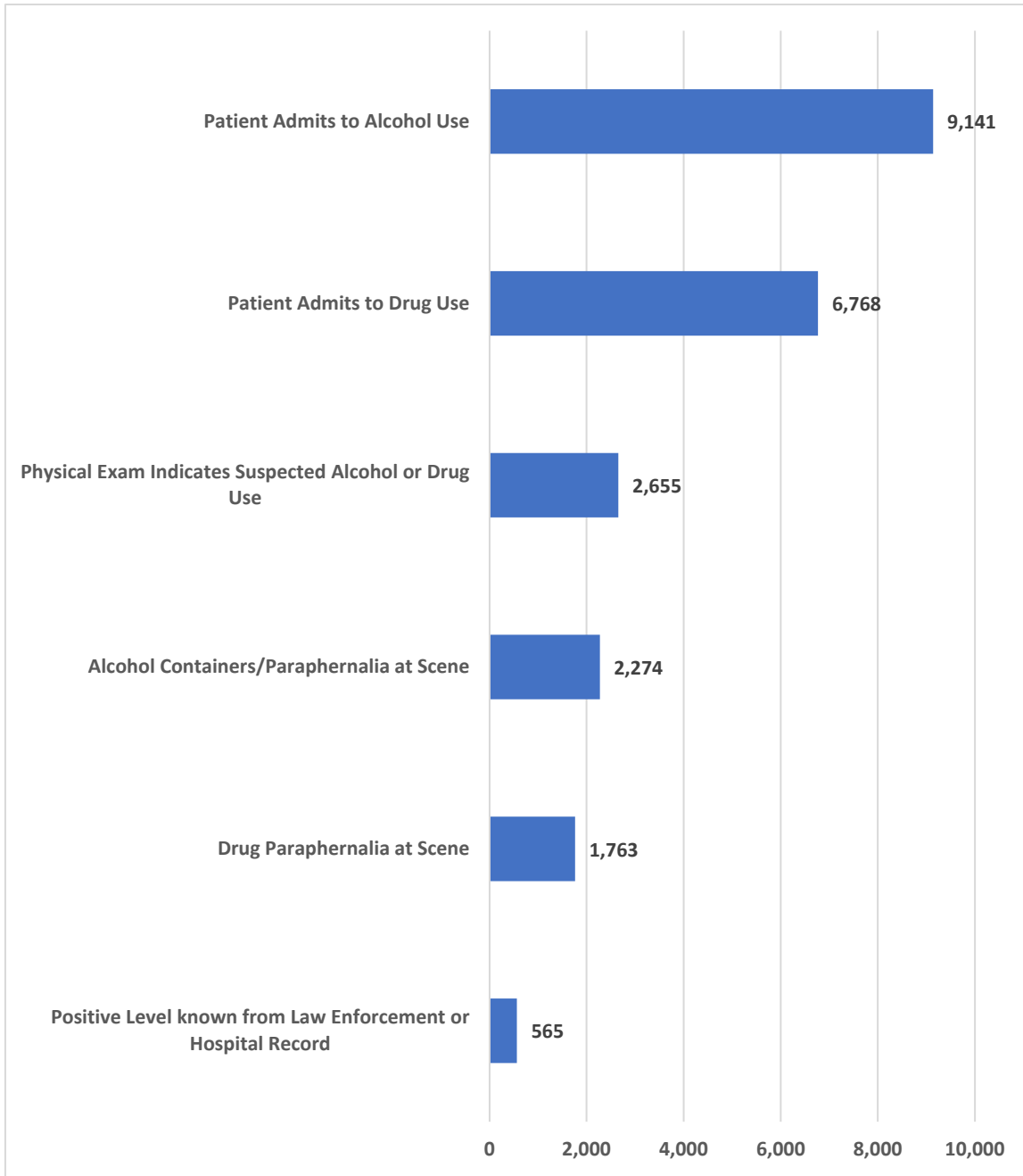


Chart 34 shows EMS patient drug use indicators. The predominant was when patients admitted to alcohol use at 39 percent (n = 9,141).
