Urinary Incontinence (UI) is the loss of bladder control that can be caused by any number of reasons, but most typically is due to muscles in the pelvis that are either too weak or too active. It is a significant problem that affects millions of Americans and becomes more common with age. Women are two times more likely to experience UI than men. The clinician's evaluation of a patient with UI is important to identify the cause in order to help determine appropriate treatment options. Program faculty will define UI, describe the pathophysiology and clinic presentation of common types of UI, and discuss various causes of UI including the influence of pharmacology on UI. Treatment modalities along with pharmaceutical interventions will also be discussed.
