



talking points



- Fumes from burning painted wood.
- Chips and debris from outside paint.
- Lead paint on walls, woodwork, furniture and toys.
- Lead water pipes and soldered joints.
- Emissions from cars burning lead gasoline.
- Food stored or served in lead glazed pottery.
- Lead from debris and dust created by home renovation.
- Some craft and hobby supplies.
- Soil in yards, playgrounds or gardens near painted buildings or busy streets.
- Paint on porches and steps.

prevention points



- Get a blood test.
- Be alert to sources of lead.
- Provide well-balanced meals.
- Inform others about lead hazards.
