

Everything You Need to Know About Service Animals

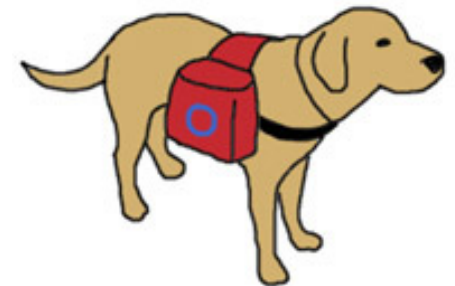
