With the exception of the common cold, head lice affect more school-aged children than all other communicable diseases combined. Head lice can infest people of all ages, but children are prone to infestations because of their habits of playing in close contact, sharing hats, headphones, combs and brushes, sleeping bags, stuffed animals, clothing, and other personal items. The problem of head lice can be so rampant among preschool and school-aged children that often schools must work in conjunction with many families to control an infestation. This program will provide beneficial information for the management of a head lice infestation.
