

HPV PRIMARY SCREENING – WHAT, WHY, AND HOW? FDA AND INTERIM GUIDANCE

More than 12,000 women get cervical cancer every year, and it is estimated that as many as 93% of cervical cancer cases could be prevented by screening and HPV vaccination. This program will review the history of cervical cancer screening using cytology, and the rationale and burden of proof for the use of HPV DNA testing in primary screening for cervical cancer in women 25 and older. Program faculty will discuss the benefits and concerns of primary HPV screening, and the future of cervical cancer screening in the post-HPV vaccination era.
