Gay and bisexual men represent approximately two percent of the U.S. population, but account for three-fourths of all estimated new HIV infections. Among all gay and bisexual men, African Americans are the racial/ethnic group most affected by HIV. Program faculty will discuss the impact of coming "out" on their lives, family, faith and finances. The program faculty members will also discuss how they created balance in their lives and how they moved on to help others. This program will be a frank and open discussion to encourage men to start talking in Alabama.
