Syphilis, also known as the "great imitator" is a highly contagious disease during its primary and secondary stages. It is known as the "great imitator" because clinical manifestations of syphilis continue to confound and elude most clinicians. Additionally, infected persons are often unaware of the disease and unknowingly pass it on to their sexual partners. Detection of syphilis during the asymptomatic or latent stage is only by syphilis screening

test results. Recent recommended enzyme

immunoassays (EIA) for syphilis screening is easy and can

detect very early syphilis, however, discordant results can

be difficult to interpret and manage by most clinicians in

the county health department. Program faculty will discuss the signs and symptoms of syphilis, screening and

interpretation of discordant enzyme immunoassays (EIA)

and treatment for syphilis.
