Public Health Law 101: Privacy and Confidentiality

s we all know, there is such a thing as too much information, so during a public health crisis – exactly what information DOES the public need to know? It's a topic that's been wrestled with recently in reporting confirmed cases of novel H1N1 Influenza in Alabama. Legally, what can be publicly reported, what should never be reported and what are the consequences for breaching privacy and confidentiality rules? But, perhaps more importantly, why are these protections in place?

This program is the second, in a series of three, exploring the legal issues involved in public health epidemiological interventions. The core material presented in these three programs has been adapted from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's recently released program: Public Health Law 101: A Fundamental Course for Public Health Practitioners.

- 1. Understand the basic principles of health information privacy, confidentiality, and security.
- 2. Attain some basic familiarity with the universe of legal protections for the privacy and confidentiality of health data.
- 3. Gain a basic understanding of the scope, structure, and implementation of the HIPAA Privacy Rule.
- 4. Be able to discuss the impact of the HIPAA Privacy Rule on public health agencies.
- 5. Understand the distinctions between public health practice and public health research for the purposes of applying privacy laws and policies.
