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Initial Syphilis-EIA Test

- Initial visit
 - At each visit if no documentation or verified negative test within the past 30 days
 - Patients who come to the clinic with reactive syphilis-EIA test results without VDRL/RPR titer, or IgG/IgM

Initial Syphilis-EIA Test

- Deferred Physical Exam Visit (DPEV)
 - -Patients who qualified for DPEV
 - -Syphilis test for work or school
- Sex partners/contacts to syphilis

Follow-up Syphilis-EIA Test

- Follow-up syphilis test to assess treatment response
 - Note: To assess syphilis treatment response, VDRL or RPR titer is needed
 - Although VDRL is no longer available to order, the Lab will automatically perform VDRL when Syphilis-EIA test is reactive

Syphilis-EIA Test

- · Early syphilis
 - HIV negative and penicillin therapy, repeat test at 6 and 12 months after treatment
 - -HIV positive or alternative therapy
 - Repeat test at 1, 3, 6, 9, 12, 24 months after treatment

Syphilis-EIA Test

- Early Latent Syphilis
- · Late Latent Syphilis
- Latent Syphilis unknown duration
 - -Repeat test at 6, 12, and 24 months after treatment

Syphilis-EIA/VDRL Non-Reactive Follow-up Criteria

- If the Syphilis-EIA is non-reactive in an asymptomatic contact
 - No further clinical or serological follow-up is required

Syphilis-EIA/VDRL Non-Reactive Follow-up Criteria

- If the Syphilis-EIA is non-reactive in a patient with clinical findings consistent with primary or secondary syphilis
 - -Repeat the test in 2 4 weeks
- If repeat Syphilis-EIA or VDRL is non-reactive, no further follow-up is required

Disease Intervention Specialist (DIS) Consult

- Reactive stat RPR, Syphilis-EIA, VDRL, or TP-PA
- Non-reactive Syphilis-EIA test results in a patient with signs and symptoms consistent with primary or secondary syphilis
- Reactive Syphilis-EIA and non-reactive VDRL or TP-PA
