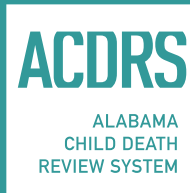

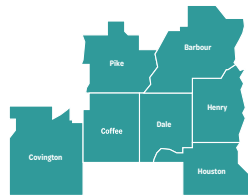


ALABAMA CHILD DEATH SCENE INVESTIGATION TRAINING, JUNE 25-26, 2024
