- studies by the Surgeon General of the United States, the National Academy of Sciences, and other health organizations have linked passive exposure to tobaccosmoke (second-hand smoke) to a variety of negative health conditions in nonsmokers; and
- WEBRI S, the possession of lighted smoking materials in public places may be a nuisance and hazardous to the public health, safety, comfort, convenience, and indoor environment; and
- the simple separation of smokers and nonsmokers within TTIDRĒ \S, the same air space may reduce the exposure of non-smokers to environmental tobacco smoke; and
- WHERE AS, the City Council of the City of Ozark, Alabama, seeks to strike a reasonable balance between the rights of smokers and nonsmokers by requesting restaurant owners to furnish a non-smoking section for their customers.

WWW, WEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that all restaurant owners and or rectors are hereby requested to make available to all customers a more amoking area and to consider the affect of second hand smoke in all future development.
