# Currently, preparedness and public health training is delivered through several collaborative organizations:

- South Central Preparedness and Emergency Response Learning Center – CDC – Funding began July 2002
- South Central Public Health Training Center HRSA Funding began in 2000
- South Central Public Health Leadership Institute Initially funded by CDC in 1995, now funded by states.



- Mission: to improve the nation's public health preparedness and response capabilities for emergencies whether deliberate, accidental or natural, through objective and competency based training methods.
- Target audience: State and local public health workforce, first responders and first receivers (anyone responsible for responding to a public health emergency or crisis)
