Infant Mortality remains a difficulty problem, especially in the southeastern United States. Recent research and data analysis has shown that a significant number of infant deaths are related to sleep position. The educational and public health efforts regarding infant sleep position that began in the 1990s have been recently revised and updated, resulting the new "Safe to Sleep" campaign. The American Academy of Pediatrics and the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development (NICHD) have issued new recommendations and educational materials to help in this effort. The program presenters will discuss the how infant sleep position can affect sudden unexpected infant death (SUID) during sleep, describe the components of a safe sleep environment, and current medical and public health policies and recommendations related to infant sleep position. Examples of state-specific efforts to implement the Safe to Sleep message will be discussed, as well as common questions that may families and caregivers may have for pediatric health care providers regarding this important issue.
