- The state is divided into 11 public health areas
- Each public health area is staffed by a local Tobacco Prevention and Control Coordinator

Public Health Areas



Area Tobacco Prevention and Control Coordinators

- Provide presentations and trainings on various tobacco-related topics
- Provide technical assistance for worksites or communities that are considering or are in the process of going smoke-free

Area Tobacco Prevention and Control Coordinators

- Distribute free information relating to tobacco use and cessation services
- Serve as a contact person and resource for tobacco-related issues in the community

Presentations/Trainings

- Ask, Advise, Refer, Prescribe (AARP)
- · Smoke-free homes
- · Tobacco-free worksites
- · Clean Indoor Air
- Key informant survey results/public forum

A.A.R.P.

- Topic
 - Tobacco cessation for patients and clients
 - Participants also receive information on free cessation services offered through the Alabama Tobacco Quitline

A.A.R.P.

- Audience
 - Healthcare providers and social services professionals
- Accreditation
 - Approved for continuing education credits for nurses, social workers, nutritionists, and dental hygienists

A.A.R.P.

- All participants receive certificate of completion
- Other professionals who are seeking continuing education credits will need to submit the course information and attendance records to their certifying agency for approval

Smoke-Free Homes

- Topic
 - Secondhand smoke and children's health issues
- Audience
 - Staff of any organization that serves infants, children, or adolescents

Smoke-Free Homes

 All participants receive certificate of attendance and opportunity to take the Smoke-Free Home Pledge

Tobacco-Free Worksites

- Topic
 - Financial benefits of smoke-free worksite policies and strategies for implementation
- Audience
 - Business owners, managers, supervisors, human resources personnel, and safety coordinators

Tobacco-Free Worksites

- Participants receive a free toolkit and free technical support from local tobacco prevention and control coordinator
- Free cessation counseling and free 4
 week supply of nicotine patches
 available for participants who call the
 Alabama Tobacco Quitline

Tobacco-Free Worksites

 Participants who are not medically eligible for the patch will still receive free counseling through the Quitline

Clean Indoor Air

- Topic
 - Health and economic benefits of smoke-free policies in public places
- Audience
 - Community leaders and decision makers

Clean Indoor Air

- Participants receive information on the health and economic benefits of smoke-free policies
 - They are presented with the results of numerous economic impact studies and model ordinance language

Key Informant Surveys/Interviews

- Local tobacco prevention and control coordinators interview community leaders and decision makers to determine their views on clean air issues
- Cumulative results are discussed with community partners, coalitions, or other interested groups

- Provides free counseling and free 4week supply of nicotine replacement therapy
 - For medically eligible participants
- · Sponsored by the ADPH
- No cost to participants
