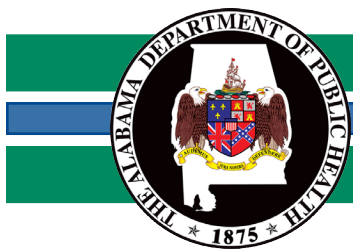

The purpose of this program is to focus on the assessment of substance use as a prevention tool. One evidenced based assessment method is called SBIRT (Screening, Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment). SBIRT has been shown to be effective in reducing substance misuse; however, most health professionals have not been educated in the use of SBIRT. Participants in this program will learn how to conduct SBIRT using a variety of assessment tools, to briefly intervene with patients through guiding behavior change and support the change process.
