#### Region 1

- The AERO region borders
   Mississippi to the west, Tennessee to the north, and Georgia to the east
  - Comprises approximately 15% of the Alabama's land area
  - -Comprises 19% of the population

# **Region 1**

- AERO activated into the Alabama Trauma System on Feb 25, 2008
  - -1 Level I trauma hospital
  - -1 Level II trauma hospital
  - -9 Level III trauma hospitals
  - -6 community trauma hospitals

- The pre-hospital components providing emergency medical service and entering patients into the trauma system consists of:
  - -30 licensed Advanced Life Support
     (ALS) ground transport services
  - -16 licensed ALS first response agencies

- -2 EMS helicopter services
- Over 187 volunteer fire and rescue first response departments
- Trauma System Manager coordinates quarterly meetings with the trauma center managers to discuss trauma system issues

 The East Alabama Region consists of 10 counties

-Calhoun -Coosa

-Chambers -Etowah

-Cherokee -Randolph

-Clay -Talladega

-Cleburne -Tallapoosa

# **Region 2**

- Aside from a few mid-size cities, it is primarily a rural area
  - -Becomes host to one of the largest cities in the state twice a year when NASCAR comes to Talladega

# Region 2

- The East Region Trauma System was activated on Oct 9, 2009
  - -1 Level II trauma center
  - -7 Level III trauma centers
  - -6 community hospitals

- Nearly 30% of the trauma patients entered into the system from the region are taken to a Level I trauma center
  - -Usually by an aero-medical service

- The pre-hospital components providing emergency medical service and entering patients into the trauma system consists of:
  - -39 licensed ALS services
  - -2 licensed BLS services
  - -2 regional EMS helicopter bases
  - -227 non-transport services

#### **Region 2**

- Trauma system coordinator visits each trauma center every 4-6 weeks to inspect/maintain the trauma system computer and visit with the ER staff
  - It's a time to discuss any issues specific to that facility and area

#### Region 2

- Provides time to do some retraining and communicate any issues back to the state
- Adding a quarterly conference call with the trauma managers

# Region 3

- The Birmingham Regional Emergency Medical Services System (BREMSS) is located in central Alabama with a footprint which encompasses seven counties
  - -Winston
- -St. Clair
- -Walker
- -Shelby
- -Blount
- Chilton
- -Jefferson

- 10 hospitals are in the Alabama Trauma System (ATS)
  - -2 Level I
    - UAB and TCH
  - -8 Level III
    - Brookwood, Lakeland,
       St. Vincent's East, Princeton,
       Shelby Baptist, Trinity, UAB
       Medical West, Walker Baptist

 The BREMSS trauma system began operation on October 2, 1996 and became part of the ATS after statewide legislation was passed in 2007

# **Region 3**

- BREMSS operates the Alabama Trauma Communications Center for the ATS and its administrator ADPH/OEMS&T
  - BREMSS through its over 210 prehospital organizations will enter over 3,000 trauma patients in the ATS each year

#### Region 3

- All of these patients will be treated within BREMSS unless patient preference directs otherwise
- Trauma managers are also the Nurse Managers of the ERs and meet bimonthly with the MDAC

- Region 4 activated 1 Regional Hospital March 8, 2010 participating as a Level III
- Providing the pre-hospital components of the trauma system and emergency medical service needs are:
  - -15 licensed Advanced Life Support (ALS) ground transport services

- -6 licensed ALS first response agencies
- -2 EMS helicopter services
- -3 rescue squads
- Over 100 volunteer fire and rescue first response departments

#### Region 5

- The Southeast Region is composed of 20 counties
  - Borders Georgia on the east and Florida on the south
  - -Over 50% rural
  - Covers over 25% of the land area of the state
  - Serves over 20% of the population of the state

# Region 5

- 10 approved Level III trauma centers but the Regional Trauma System has not been activated
  - Awaiting participation from hospitals in Dothan and Montgomery

- Providing the pre-hospital components of the trauma system and emergency medical service needs are:
  - -46 licensed Advanced Life Support
     (ALS) ground transport services
  - -7 licensed Basic Life Support (BLS) ground transport services

- -13 licensed ALS first response agencies
- -4 licensed BLS first response agencies
- -3 EMS helicopter services
- Trauma Managers network will be established when the region is activated in the trauma system

# Region 6

- Composed of seven southwest Alabama counties
  - -Baldwin -Mobile
  - -Clarke -Monroe
  - -Conecuh -Washington
  - -Escambia

#### Region 6

- Bordered by Mississippi on the west,
   Florida on the east and south, and
   the Gulf of Mexico on the south
  - -Greater than 50% rural
  - -Covers 16% of the land area of the state
  - -Serves 15% of the population of the state

# Region 6

-AGEMSS also serves a population exceeding four million visitors along the Gulf coast

- 16 hospitals participate in the trauma system
  - -3 Level I
  - -1 Level II
  - -12 Level III
- Entered trauma system September
   14, 2009 as the first region to enter under the 2007 state trauma law

- Pre-hospital information AGEMSS serves:
  - -16 ALS transport services
  - -1 helicopter service
  - -6 ALS non-transport services
  - AGEMSS also serves the BLS / first response services within our seven counties

# Region 6

- -AGEMSS has approximately 1,600 licensed EMS providers
- AGEMSS trauma system coordinator and regional staff visits each trauma center every 4-6 weeks to inspect/maintain the trauma system computer and visit with the emergency department staff

- Discuss any issues specific to that facility and area
- Re-training and communicate any issues back to the state
- Adding a quarterly conference call with the trauma managers
