

Safe Freshwater Swimming Practices

Primary Amebic Meningoencephalitis is a rare infection caused when water containing Naegleria fowleri, a brain-eating ameba, goes up the nose and to the brain.



Where is it located?

- Lakes
- Rivers
- Hot springs
- Poorly treated swimming pools • Soil
- Well water
- Water heaters
- Power plant discharge



Signs & Symptoms

- Headache
- Fever
- Nausea
- Vomiting
- Stiff neck

- Seizures
- Altered mental status
- Coma



Unsafe Swimming Practices

Contaminated freshwater

You **CANNOT** get sick from **drinking** water contaminated with *Naegleria fowleri*. However, you can get sick when this water goes up into your nose.

DO

- Hold your nose shut or use nose clips
- Keep your head above water



DON'T

- X Jump or dive in warm fresh water
- X Put your head under water
- X Stir up bottom sediment in warm fresh water
