



2005 Hispanic Tobacco and Health Survey

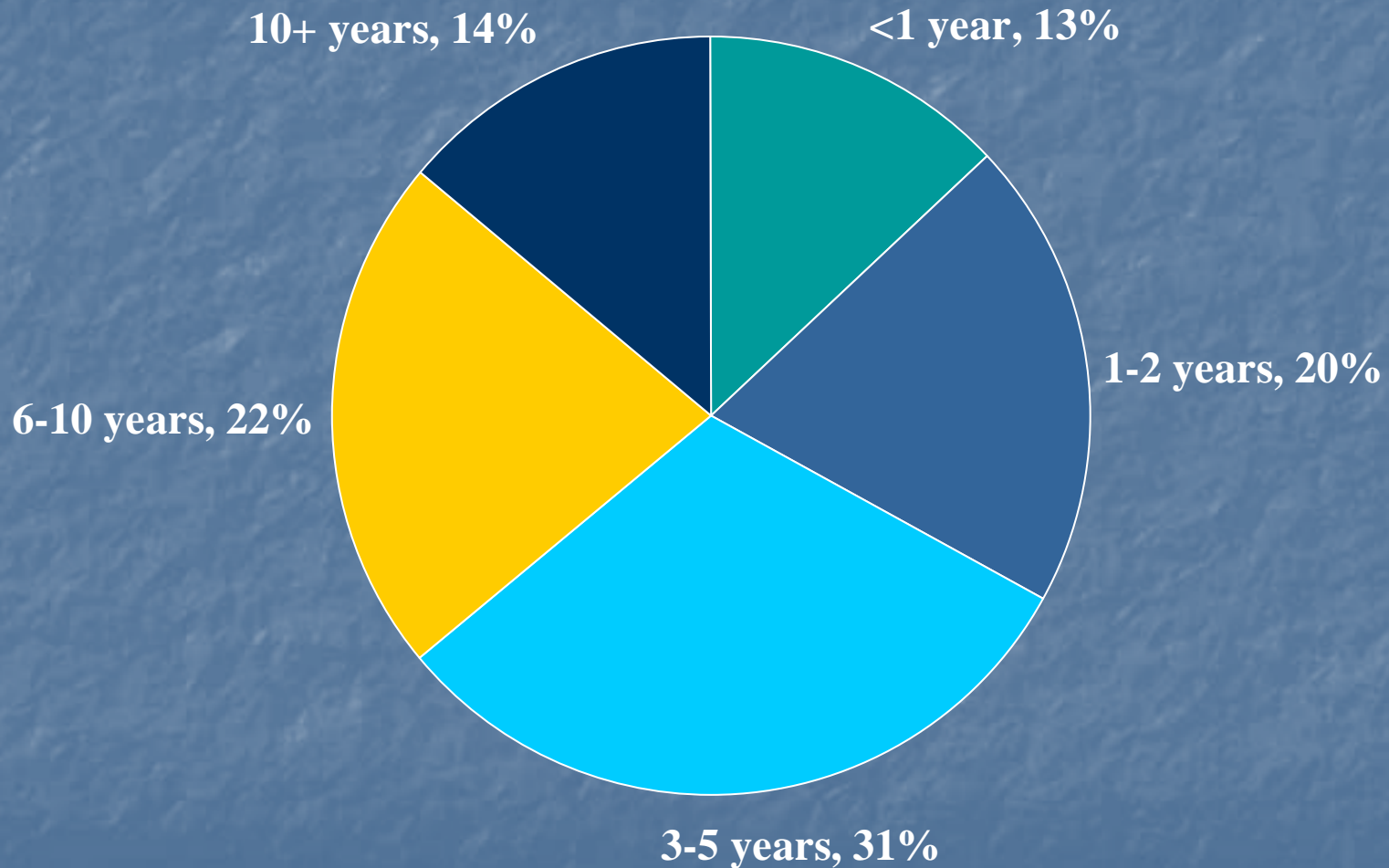
Methodology

- Surveys were completed in face to face interviews using a convenience sample n=479.
- The Hispanic Survey was conducted by four Hispanic Interest Coalition throughout Alabama.
- The project is a result of a collaboration between these coalitions, the Office of Minority Health, and the Coalition for a Tobacco free Alabama.

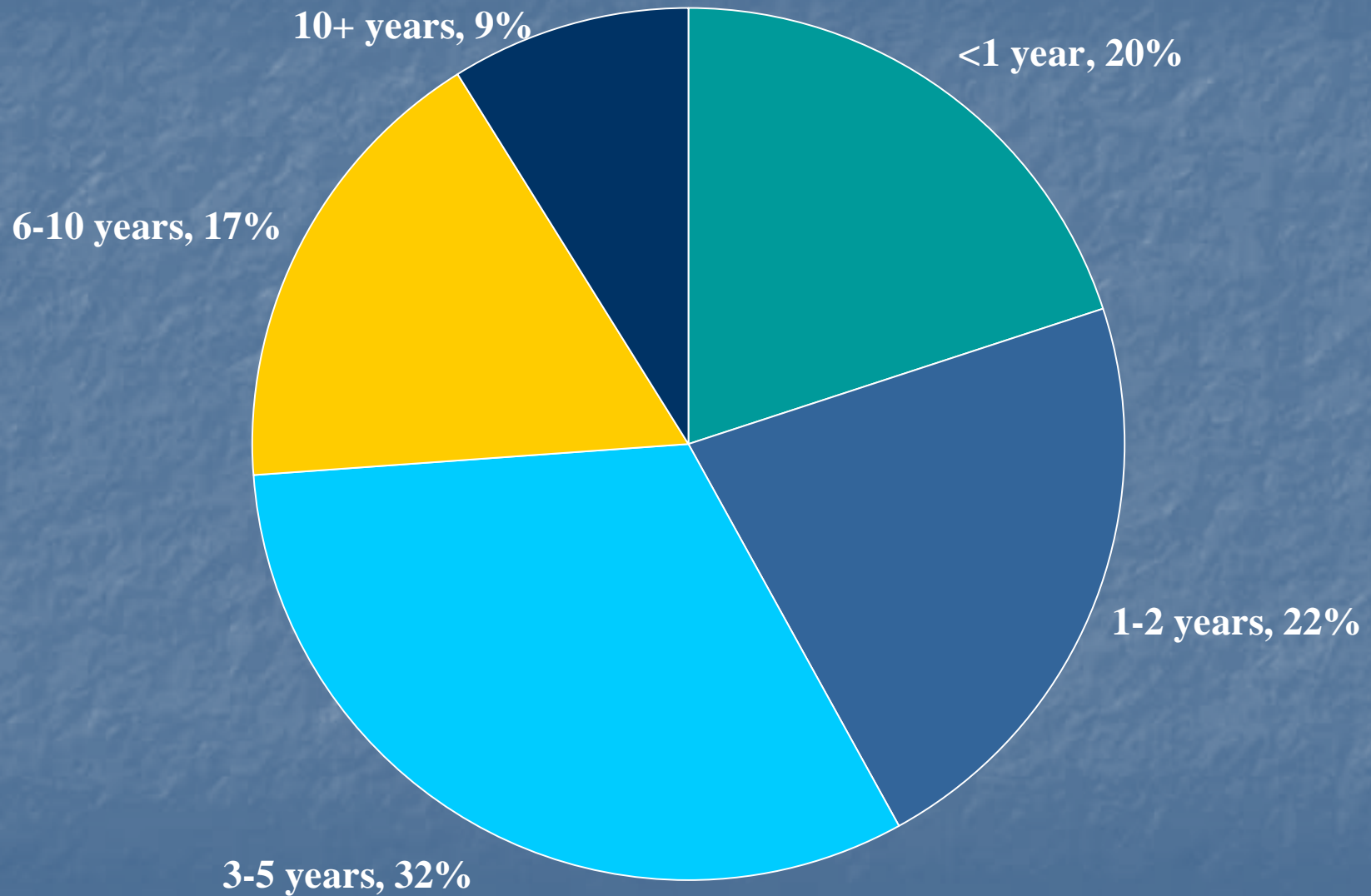
Demographics

- 4% were from the Caribbean

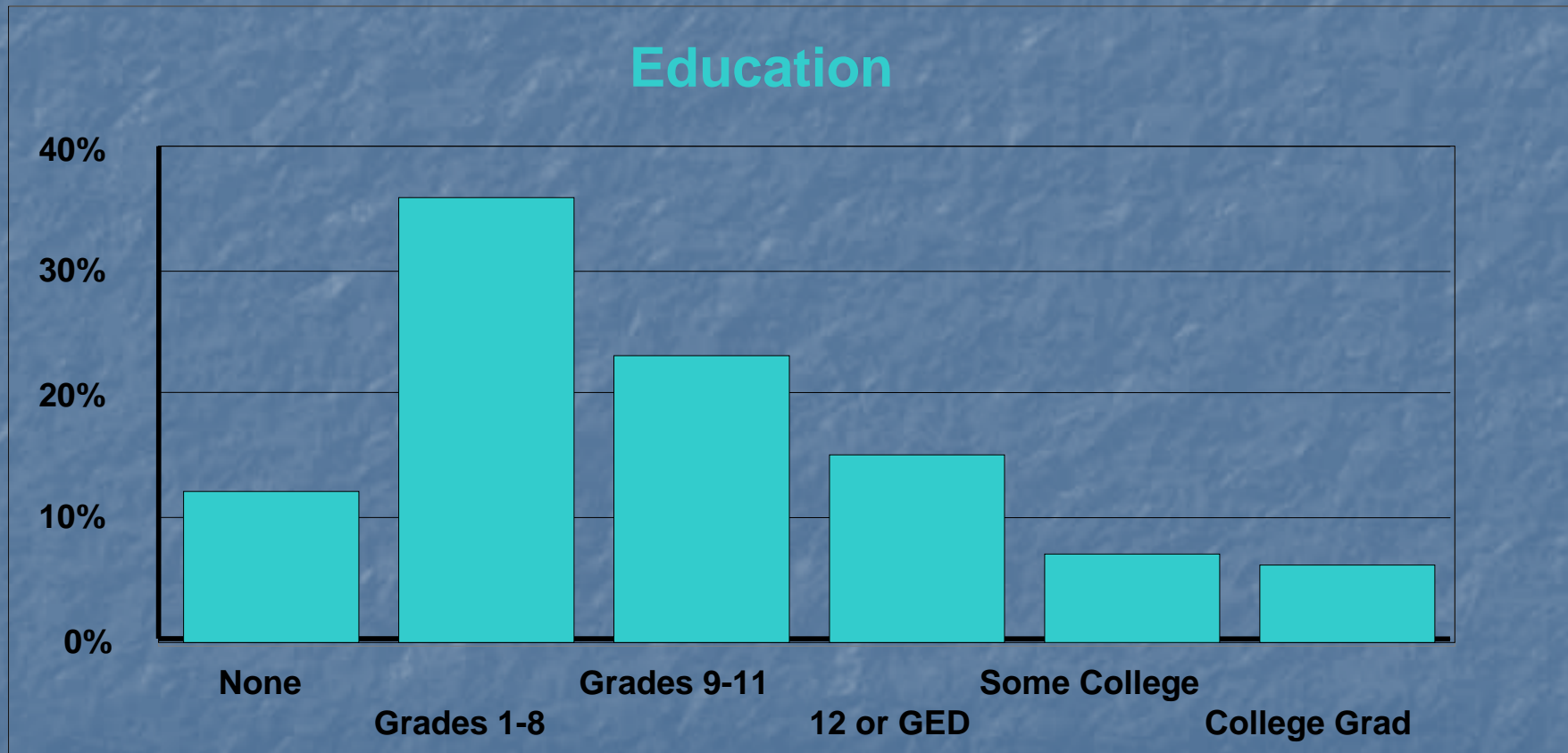
How long have you lived in the U.S.?



How long have you lived in Alabama?

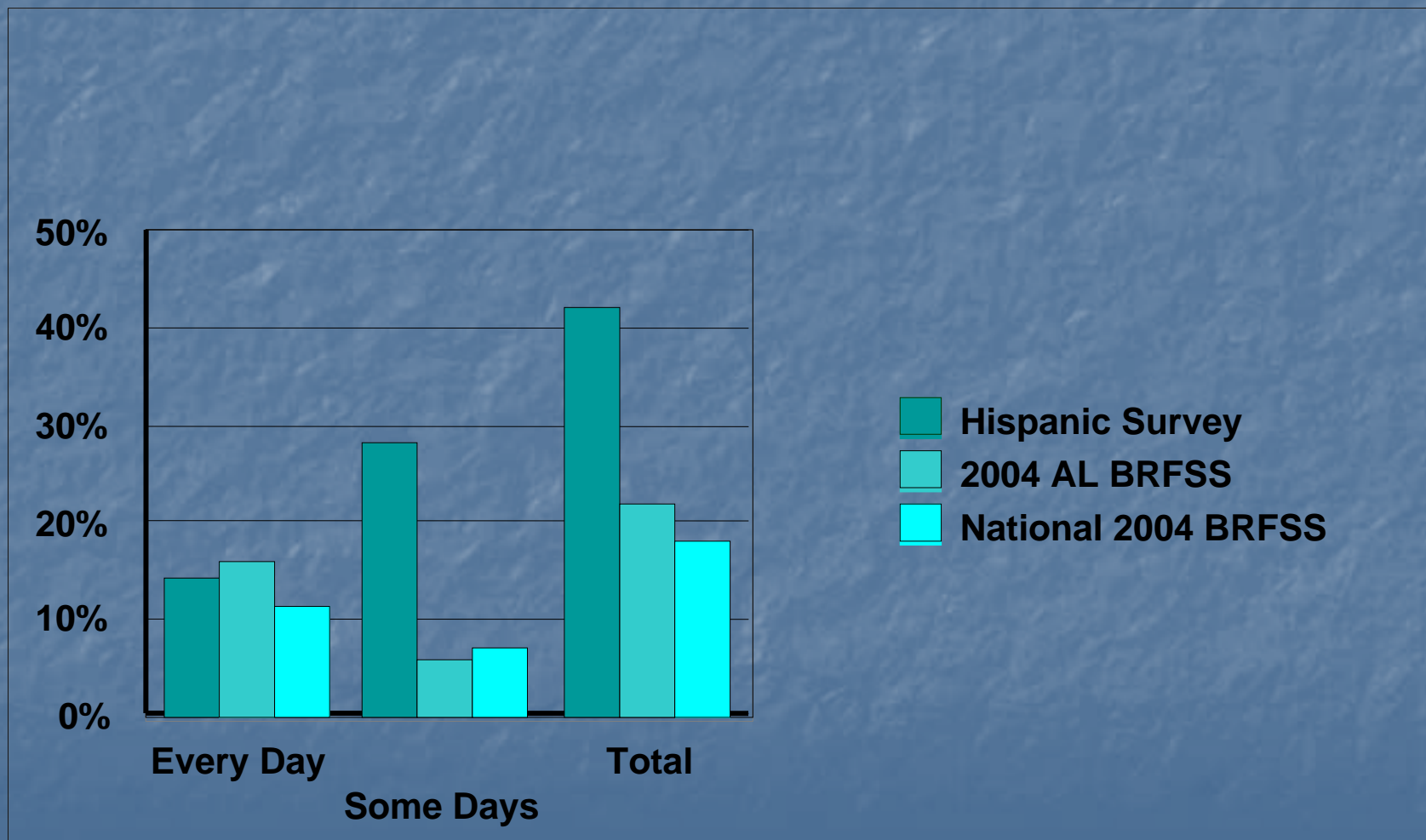

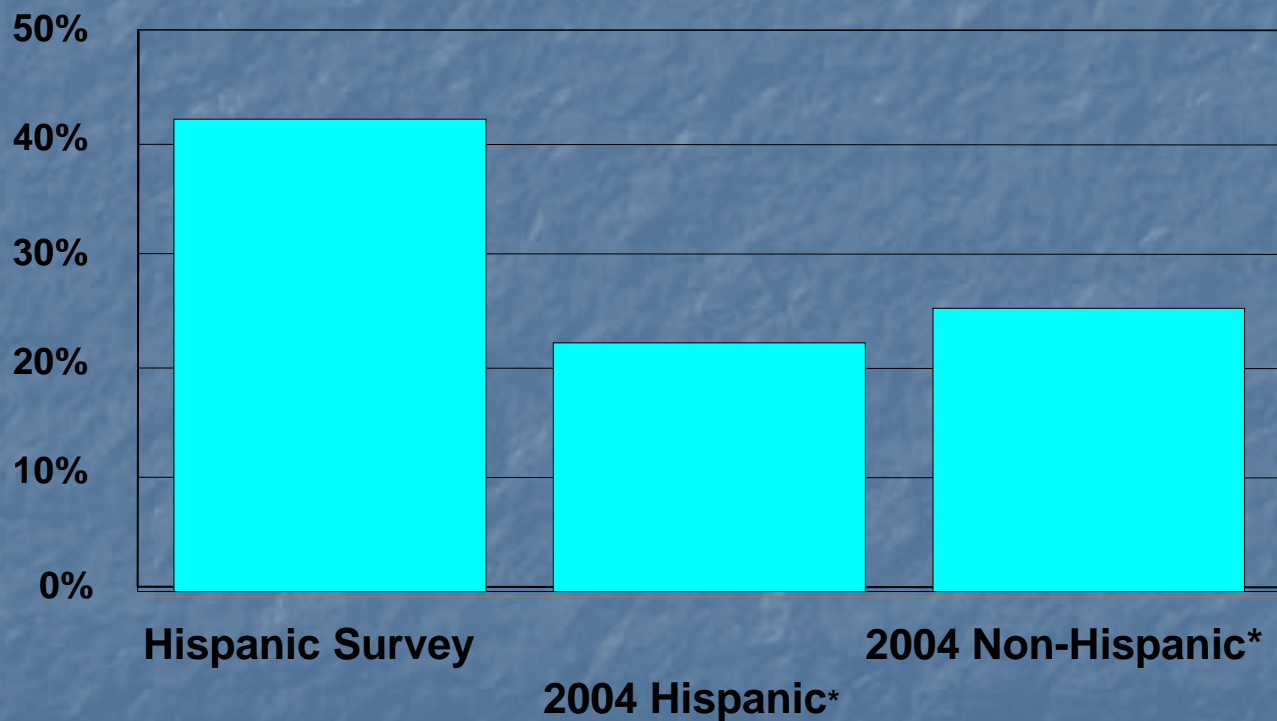

Smoking Status in Hispanics 2005

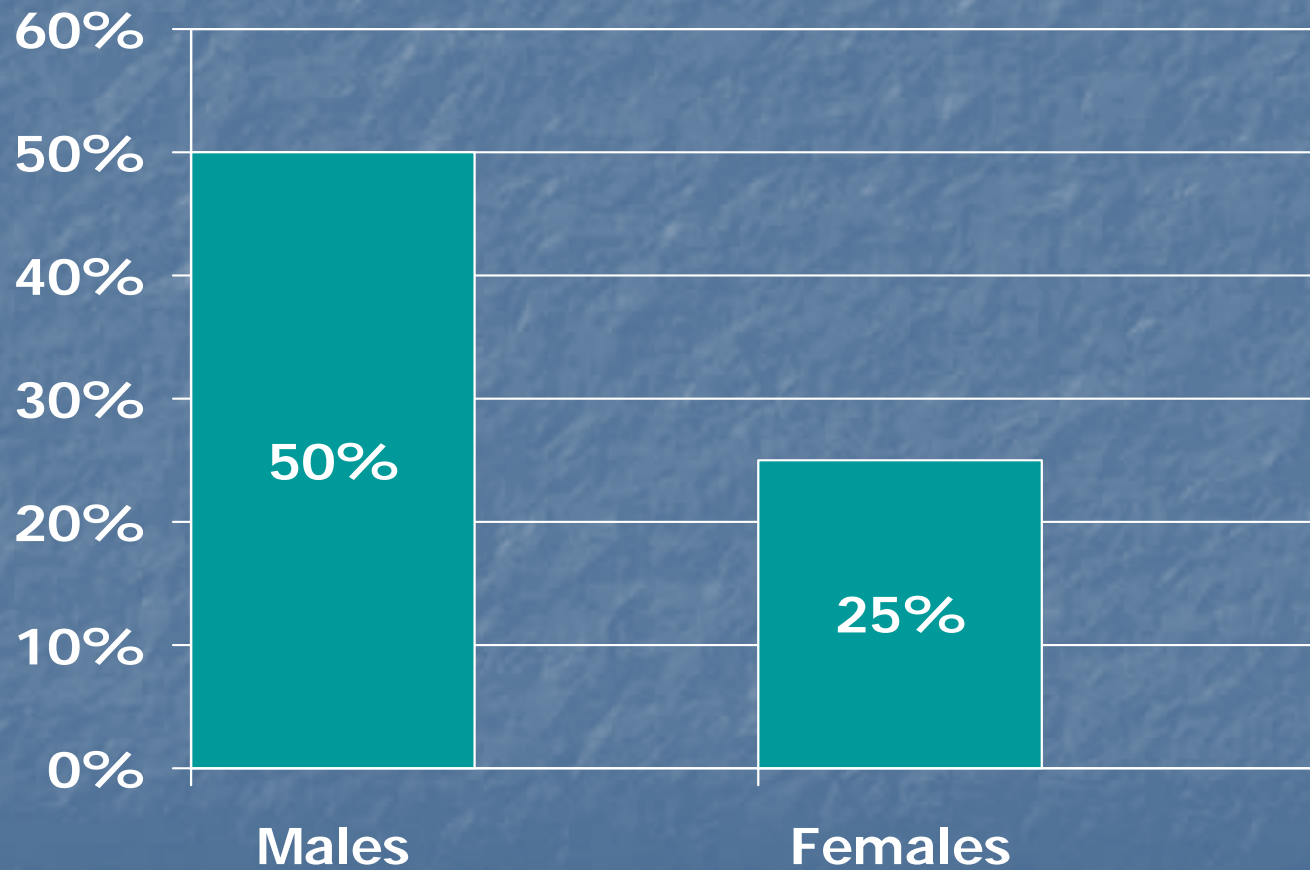


Current Smokers

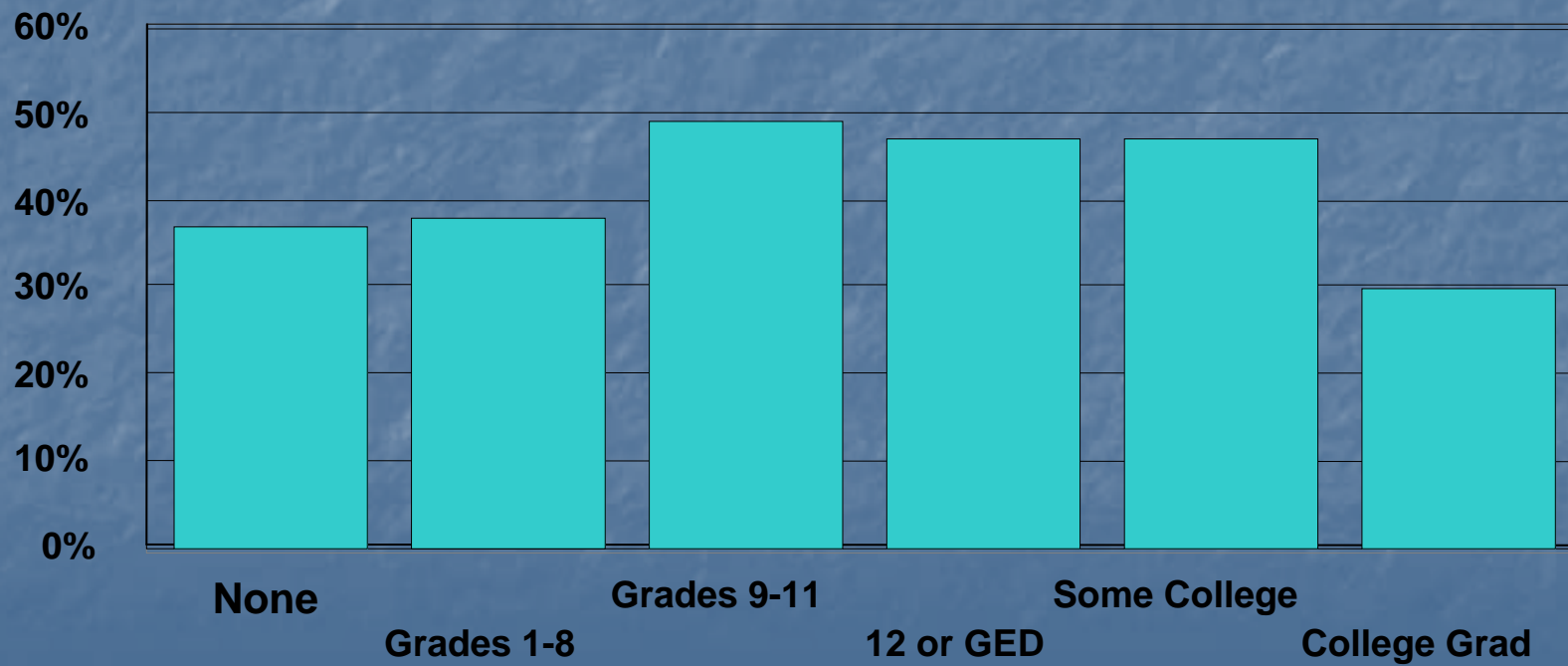

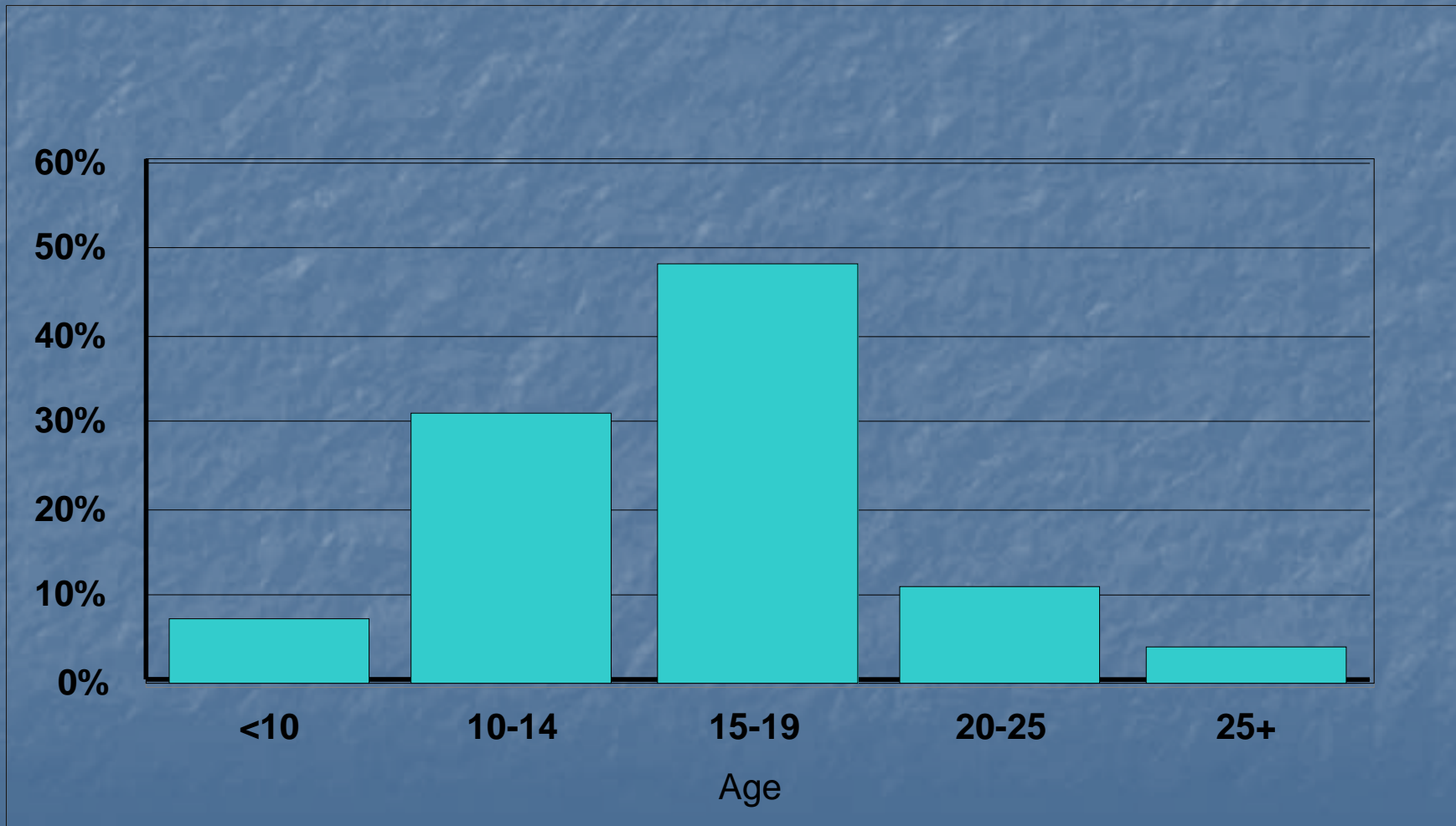
Current Smoker by Sex



% of Smokers by Education

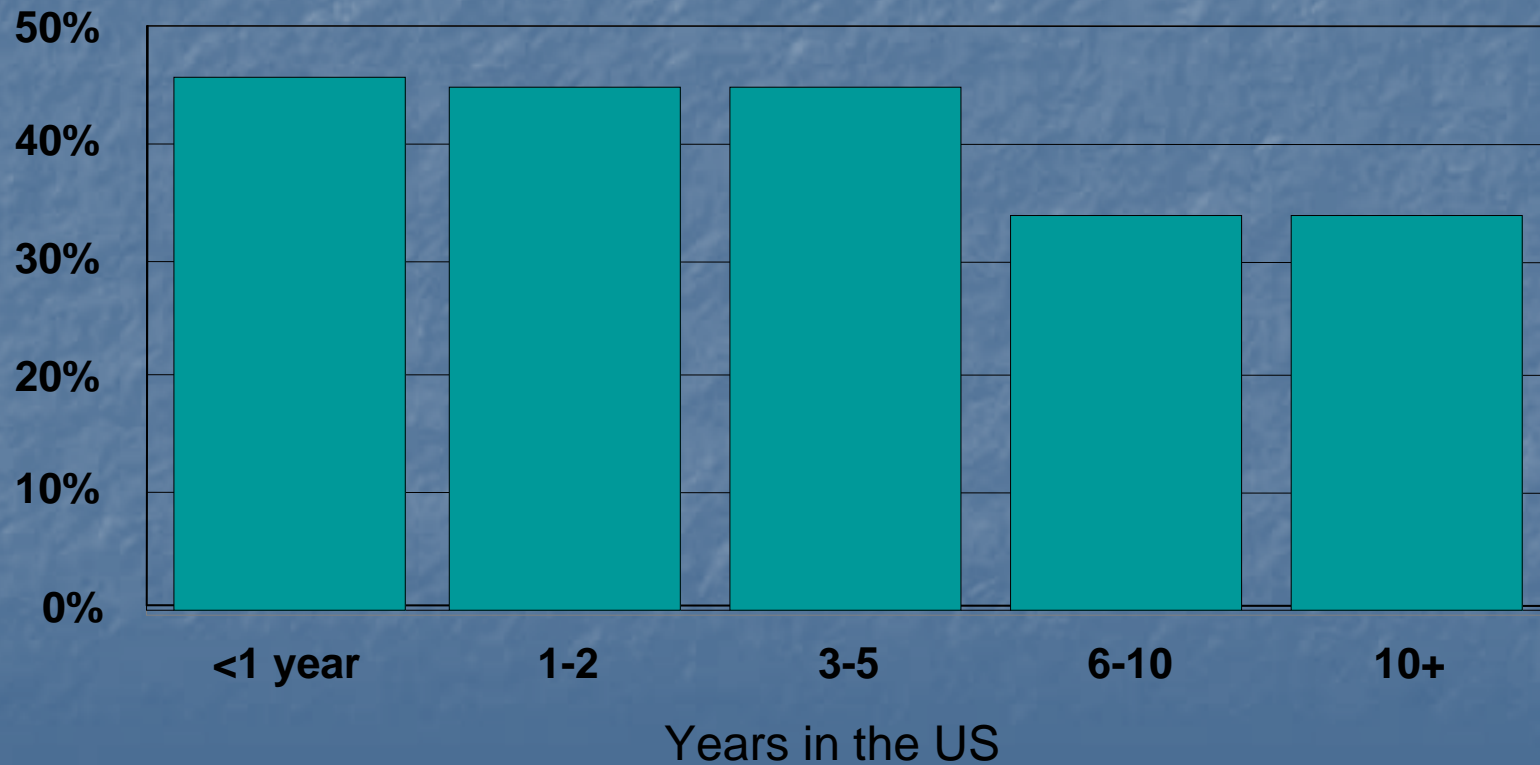


Age of Initiation

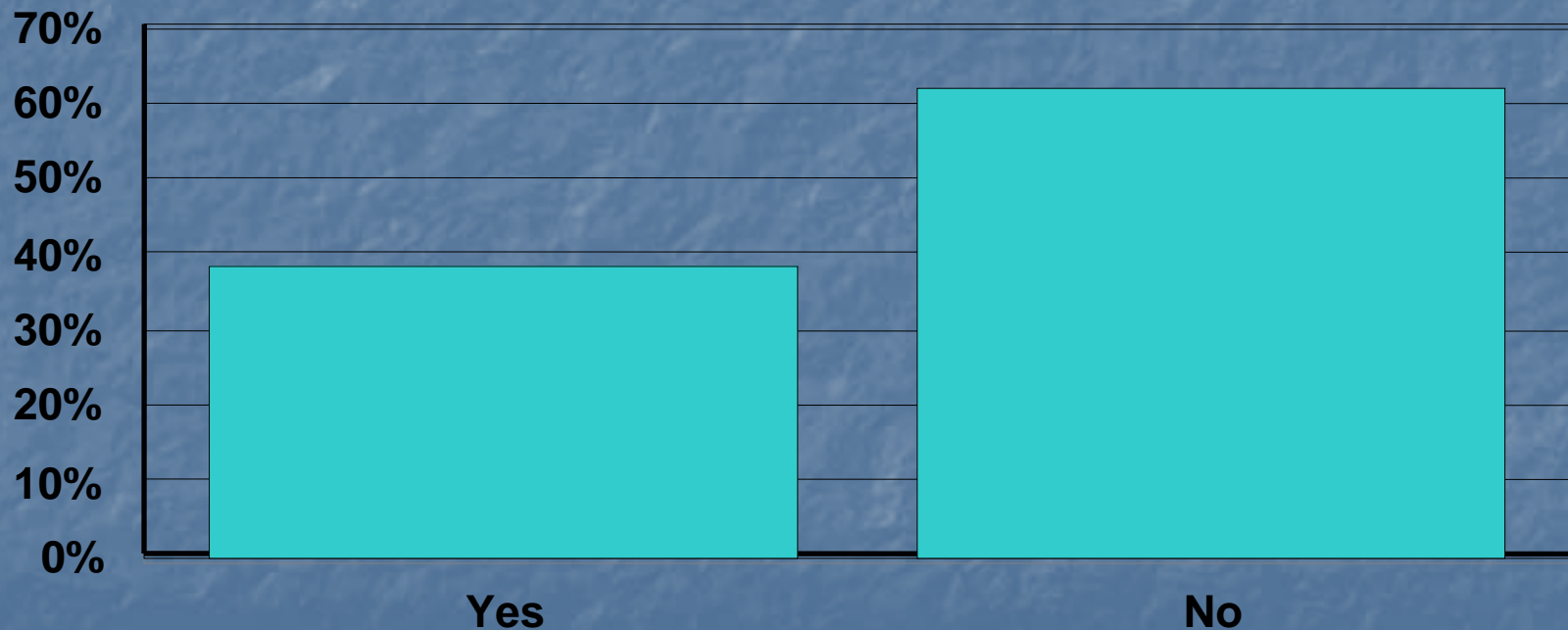


By Years in the United States

Current Smokers by Years in the US

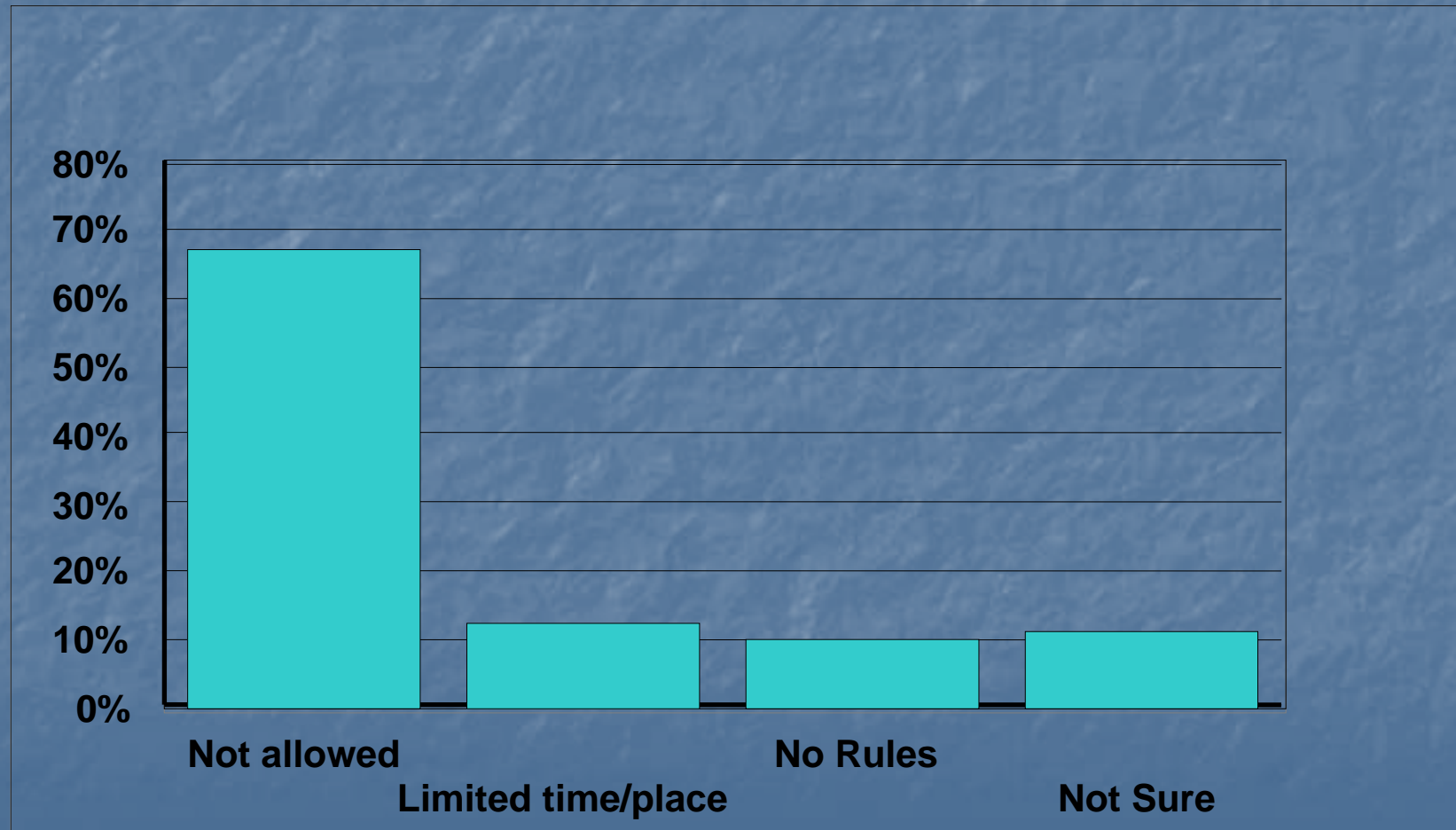


Quit Attempts in Past 12 Months
