The Alabama Newborn Screening Program currently tests for 30 primary disorders, with hearing loss being the most prevalent. Given one to three out of 1,000 infants have hearing loss; there is a critical need to increase awareness of Alabama Department of Public Health care coordination staff, medical providers, caregivers, and other providers about newborn hearing loss. This program will explain what is done to detect hearing loss among this population and the huge impact the Newborn Screening Program has on the newborn population. Program faculty will discuss the ADPH Care Coordination Protocol related to newborn hearing referrals, along with the significant changes made to the "Report to Referring Provider" section in the ACORN documentation system.
