New ways to expand team-based health care are needed to protect the health of Americans. Many chronic diseases, which are increasing with the aging U.S. population, are preventable or manageable. The role of the pharmacist has expanded beyond just dispensing medications and is evolving into active participation in chronic disease management as a part of team-based care. Programs addressing chronic diseases in clinics and communities can build team relationships through partnerships with pharmacists. Engaging pharmacists as members of the health care system can significantly improve treatment of diabetes, better control high blood pressure, improve management of cholesterol, and reduce overall health care costs. Program faculty will discuss the role of the pharmacist in team-based health care to promote the control of hypertension and diabetes. Examples of medication therapy management and patient education/counseling by pharmacists will also be discussed.
