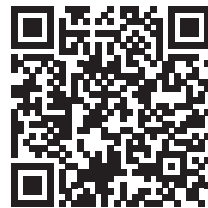

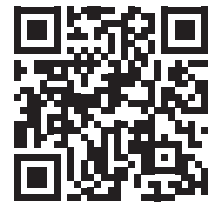

Oral Health Matters, Especially during Pregnancy: An Alabama Guide



Purpose of the Alabama Pregnancy Risk Assessment Monitoring System (PRAMS)

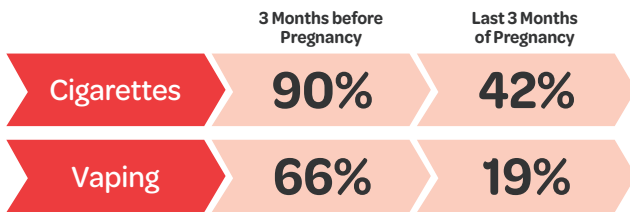
PRAMS surveys new mothers to identify groups of women and infants at high risk for health problems, monitor changes in health status, and measure progress towards goals in improving the health of mothers and infants. PRAMS participants are asked about lifestyle habits that could have an impact on both the mother's and the baby's overall health. This includes questions about the mother's dental cleaning, nicotine use, and alcohol use. PRAMS survey responses are used to project these risk factors related to oral health and other topics among those who deliver in Alabama.

Dental Cleaning during Recent Pregnancy



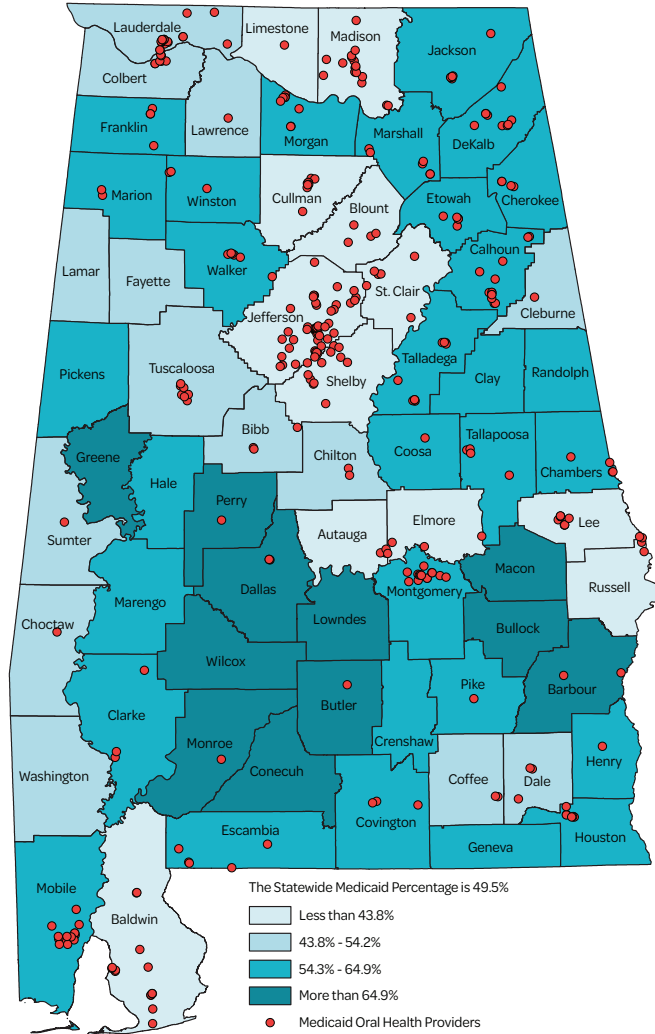
Mothers who used Nicotine within the Past 2 Years



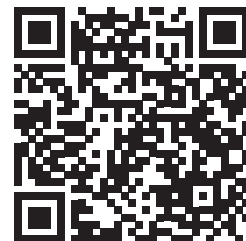
What Oral Health Topics were Discussed at Prenatal Visits?

Burden of Oral Health Disease

According to the Alabama Statewide Cancer Registry, there were 282 oral cancer cases among women of childbearing age (15-54 years old) between 2016 and 2021.
