Bibb County Successes

- Health Fairs
 - In school health fairs performed for15 years in Bibb County
 - Dr. Marsha Adams & RN students from Capstone College of Nursing
 - Support from BCBS, AL Power & Sight Savers, community businesses and volunteers

Bibb County Successes

- · Diabetes support group
 - For students & their families with diabetes

Health Fairs

- Identifies students undiagnosed or at risk for developing diabetes
- Indicators
 - Elevated weight, glucose or cholesterol; inactivity, lack of doctor's visits for physical exams, positive family history
 - School nurse works with families to secure health insurance through All-Kids, Medicaid or BCBS

Common Health Fair Findings

- · Students with cavities
- · Students with vision problems
- · Students with an acute infection
- Students with elevated blood pressure
- Students with Acanthosis Nigracans

Extreme Health Fair Findings

- · Students with cardiac problems
- · Student with growth on tonsil
- · Student with tumor behind ear drum
- Students found to be physically abused

Extreme Health Fair Findings

- Students with elevated glucose
- · Student with severe eye disease
 - Mother is a teacher and was unaware of problem

Information Stations

- Display tables are set up and manned with people from
 - Bradford Health Service
 - -AL Department of Public Health
 - HIV Education & Tobacco Prevention
 - -AL Cooperative Extension Service
 - · Healthy food & fast food info.

Parental Notification

- Parents are sent a letter with explanation of health fair findings
 - In non-medical terms
- Parents receive pamphlets with diabetes prevention tips
 - Healthy food suggestions & exercise tips suitable for each age group are included

Helping Families

- Diabetes support group formed to provide resources for students with diabetes and their families
- Meetings are held several times a year
- Students enjoy healthy snacks and assist with creating a new recipe

Helping Families

- Games are an important aspect of the meetings
 - Kids enjoy playing, not realizing that they are exercising!

Goals and Future Plans

- Primary goal is to positively impact families, creating a healthier community
- Expand the concept of school based health fairs
 - KidCheck- throughout Alabama
 with support from Gov. Riley & the
 Alabama Rural Action Commission
