- The use of force, fraud, or coercion to benefit from the service of another human being.
- The 2 most common types of human trafficking are labor trafficking and sex trafficking.
- Sex trafficking includes, web cams, street prostitution, brothels, etc.

In the case of minors, no force, fraud, or coercion is necessary.

Myths of Human Trafficking

- · Primarily involves kidnapping
- Usually involves transporting across national borders
- · Traffickers are strangers
- Victims come from low socioeconomic families
- · Only females are trafficked

Prevalence of Human Trafficking

- Globally
 - On any given day there are over 40 million people held in modern day slavery around the world.
 - 71% of these are women and girls.
 - 25% are children.
 - It is a \$150 billion dollar industry \$99 billion in sex trafficking.

• Globally - Country of Citizenship/Exploitation





Prevalence of Human Trafficking

- · In Alabama
 - Common venues include hospitality industry, migrant farming, salons, sporting events, festivals, carnivals, and store front operations.
 - Common locations include Huntsville, Birmingham, Montgomery, Tuscaloosa, Auburn/Opelika, Mobile, and Dothan.

Prevalence of Human Trafficking

- Nationally
 - 83% of victims are US citizens or foreign nationals.
 - 50,000 victims are trafficked INTO the US each year.
 - Countries of origin are primarily Mexico and the Philippines.
 - In 2018, 51.6% of the criminal human trafficking cases active in the US were sex trafficking cases involving children only.

Prevalence of Human Trafficking

- In Alabama
 - In 2018 there were 256 contacts made to the human trafficking hotline regarding reports in Alabama with 48 calls coming from victims & survivors.
 - In 2019, there were 286 contacts made regarding reports in Alabama with 90 calls coming from victims & survivors.

- · Recent migration or relocation
- · Homeless or runaway youth
- · LGBTQ+
- · Involvement with child welfare
- Substance use
