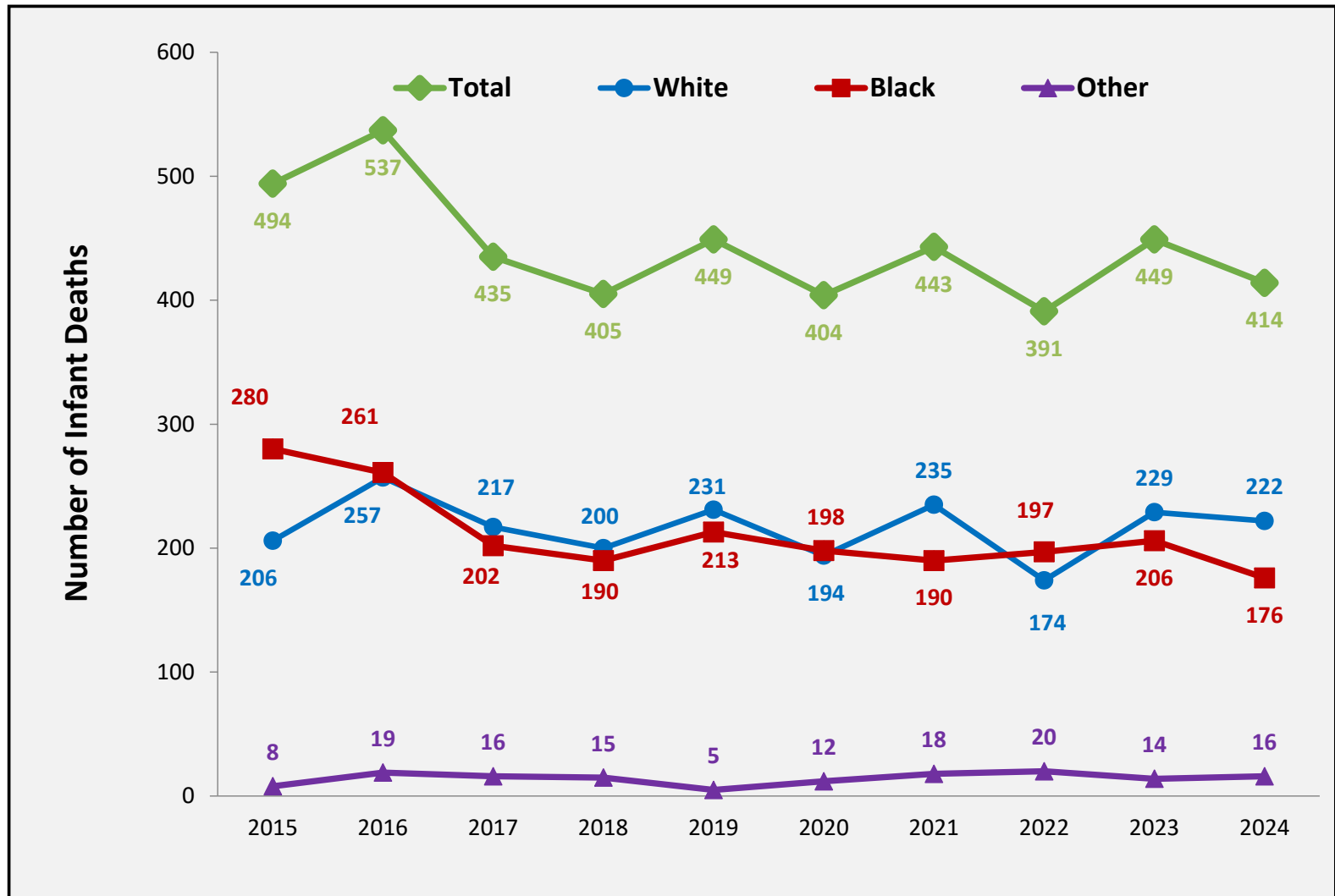

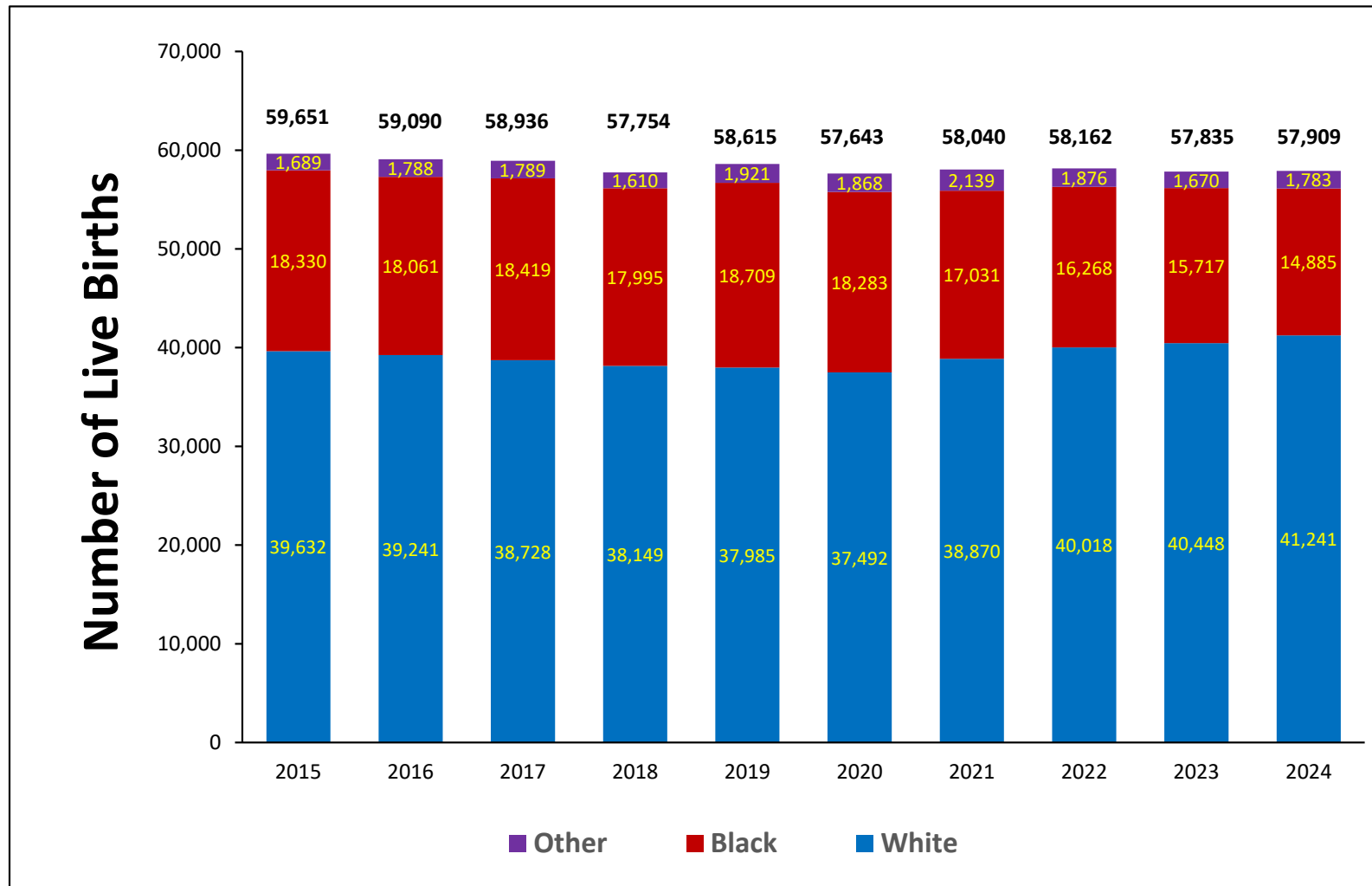
ALABAMA, 2015-2024



NUMBER OF INFANT DEATHS ALABAMA, 2015-2024

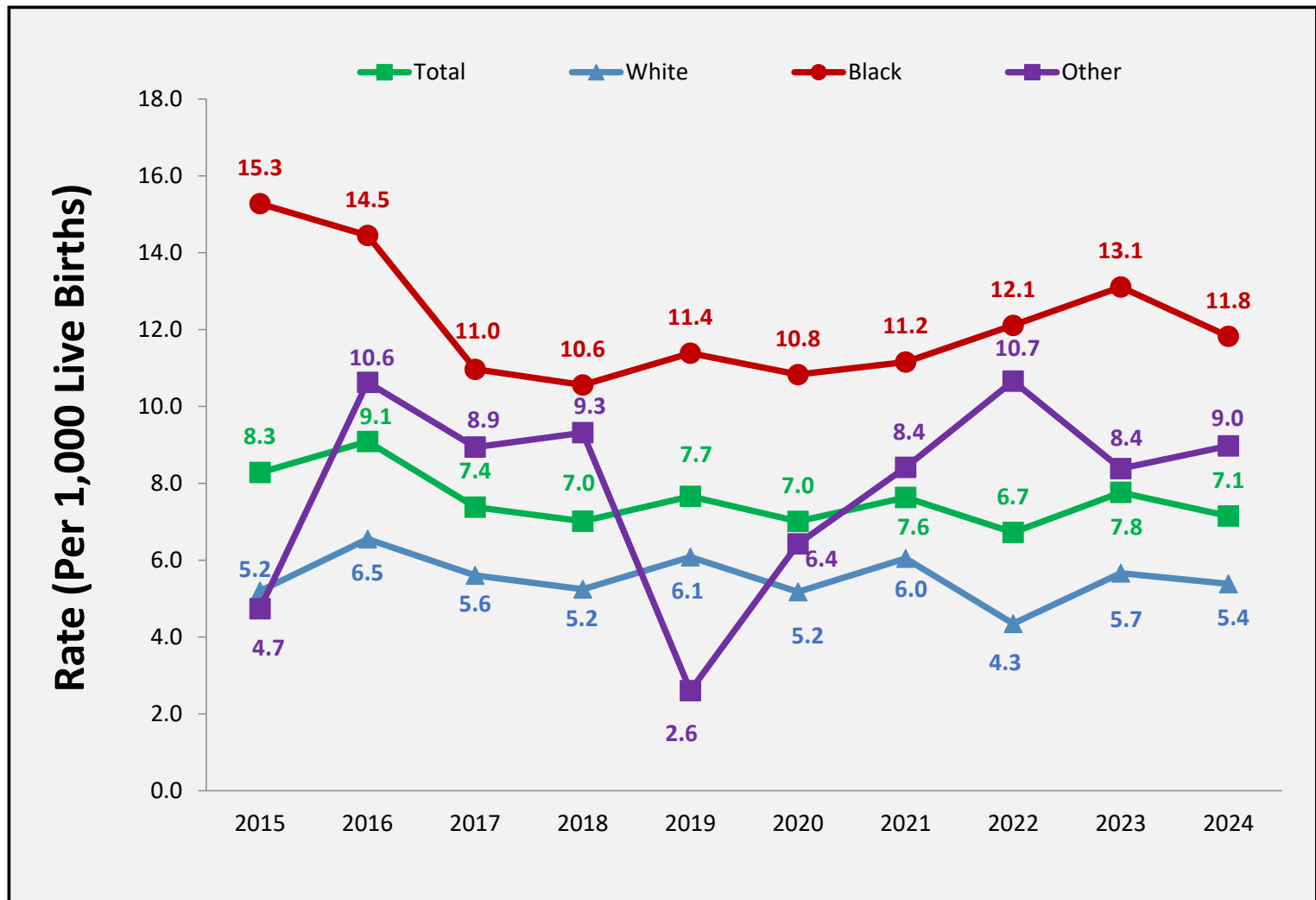


NUMBER OF BIRTHS ALABAMA, 2015-2024



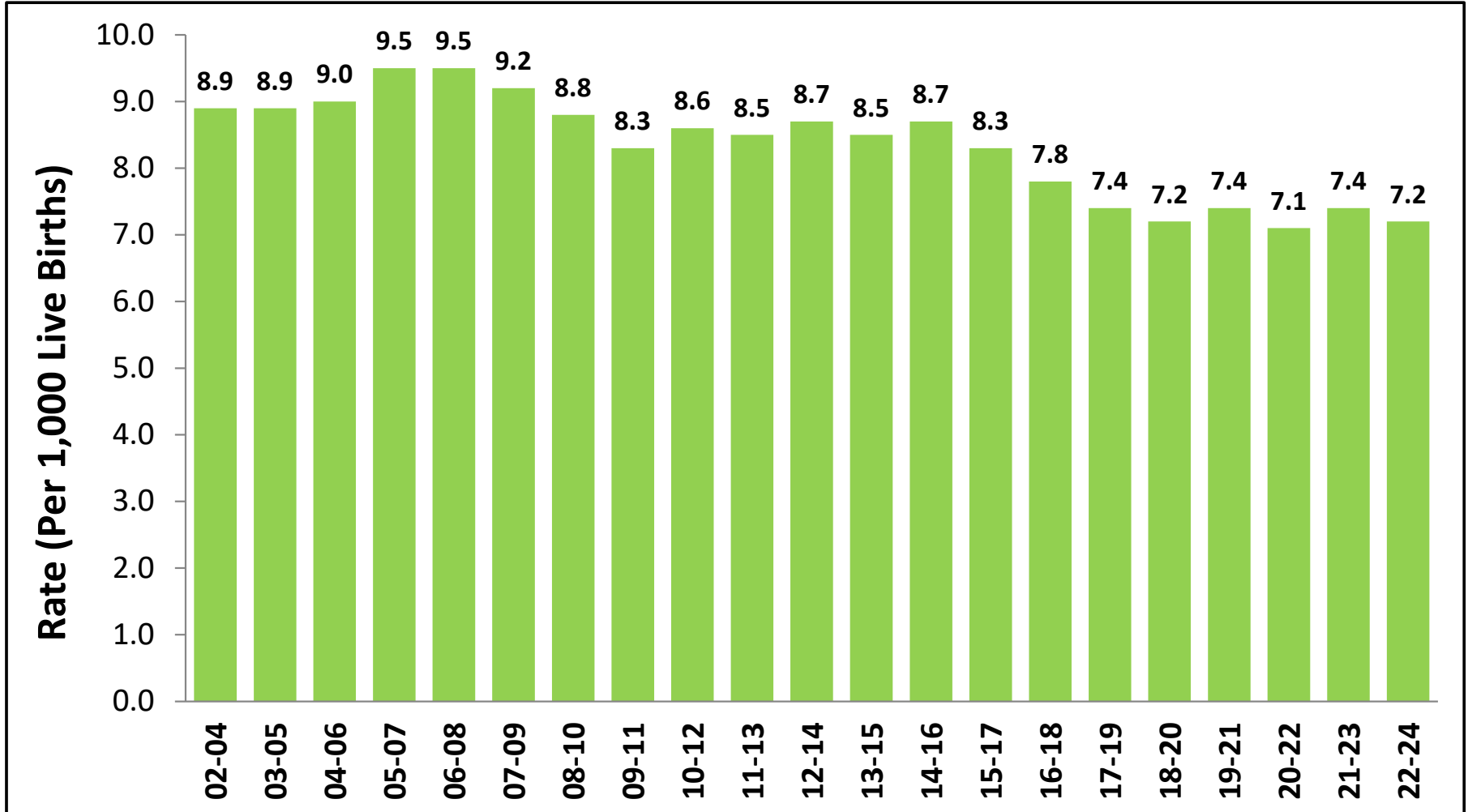

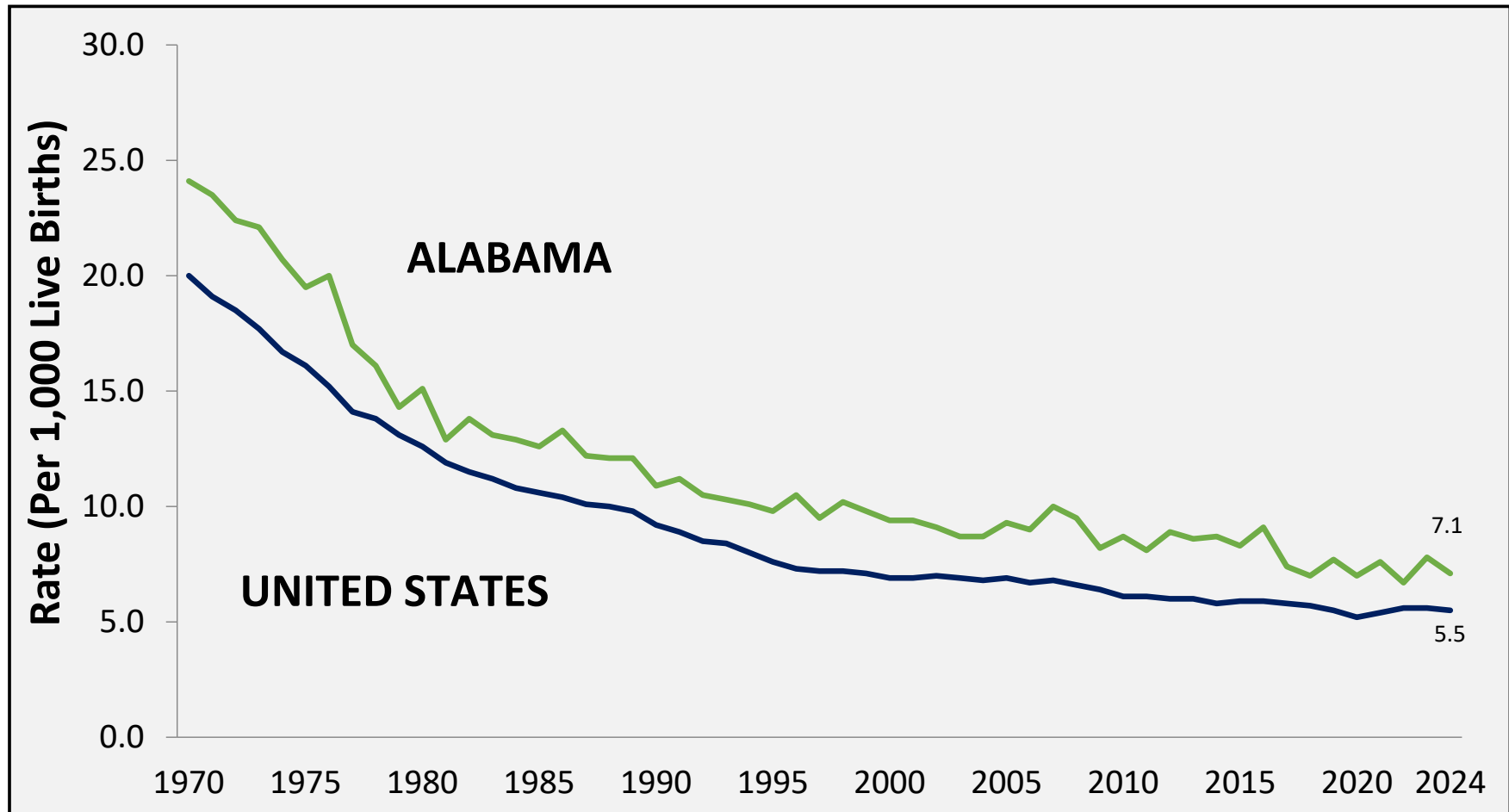
THREE-YEAR INFANT MORTALITY RATES

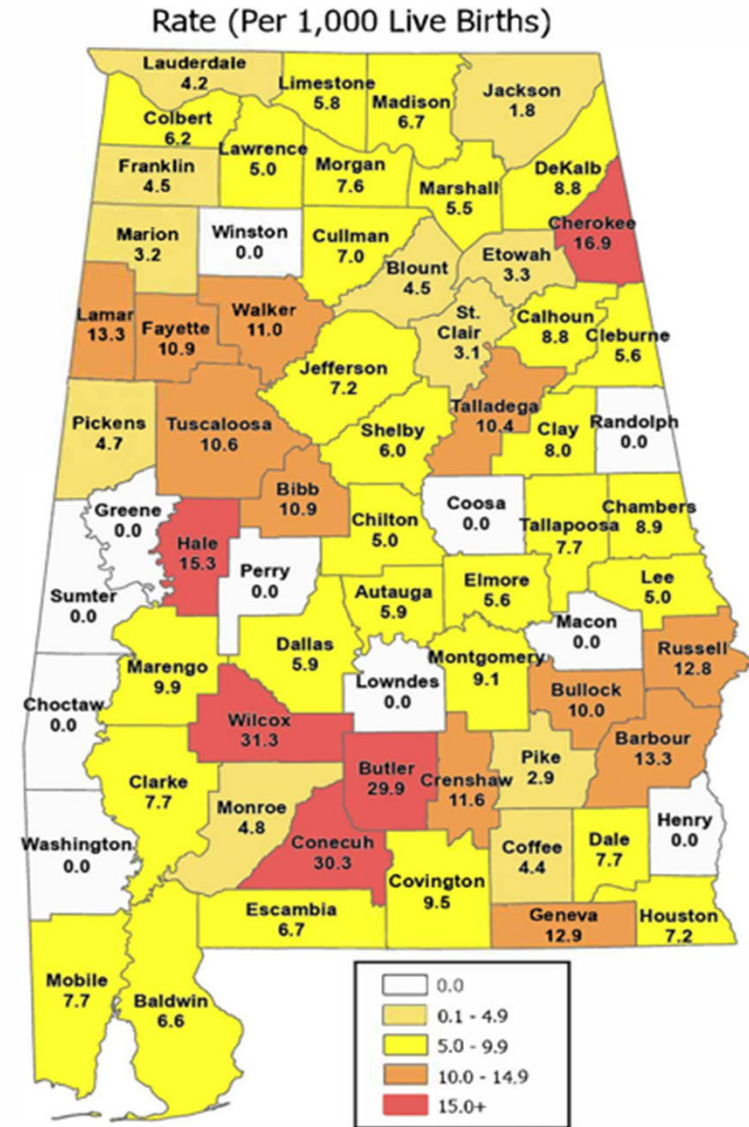

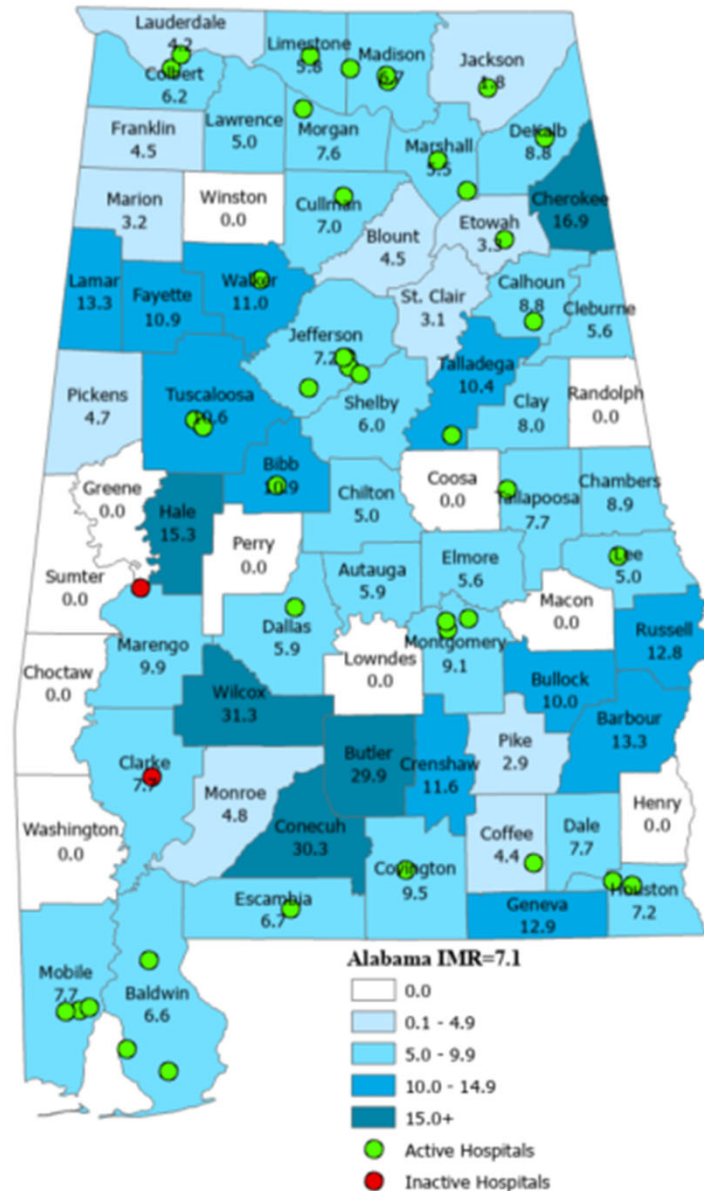

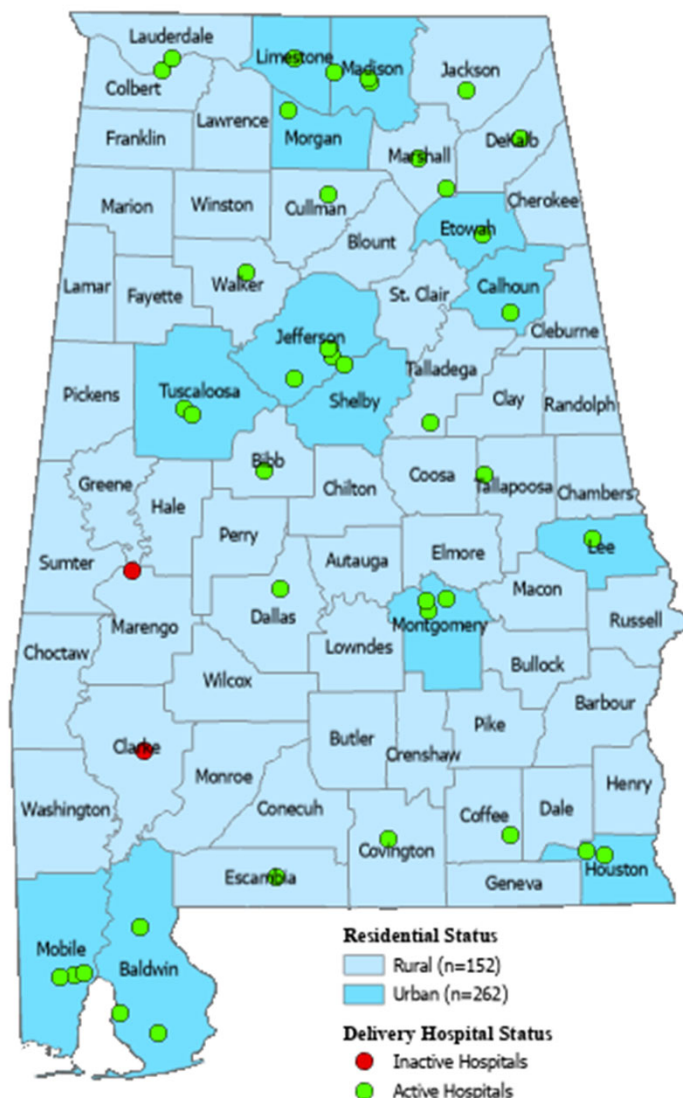

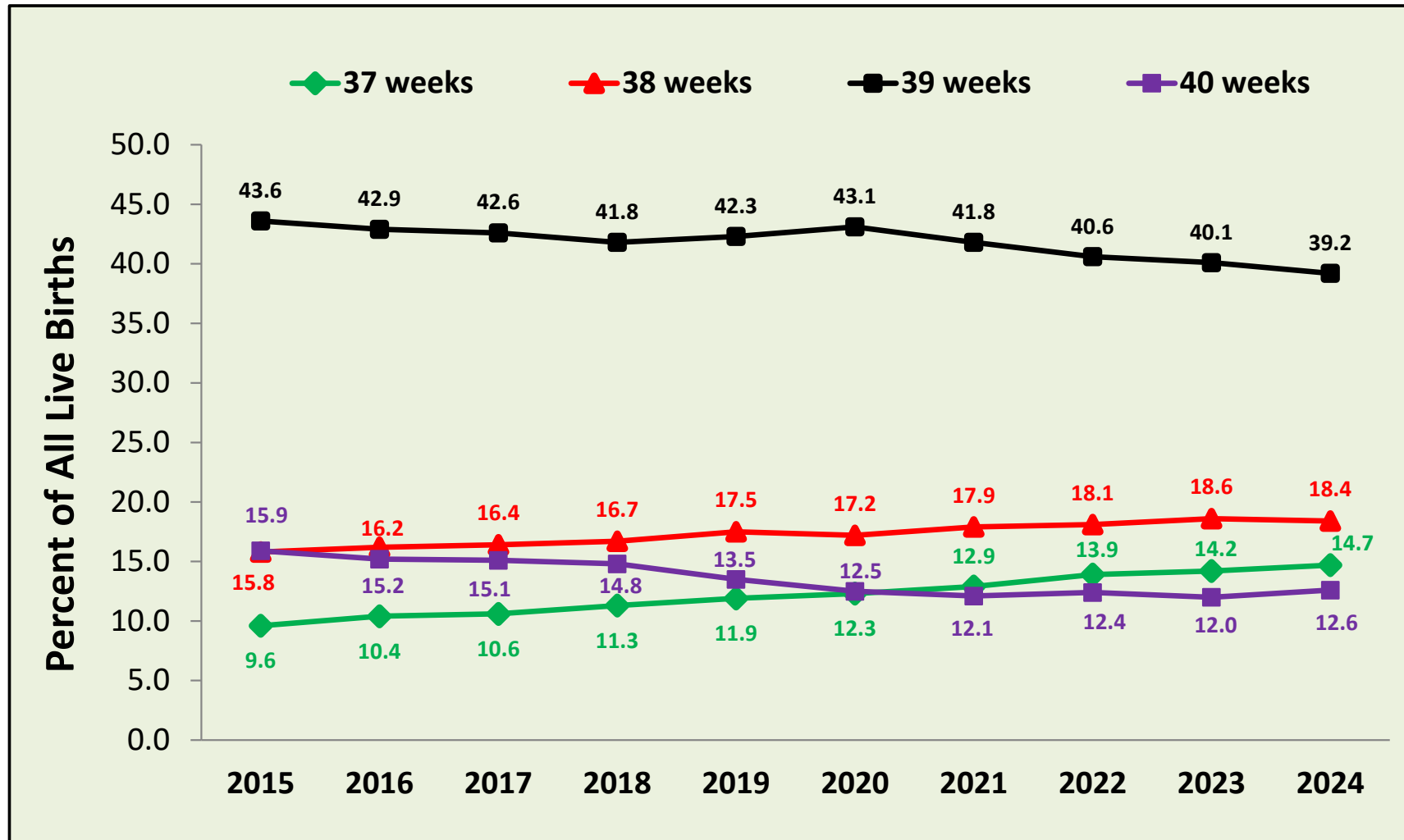

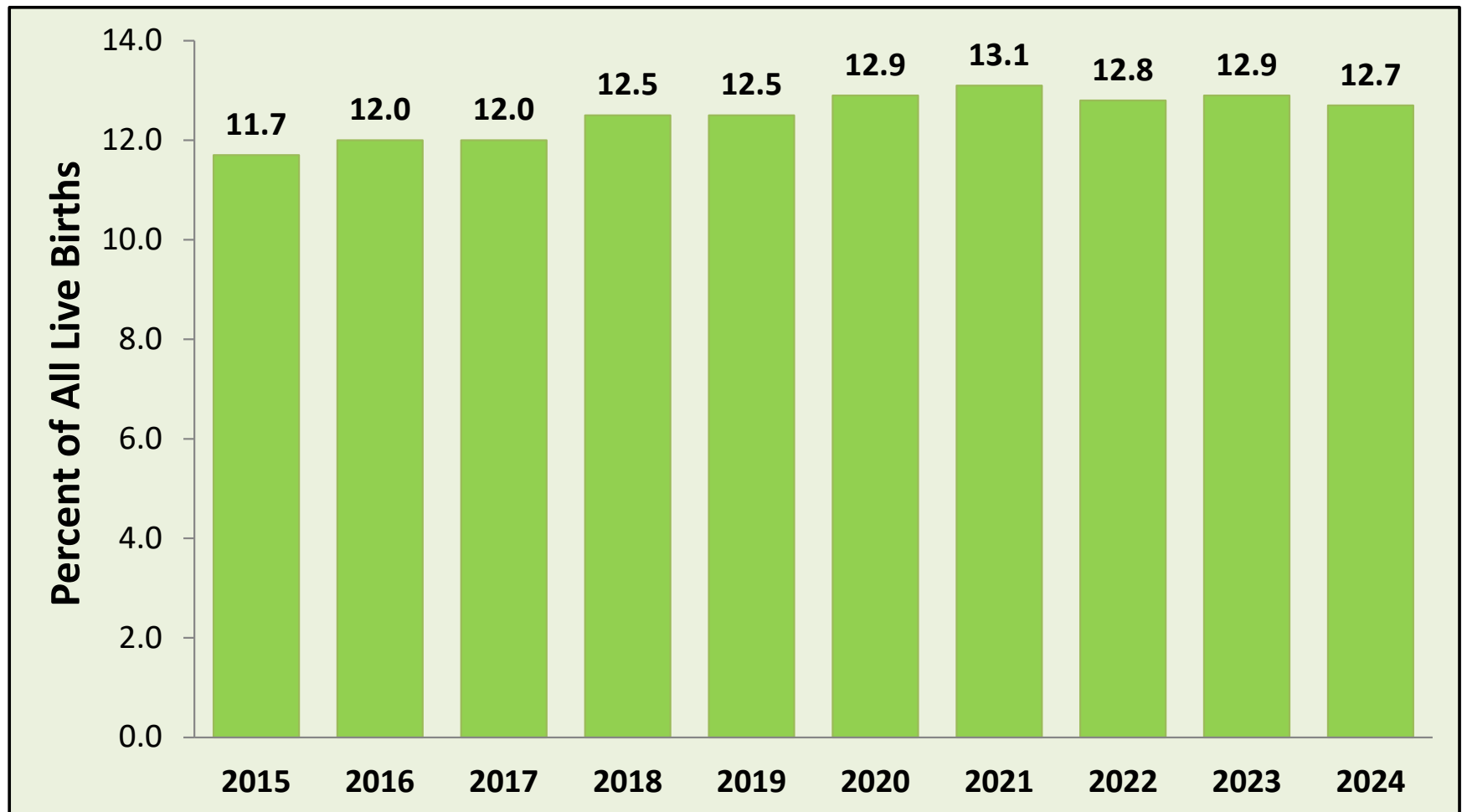

PERCENT OF BIRTHS AT 37-40 WEEKS GESTATION ALABAMA, 2015-2024

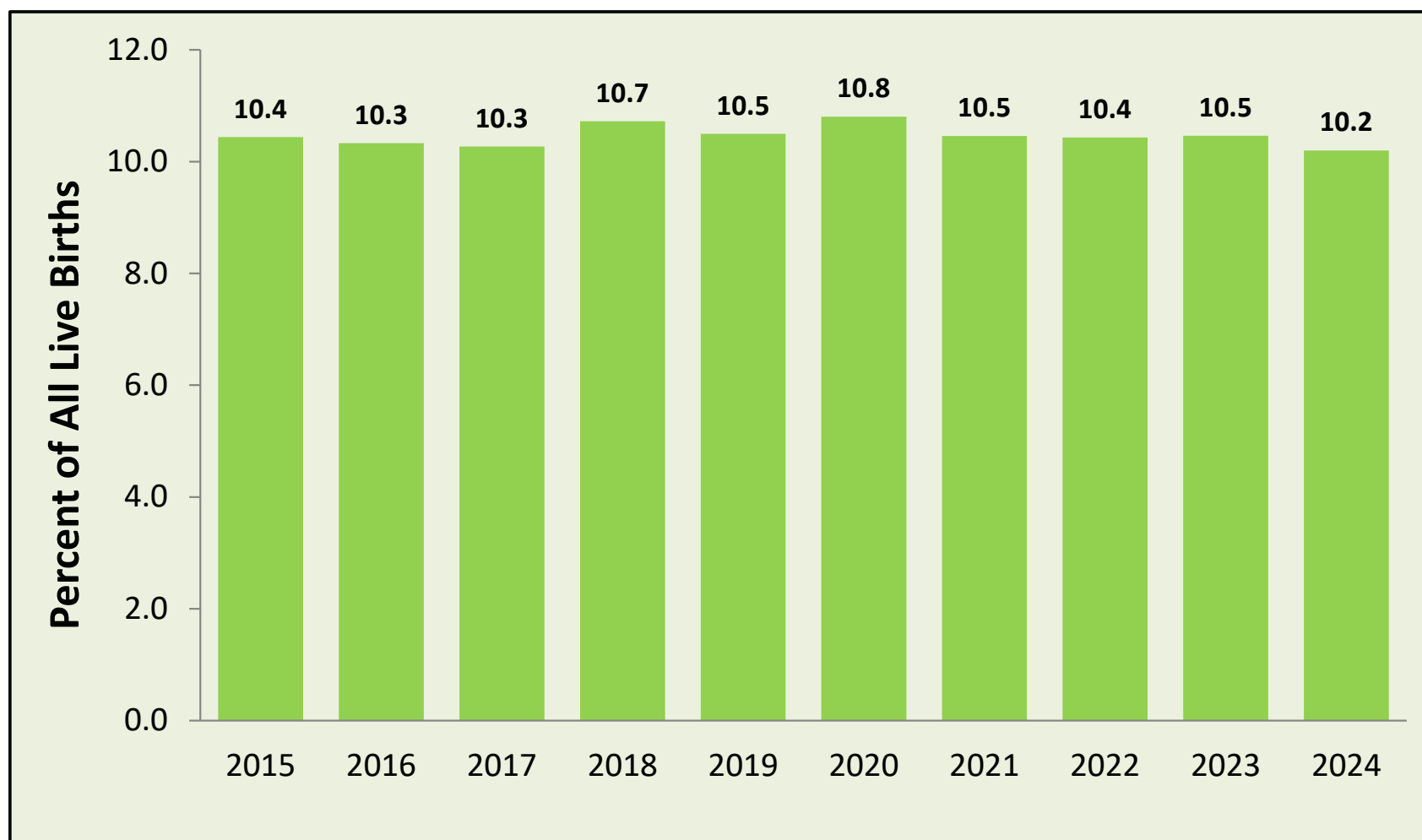


PERCENT OF BIRTHS LESS THAN 37 WEEKS GESTATION ALABAMA, 2015-2024



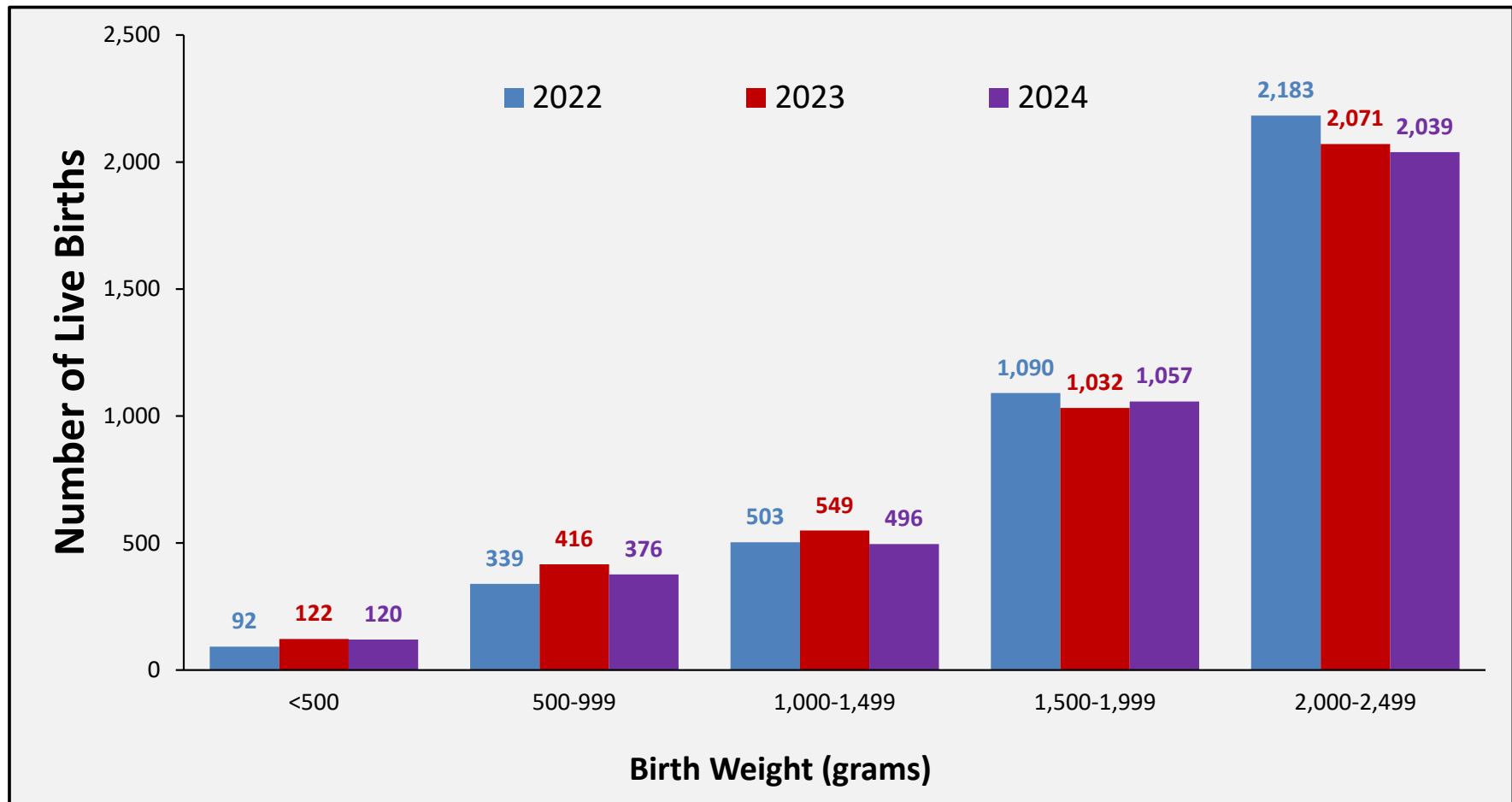
PERCENT OF LOW WEIGHT BIRTHS*

ALABAMA, 2015-2024



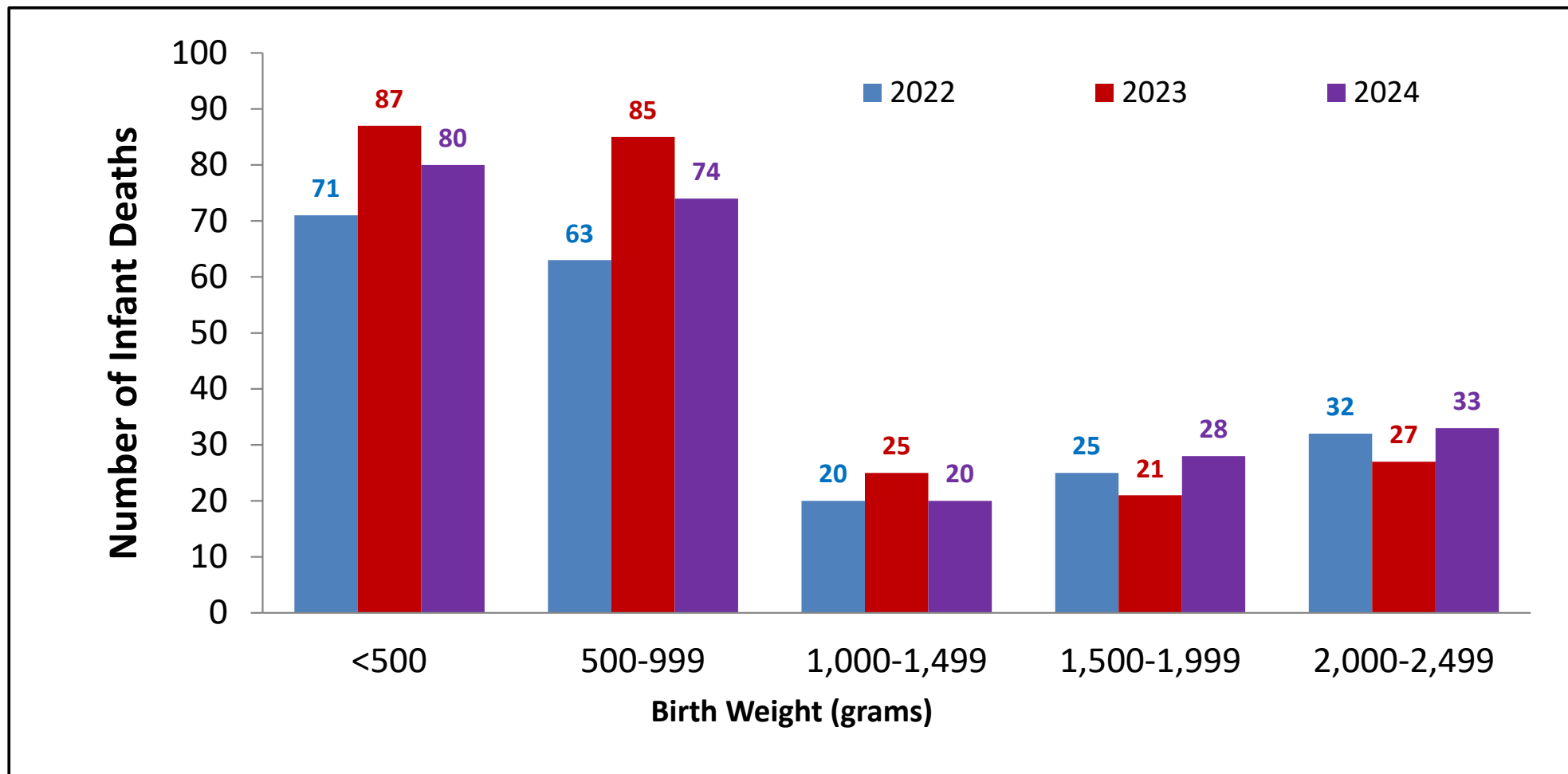

NUMBER OF PRETERM BIRTHS* BY BIRTH WEIGHT ALABAMA, 2022-2024



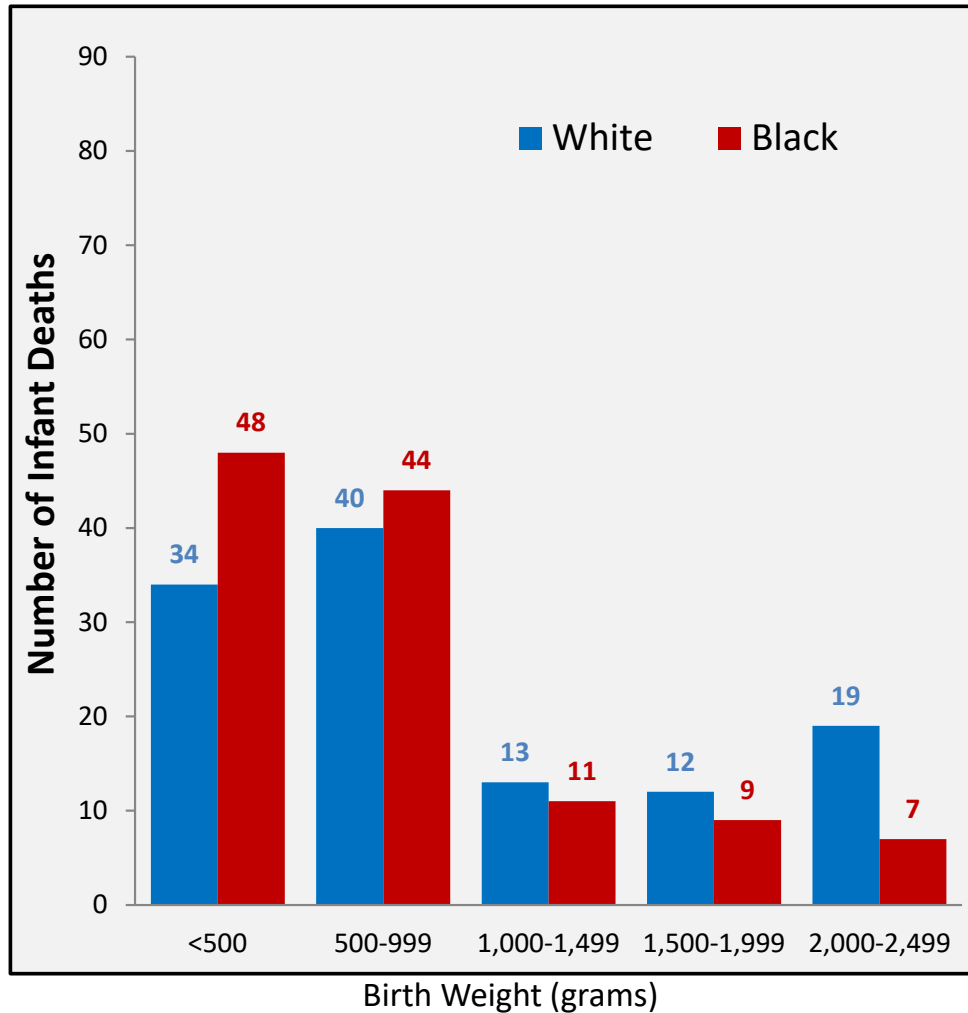

NUMBER OF INFANT DEATHS WITH PRETERM BIRTHS BY BIRTH WEIGHT ALABAMA, 2022-2024

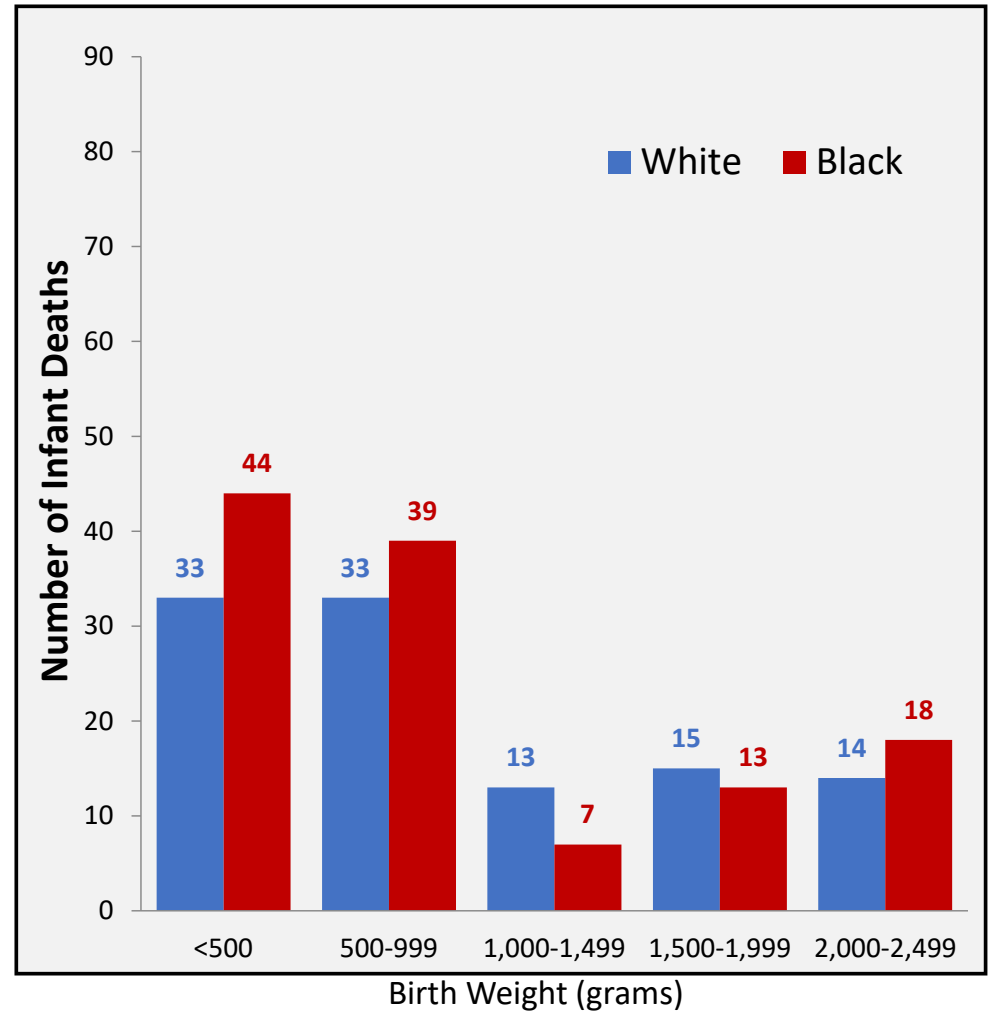

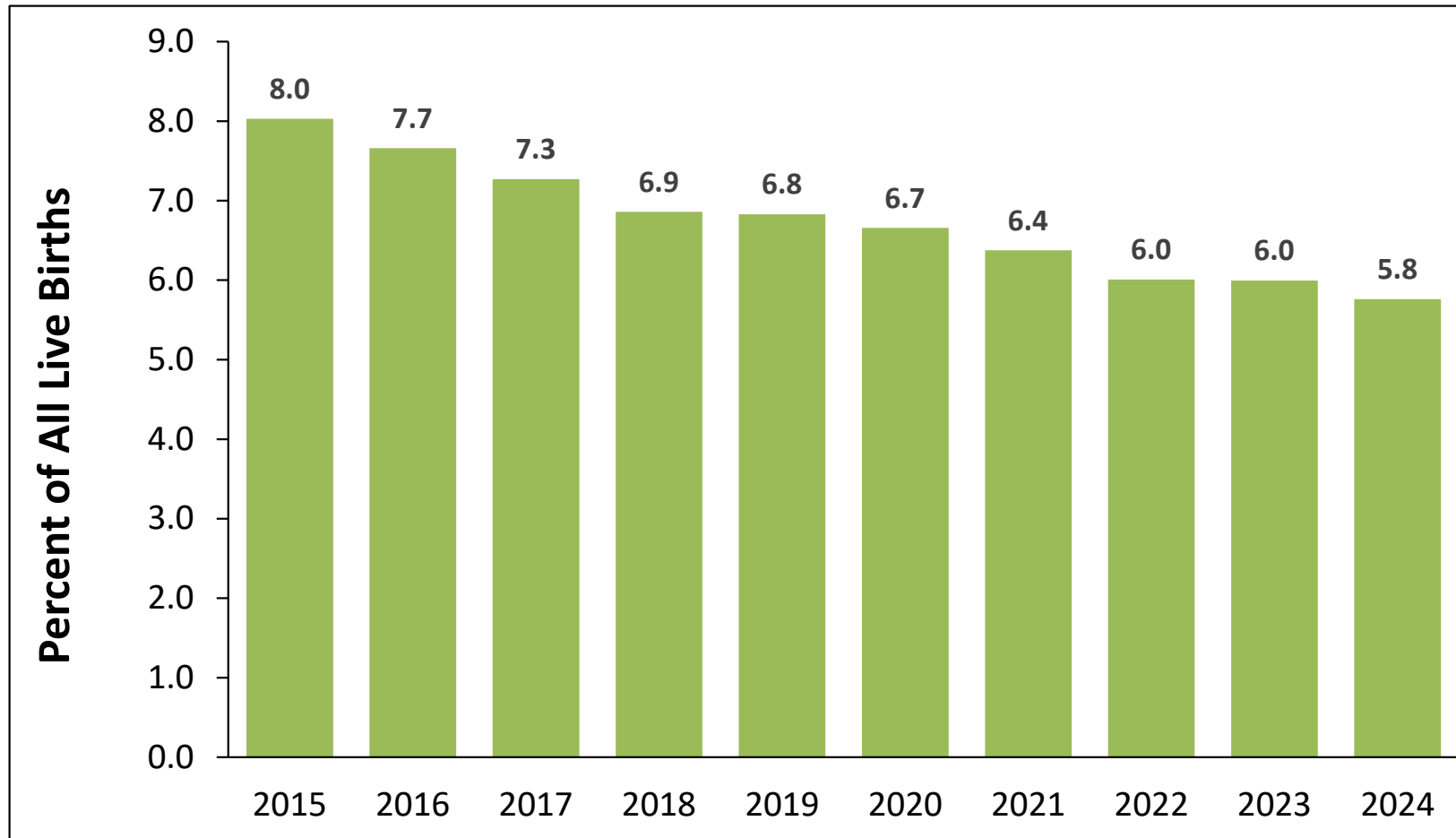

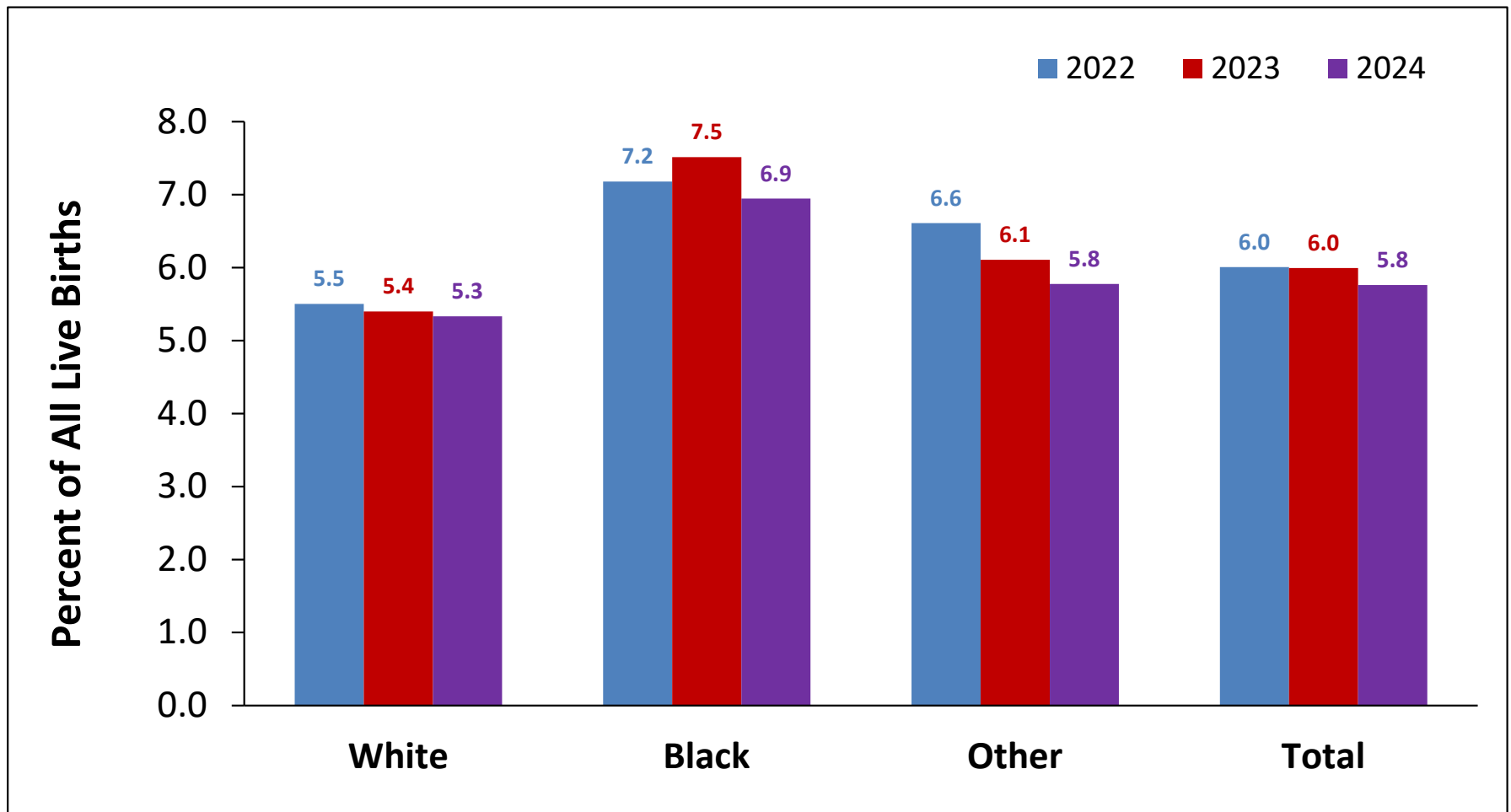

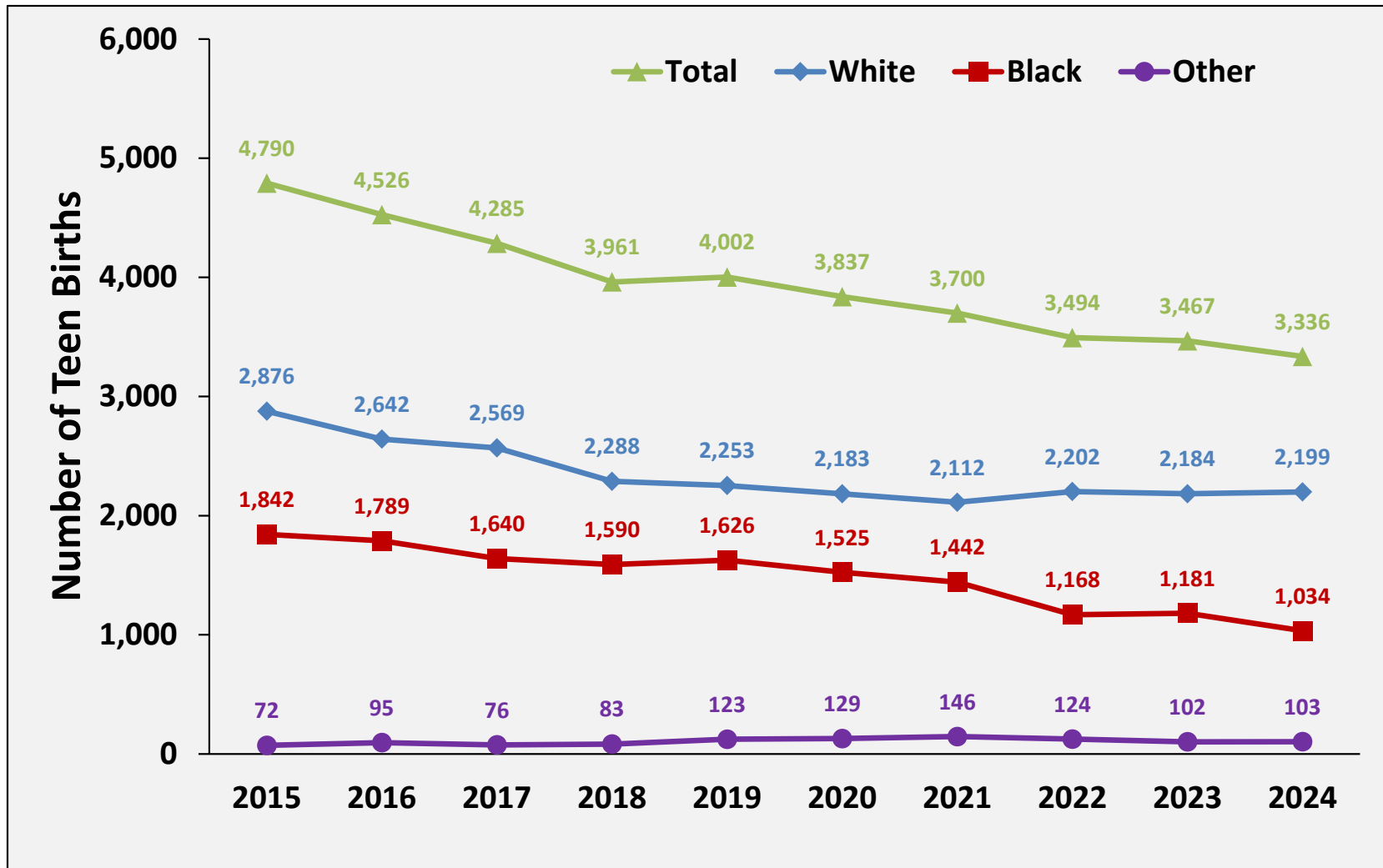
PERCENT OF BIRTHS TO TEENAGERS (AGES 10-19) ALABAMA, 2015-2024



PERCENT OF BIRTHS TO TEENAGERS (AGES 10-19) BY RACE ALABAMA, 2022-2024

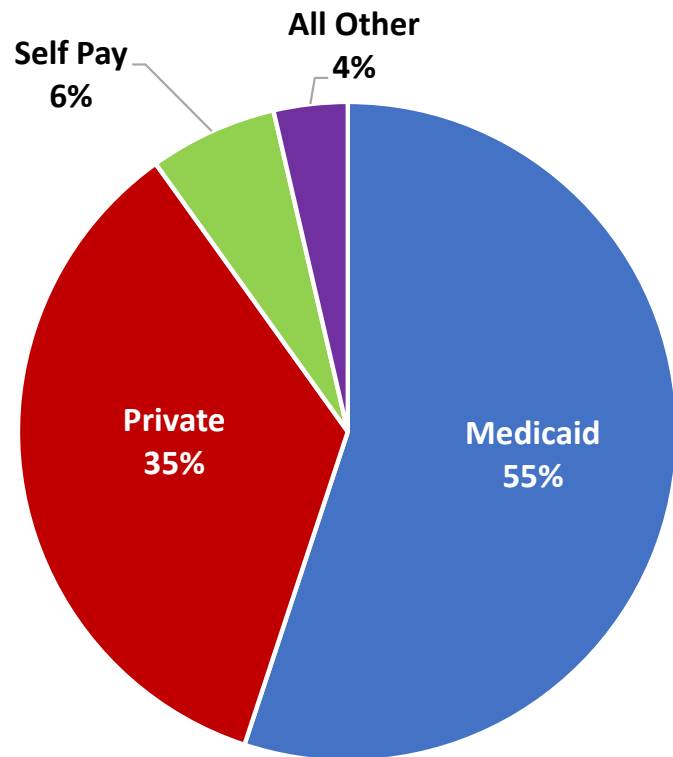

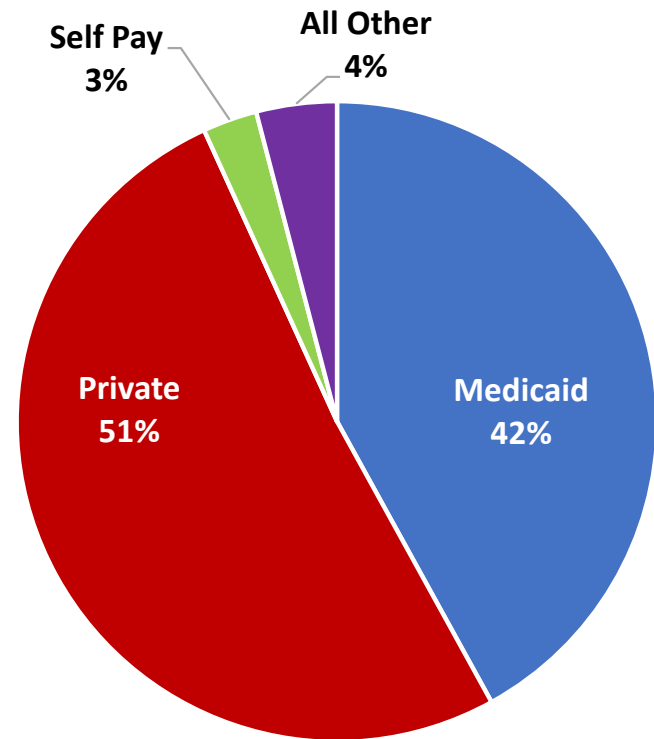

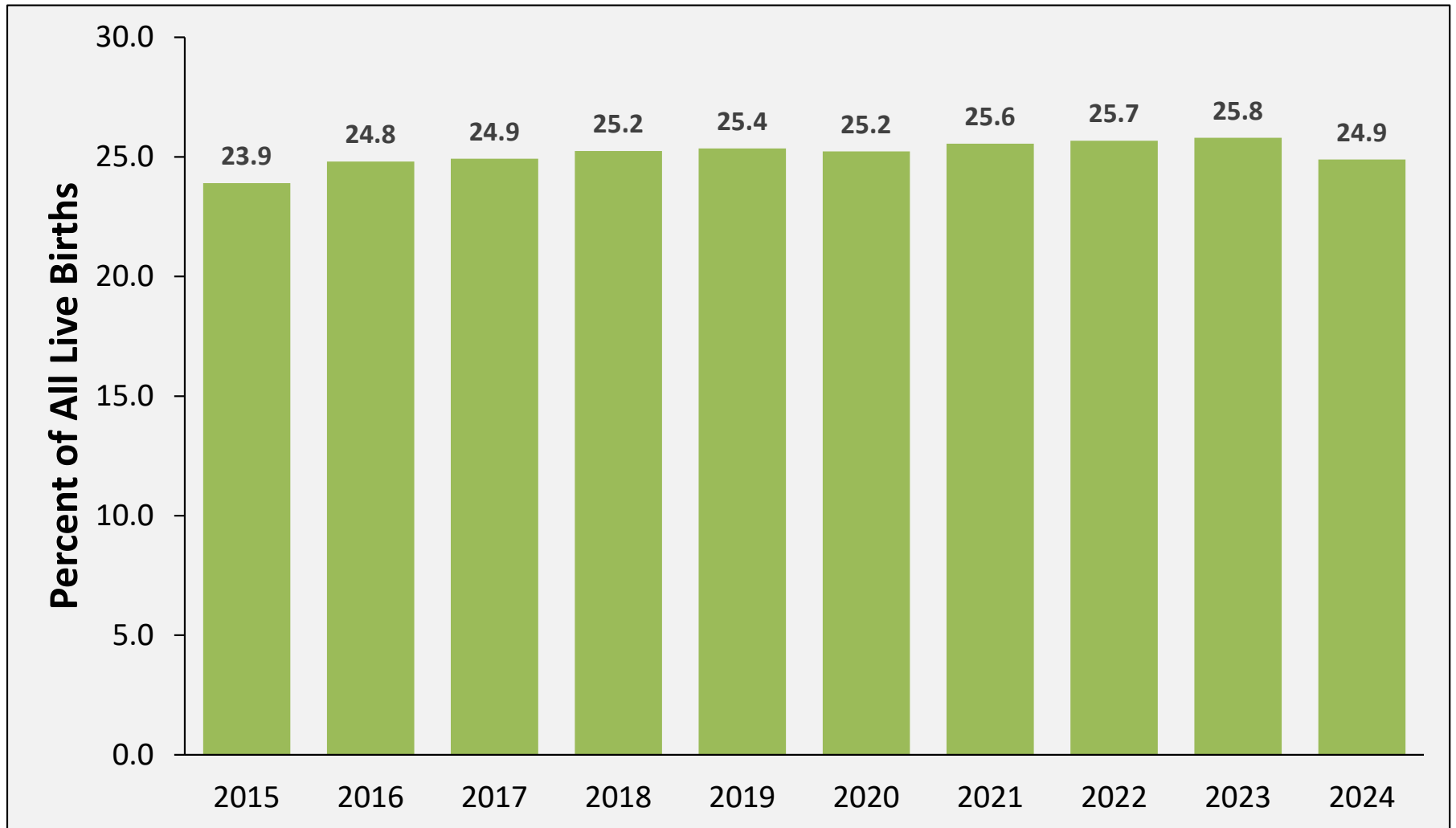

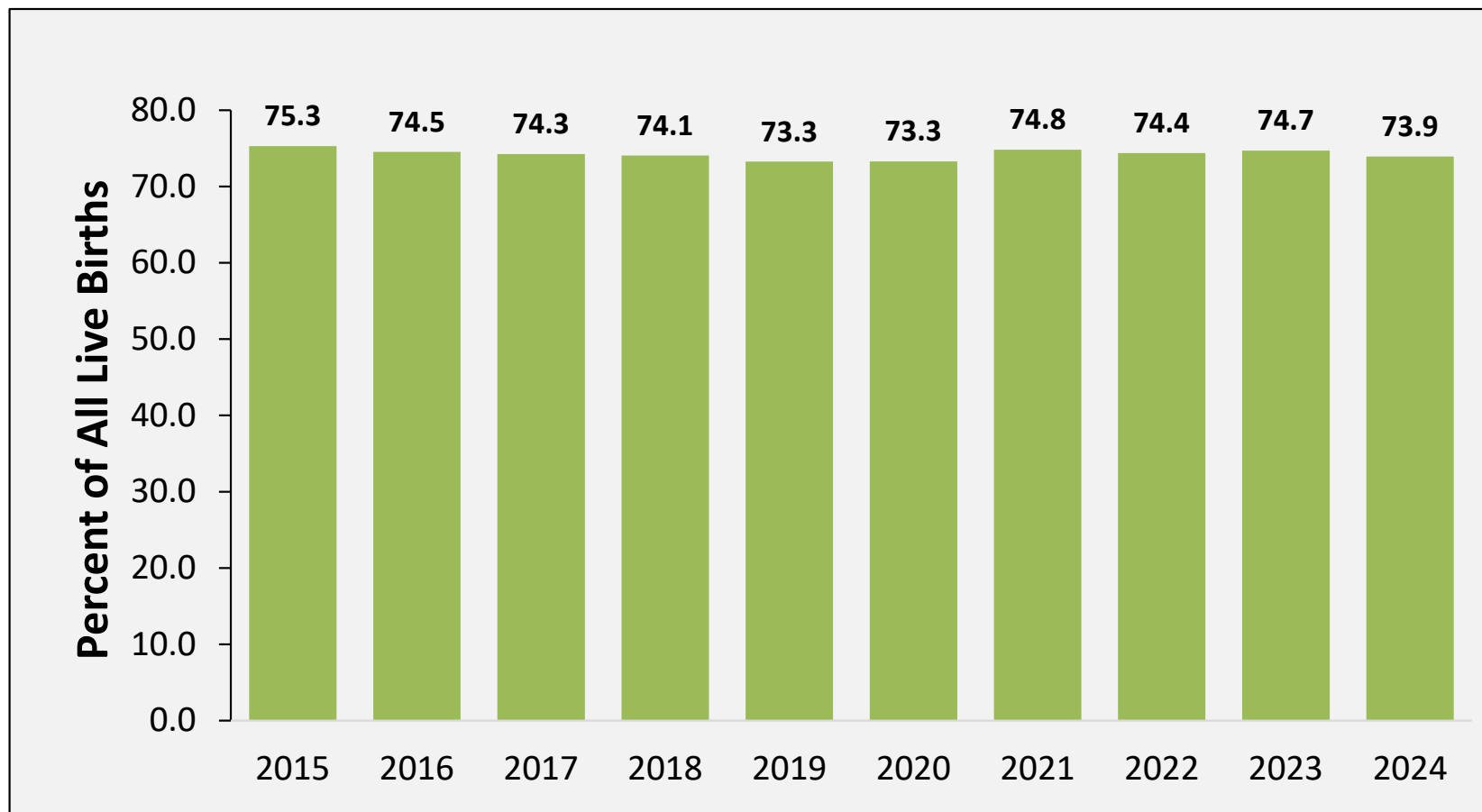


PERCENT OF BIRTHS WITH A BIRTH INTERVAL LESS THAN 2 YEARS ALABAMA, 2015-2024



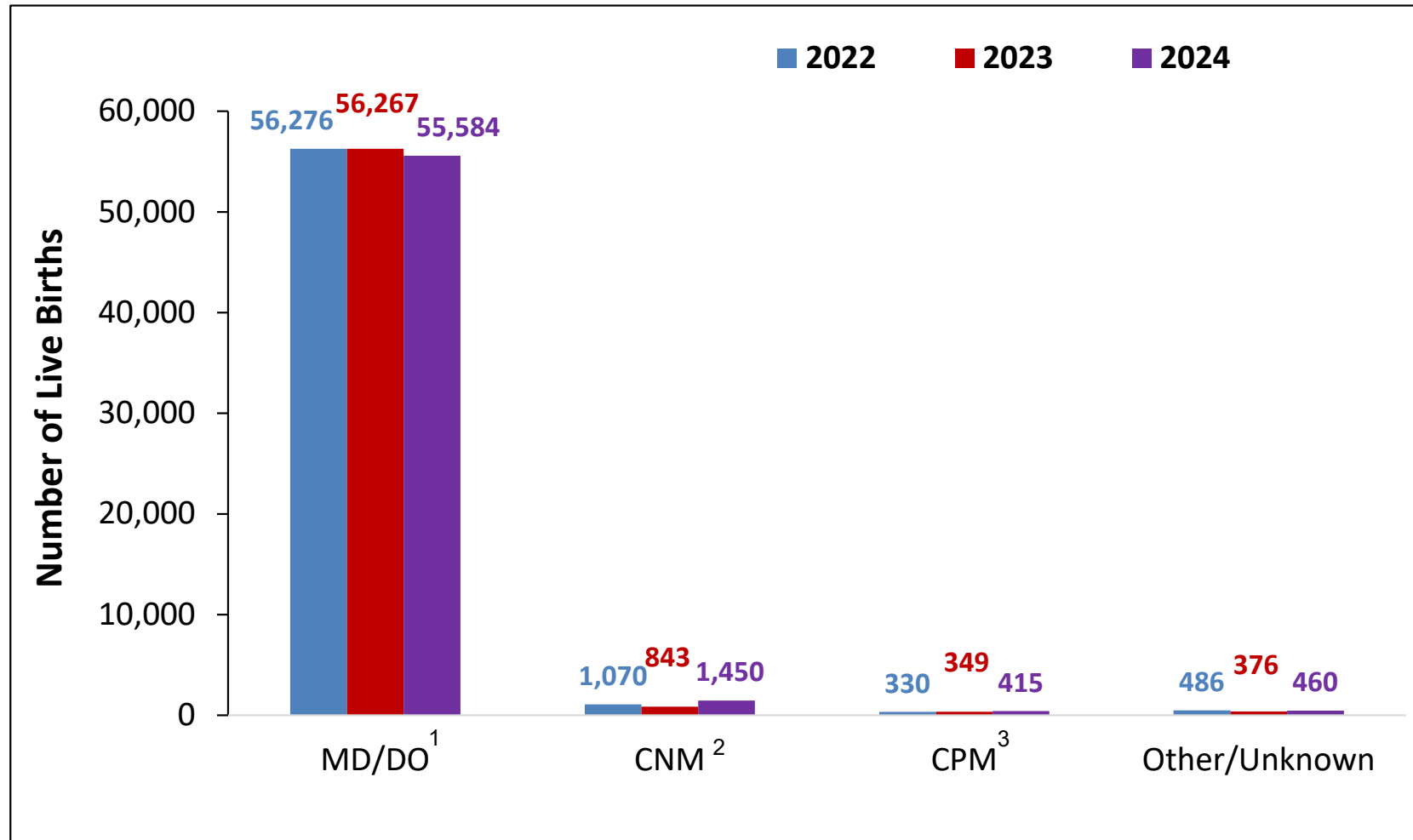
PERCENT OF BIRTHS WITH ADEQUATE PRENATAL CARE¹

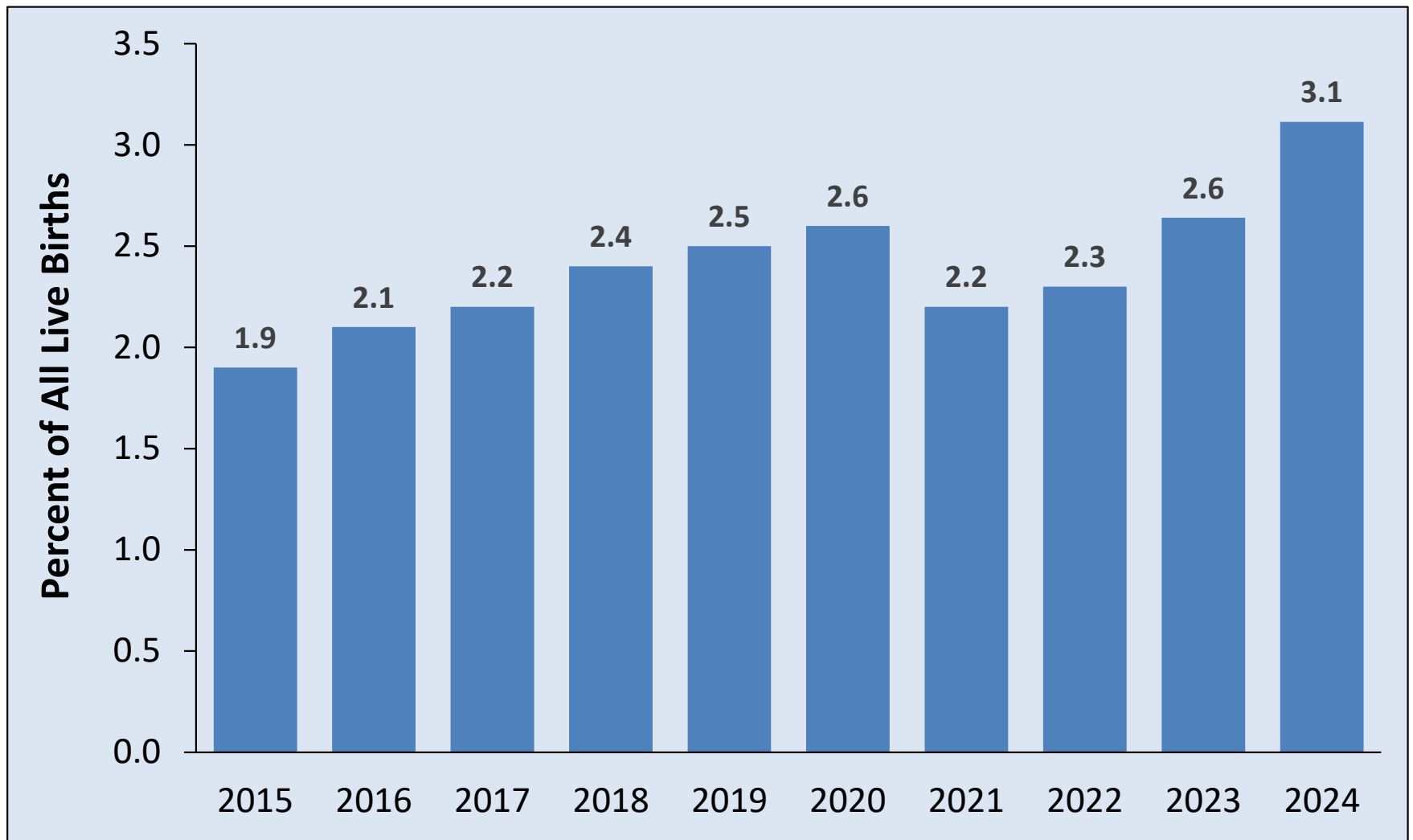

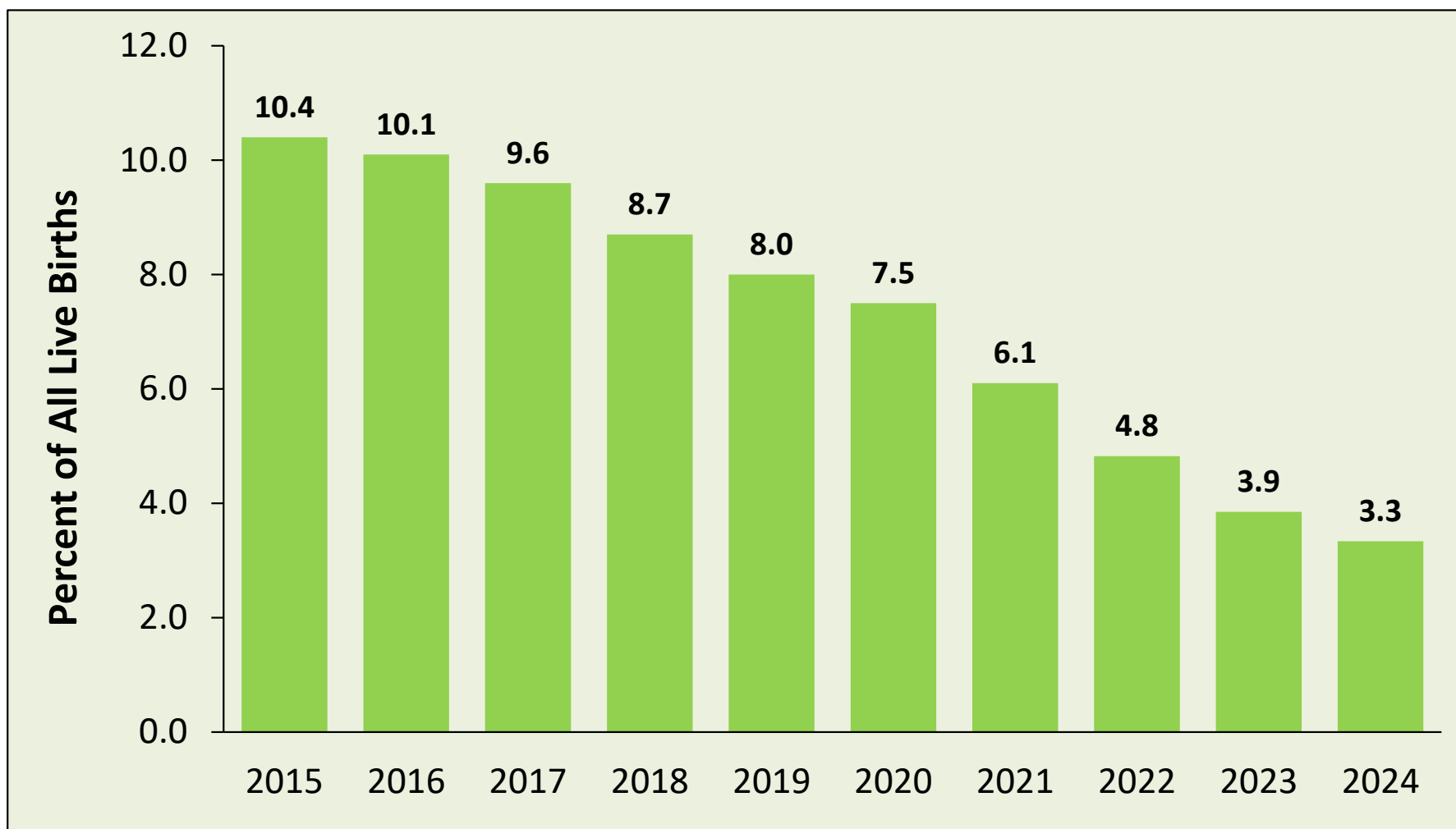

ALABAMA vs. UNITED STATES

Alabama

Change was not significant from 2023-2024 for the following indicators:

- Infant Mortality¹ (7.8 to 7.1)
- Neonatal Mortality² (4.9 to 4.4)
- Postneonatal Mortality³ (2.9 to 2.7)

United States

Change was not significant when comparing final 2023 data and provisional 2024 data for the following indicators:

- Infant mortality¹ (5.6 to 5.5)
- Neonatal Mortality² (3.7 to 3.6)
- Postneonatal Mortality³ (2.0 to 2.0)

LEADING CAUSES OF INFANT DEATHS

ALABAMA, 2024

- Three leading causes of infant deaths
 - Congenital malformations, deformations and chromosomal abnormalities (Q00-Q99)
 - Disorders related to short gestation and low birth weight, not elsewhere classified (P07)
 - Bacterial sepsis of newborn (P36)
- Three leading causes of infant deaths accounted for 42.5% of infant deaths.

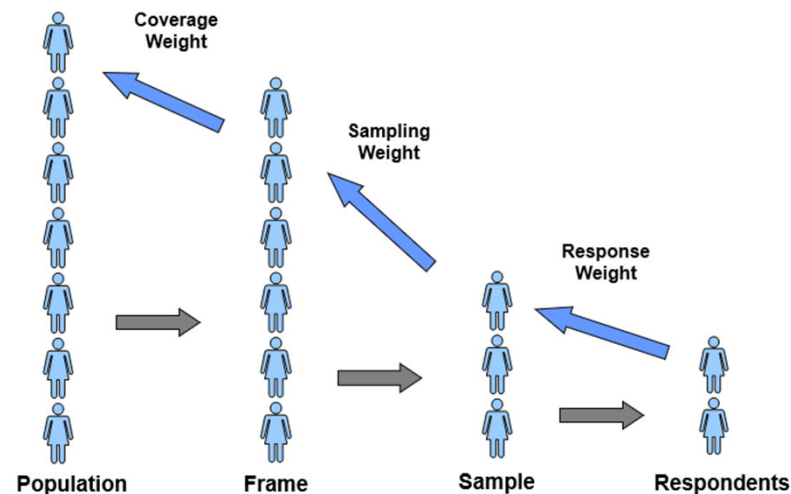

HOW DOES THE ALABAMA PREGNANCY RISK ASSESSMENT MONITORING SYSTEM (AL-PRAMS) WORK?

The Alabama Center for Health Statistics provides the AL-PRAMS Program with a randomized monthly sample of mothers who have had a recent delivery within the preceding 2 to 6 months, drawn from Alabama's birth certificate data.

The figure below visualizes how the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention used the completed surveys to accurately represent what the maternal population at the state level would select concerning topics such as vaping.

STATEWIDE SAFE SLEEP INITIATIVES

Through partnership with the National Cribs for Kids® Program, the Alabama Fetal and Infant Mortality Program (AL-FIMR) provided **1,396** Pack-n-Plays during FY 2024 (October 2023-September 2024).

Participated in Babypalooza Community Outreach Events being held in Huntsville, Birmingham, and Mobile.

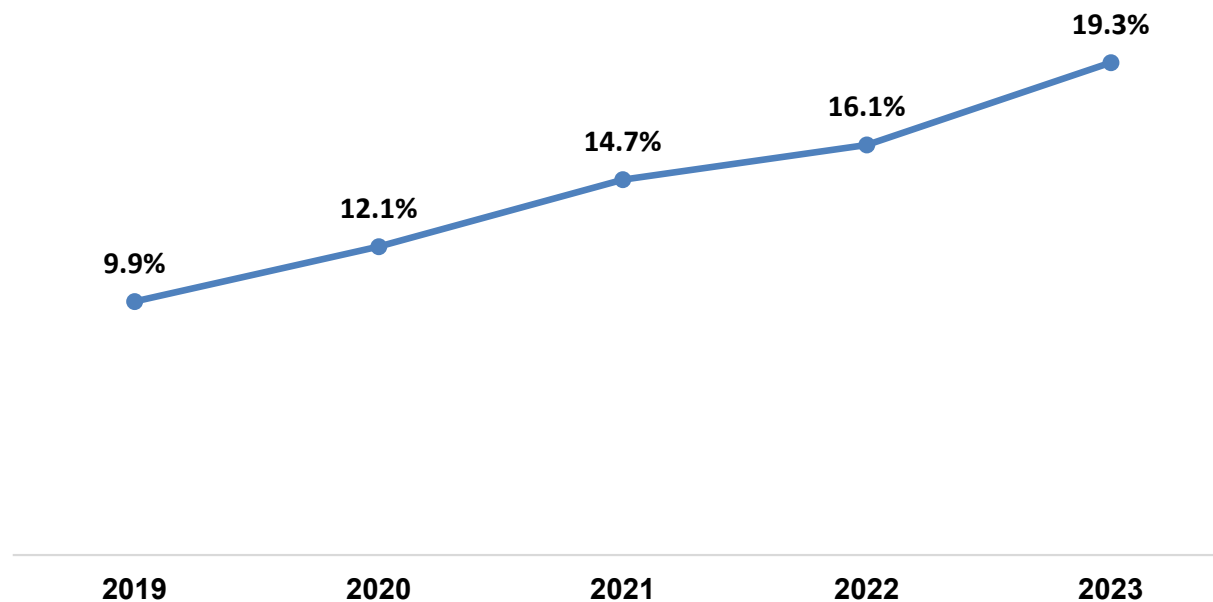
Billboards were placed statewide to increase public awareness on the ABCs of safe sleep.

Community baby showers were completed across the perinatal regions to emphasize the importance of safe sleep.

Most of Alabama's delivering hospitals (**86 percent; n=37/43**) collaborated to distribute safe sleep baby books.

Collaborated with high schools, colleges, and hospitals to promote the Clear the Crib Challenge, which emphasizes the importance of a safe sleep environment.

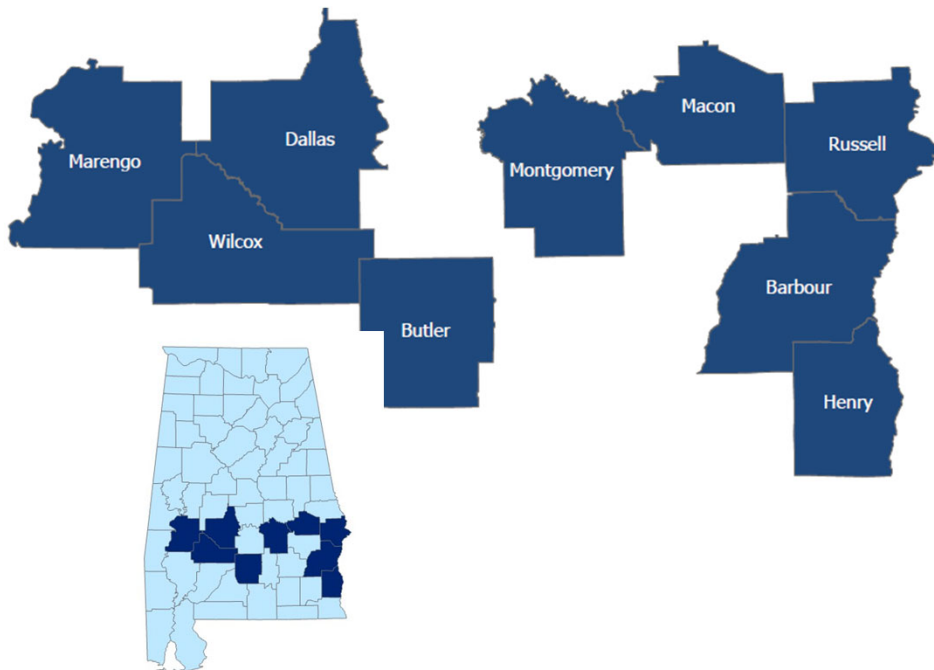
WELL WOMAN INITIATIVE
