apply. The purpose of these grants is to implement and study effective strategies to inform and educate potentially eligible low-income people not currently participating in the Food Stamp Program (FSP) about the nutrition benefits of the FSP, eligibility rules, and how to apply. FNS is interested in obtaining innovative approaches from new partners in its effort to reach non-participating seniors and Hispanics. For this reason, FNS excludes entities that received FSP grants previously, since they already participate in FNS outreach efforts. Selected grantees may be asked to certify, as part of the grant agreement, that the organization has not previously received an Outreach or Participation Grant from FNS. At least \$1 million is available in FY 2008 for grant awards under this program, contingent upon availability. The maximum grant award amount is \$75,000. All applicants are required to provide a letter of acknowledgement from the state or local food stamp offices. The full application must be submitted by February 19, 2008. FDA Approves Zyrtec for Nonprescription Use in Adults and Children

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration has approved tablet, chewable tablet, and syrup formulations of Zyrtec (cetirizine HCl) for nonprescription use. The nonprescription drug is approved for the temporary relief of symptoms due to hay fever or other respiratory allergies (sneezing; running nose; itchy, watery eyes; itchy throat or nose) in adults and children two years of age and older. The nonprescription Zyrtec products also are approved for the relief of itching due to hives in people six years of age and older. The company will market two distinct Zyrtec products for each dosage form. One will provide directions for treating the symptoms of hay fever and other respiratory allergies. The other will contain directions for use to relieve the itching due to hives. Sales of the Zyrtec-D are subject to restrictions in the Combat

Methamphetamine Epidemic Act, due to its pseudoephedrine content. Zyrtec is marketed and distributed by McNeil Consumer Healthcare. <http://www.fda.gov/bbs/topics/NEWS/2007/NEW01750.html>.

BOAT PEOPLE SOS from Bayou La Batre and Biloxi will be participating in CERT training.
