- Asterisks (*) in the Demographics Tab indicates it as "required". The orange asterisks are required for Scheduling. Blue asterisks are required for Immunization and Lab orders.
- Support Staff is responsible for setting up the Patient Portal. When accessing the Patient Portal, patients <u>only</u> have access to input the <u>username</u> and <u>temporary password</u> that is issued.
