### **Health Disparities**

 While the overall health of most Americans has improved over time, differences in health for racial, ethnic, and other vulnerable communities have persisted over the years

### **Health Disparities**

 Some Americans experience poorer health and can expect to live 20 years less than others based on where they live, their race, their education, or their income

### **Definition**

 A health disparity is a particular type of health difference that is closely linked with social, economic, and/or environmental disadvantage

### **Definition**

 Health disparities adversely affect people who have systematically experienced greater obstacles to health based on their racial or ethnic group; religion; socioeconomic status; gender; age; mental health; cognitive, sensory or physical disability; sexual orientation or gender identity; geographic location; or other characteristics historically linked to discrimination or exclusion

#### **Economic Burden of Health Inequities** Findings for Study Period of 2003-2006 Eliminating health disparities for minorities would have reduced direct medical care \$1.24 trillion expenditures Direct medical care expenditures for African Americans, Asians, and Hispanics - excess \$229.4 billion costs due to health inequalities Eliminating health inequalities for minorities would have reduced indirect costs associated 30.6% with illness and premature death Eliminating health inequalities for minorities would have reduced indirect costs associated with illness and premature death

### **Definition**

- Health equity is attainment of the highest level of health for all people
- Achieving health equity requires valuing everyone equally with focused and ongoing societal efforts to address avoidable inequalities, historical and contemporary injustices, and the elimination of health and healthcare disparities
