#### **Changes in Patient Profile**

- Latino population in Alabama has increased from 75,830 in 2000 to 185,602 in 2010
- Latinos continue to be the largest
   U.S. minority group

#### **Changes in Patient Profile**

- Alabama immigrants come from Mexico, Guatemala, Colombia, other Latin American countries
  - Many speak little or no English
