Early Intervention System

- Eligibility
 - Children younger than 3 years old with a 25% or greater delay in one or more of the five developmental areas:
 - Cognitive
- Social/emotional
- Physical
- Communication
- Adaptive

Early Intervention System

 A vital component in assuring lifetime success for children with disabilities or developmental delays

Children's Rehabilitation Service

- Eligibility
 - Anyone younger than 21 with special health care needs
 - Individuals with hemophilia are eligible at any age

Children's Rehabilitation Service

- Treatment options:
 - -Clinical interventions
 - Medication
 - -Specialized equipment
 - -Therapy services
 - -Care coordination
 - Referral to community resources

Children's Rehabilitation Service

- Referrals of children, teens, young adults, and individuals with hemophilia:
 - Call any one of fifteen offices throughout the state

Vocational Rehabilitation Service

- · Teens and adults with disabilities
- · Goal is employment

Vocational Rehabilitation Service

- Eligibility
 - -Physical or mental impairment
 - Substantial impediment to employment
 - Benefit in terms of an employment outcome from Vocational Rehabilitation Services

Vocational Rehabilitation Service

 Requires VR services to prepare for, retain, or maintain employment

Vocational Rehabilitation Service

- Process:
 - -Application
 - -Individual requests services
 - Eligibility determination
 - Review of existing information assessment

Vocational Rehabilitation Service

- Development of plans for services
- -IPE (Individualized Plan for Employment)
- -Informed choice
- -Services provided
- -Employment
- -Follow-up

Vocational Rehabilitation Service

- Possible services:
 - Assessment for determining eligibility
 - Assessment to determine vocational rehabilitation needs
 - Vocational counseling and guidance

Vocational Rehabilitation Service

- Referral for other services to other agencies
- Job-related services
- -Vocational and training services
- -Technical assistance
- Rehabilitation technology
- -Transition services

Vocational Rehabilitation Service

- -Supported employment services
- Assistance with accommodations
- -Post-employment services

Vocational Rehabilitation Service

- Individually tailored services to match people to jobs
- · Referrals of teens and adults:
 - -Call any one of twenty offices located throughout the state

Independent Living/Homebound

- SAIL
 - Teens and adults with significant disabilities unable to live independently

Independent Living/Homebound

- Three specialized programs:
 - 1. Independent living support services
 - 2. Homebound services
 - 3. Medicaid waiver

Independent Living/Homebound

- SAIL
 - Assists in regaining and maintaining independence
 - Provides services in homes and communities
