Proven Deterrent to Rebellion



How often a family eats dinner together is a powerful indicator of whether a teen is likely to smoke, drink or use drugs and whether the teen is likely to perform better academically. In addition, findings in *The Importance of Family Dinners II* shows teens and their parents wish they could have dinner together more often.

Compared to teens who have five or more family dinners per week, those who have two or less are:

- · 3 times likelier to try marijuana;
- 2.5 times likelier to smoke cigarettes;
- More than 1.5 times likelier to drink alcohol.
- 3 times likelier to report that half or more of their friends use marijuana;
- Twice as likely to know a friend or classmate who uses Ecstasy;

The Importance of Family Dinners II study by The National Center on Addiction and Substance Abuse (CASA) at Columbia University and sponsored by TV Land and Nick at Nite's Family Table.

- Nearly 80 % were likelier to know a friend or classmate who abuses prescription drugs;
- 40% were likelier to know a friend or classmate who uses acid, cocaine or heroin.

The study further revealed:

- Nearly one in five teens who have family dinners two times a week or less report that there is a great deal of tension or stress at home between family members.
- Nearly 70% of teens who eat dinner with their parents five to seven times a
 week say that their parents are very proud of them, compared to 48 percent
 of teens who have family dinners two times a week or less.
- Teens who have frequent family dinners are likelier to say they would turn to one or both of their parents if they had a serious problem than those who have infrequent family dinners.
- Teens who can confide in their parents are at much lower risk for substance abuse than teens who would confide in another adult or who have no adult in whom to confide.
- Teens who have frequent family dinners are likelier to get better grades in school, and higher academic performance is associated with lower substance abuse risk.

Teens who have dinner with their families seven times a week are almost 40% likelier to say they receive mostly A's and B's in school compared to teens who have dinner with their families two or fewer times a week.

AWOL- Alcohol Without Liquor



College kids love the new low-calorie, low-carbohydrate way to consume alcohol. It's called AWOL, Alcohol With Out Liquid, and it is now available in The United States after debuts in Europe and Asia. AWOL consists of two components: an oxygen generator and a handheld vaporizer. Tubes from the generator attach to the vaporizer. The user chooses an 80-proof spirit, which is poured into the vaporizer. Oxygen mixes with the fluid, producing a mist which is inhaled through the mouth. Alcohol enters the bloodstream through the lungs rather than the stomach.

The user chooses which spirit will be used, which is loaded into a diffuser capsule in the machine. The oxygen bubbles are then passed through the capsule before being inhaled through a tube. The resultant cloudy vapor is then inhaled from the end of the tube via a device that converts liquid to vapor.

"When you inhale alcohol right into the lung tissue, that gets drawn right into the blood supply immediately, so it's a very rapid onset of the intoxicating effect, and so has obviously very high abuse potential," said Robert Walker, an assistant professor at the University of Kentucky Center on Drug and Alcohol Research. Even Spirit Partners, Inc., a manufacturer of AWOL warms, AWOL should be used no more than two 20-minute sessions within a 24-hour period.

The AWOL devices could provide a dangerous legal loophole for teenagers in states where current law forbids only "underage drinking," not "underage inhaling."

So far, 17 states have banned the devices, including Illinois, California, New York, Florida, Pennsylvania and Ohio, and several others are considering doing so. On May 11, 2006 California Legislature passed Assembly Bill 273 (AB 273), a measure authored by Assemblyman Joe Baca Jr. (D-Rialto) which would prohibit the sale or possession of any alcohol vaporizing device, "This product delivers alcohol directly to the brain in such an efficient way that there is no way to know its long term effects nor are there any standards that law enforcement could use when trying to enforce the appropriate blood alcohol level for drivers." added California Assemblyman Joe Baca Jr. (D-Rialto)

All alcohol products sold in America must be federally approved by the Alcohol and Tobacco Tax and Trade Bureau, but since the AWOL machine is technically a device rather than an alcohol product, it was able to avoid regulatory oversight. As a result, Congressman Bob Beauprez introduced the "Alcohol Without Liquid Machine Safety Act of 2005" (H.R. 613), which would subject the device to the Food and Drug Administration pre-market approval processes. That measure is still pending.

Flask Sandals Easily Hide Alcohol or other Drugs


