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• Gestures and facial expressions are just as important as signs. Do not assume all deaf people know how to sign or can read signs. It is important to try to communicate by any means necessary during an emergency situation.

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The 5 rules of ASL are to use parameters. Parameters describe how a sign is used within the signer's space. The 5 rules are:

- 1. Hand Shape: The Alphabet
- 2. Palm Orientation: Out/In, Face Left/Right, Up/Down
- 3. <u>Movement</u>: Up/Down, Forward/Backward, Back and Forth, Wiggle
- 4. Location: Front Body, Left/Right Side of Body, Chin, Shoulder, etc
- 5. <u>Expression (non-manual signs)</u>: Head Nod/Shake/Tilt, Eyebrows Up/Down, Eyes Open/Narrow, Mouth Perched/Open
