

APRIL'S TORNADO FURY: THE SOCIAL IMPACT ON PERSONAL CARE AND HEALTH ACCESS (PART 2 OF 2)

April 27, 2011 – a day forever etched in Alabama history and a day recorded in weather history as the fifth deadliest tornado day. Nearly 300 tornadoes were reported in 16 states that day, with the most destructive twisters hitting Alabama. More than 230 deaths have been confirmed from that day, and the road to recovery is only just beginning. During the second part of this two part series, program faculty will discuss the personal and mental health aspects of tornado relief efforts and the long term effects on health care access in minority communities.
