

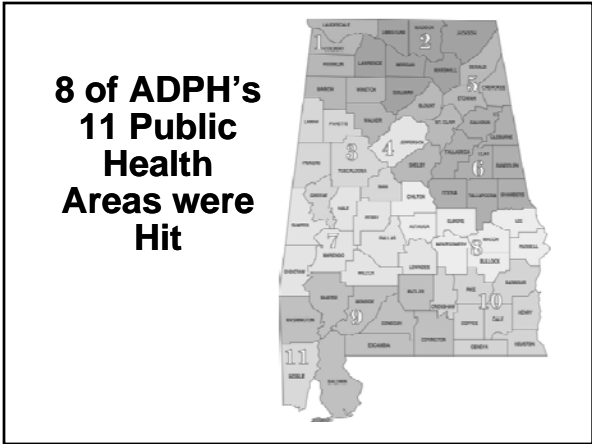
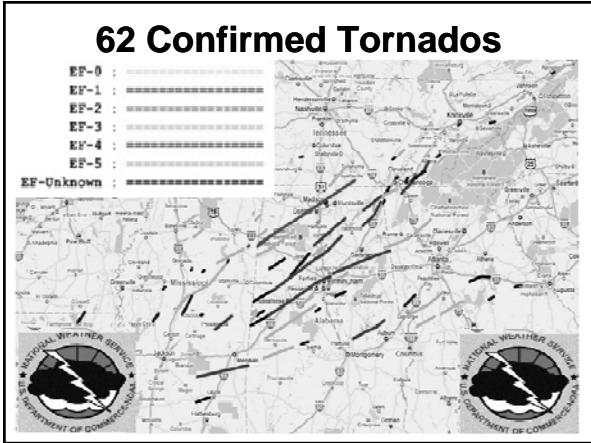

- 247 dead
- Hundreds injured
- One nursing home destroyed
- Thousands homeless
- Two thirds of the state affected
- Major infrastructure interruption

- Public health nurses augmented triage at hospitals
- 8 Medical Needs Shelter Teams
- 4 Administrative Support Teams
- Full ICS and staff recall

 - Each capable of caring for 50 patients for 7 days

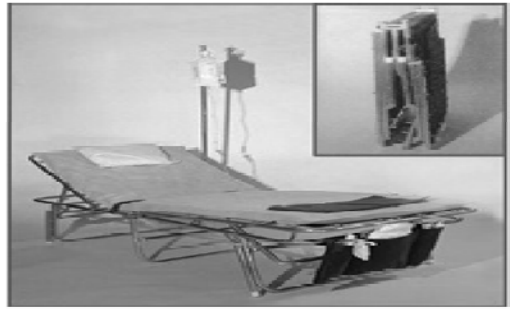

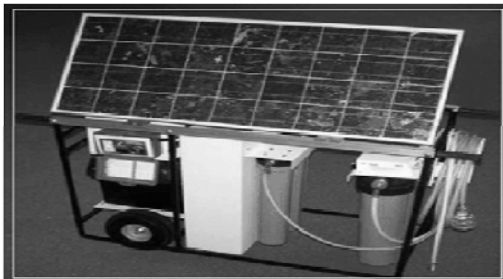

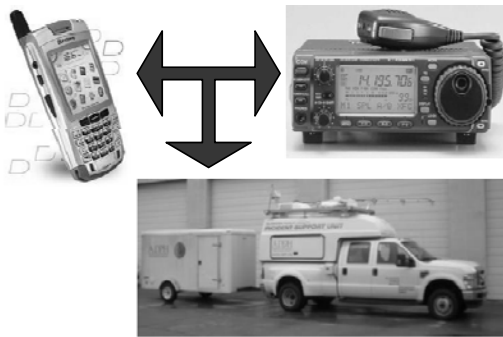
