Effective communication between the home health aide or attendant, the patient, the family, and other members of the health care team is an essential tool for maintaining the patient's optimal health. The core skill of good communication is listening. It requires that we be curious enough and interested enough in the other person to make sure we are clear about what we are saying, asking for clarification and reflecting back to make sure we have heard correctly. Good listening can often be one of the best interventions we can make with our patients and their families. Faculty will present best practices for successful communication including a discussion on cultural differences.
