

Elmore County Schools Tobacco Policy

CLASS II OFFENSES

Reasonable efforts will be made to notify parents of offending students and/or victims of Class II incidents.

Possession and/or use of tobacco products, matches, lighter— having or using tobacco products on the school premises or at any school-sponsored activity. Unauthorized possession of non-controlled substances that are represented to be tobacco	Grade K - 4	
	First Offense	--Parent Contact and School Designated Disciplinary Action
	Second Offense	--School Designated Disciplinary Action or Alternative to Suspension (1 day)
	Third Offense	-- Alternative to Suspension (3 days) --Out of School Suspension (1 day) or
	Fourth Offense	--Alternative to Suspension (5 days) (Designated by the school)
	Grades 5 - 12	
	First Offense	--Out of school suspension (1 Day)
	Second Offense	--Out of school suspension (2 Days)
	Third Offense	--Out of school suspension (3 Days)

The administrator or designee may assign an alternative consequence to those listed after giving due consideration to the age and maturity of the child when exceptional or mitigating circumstances exist.

Similarly, if a child commits two or more Class II offenses, then the administrator or designee may impose a more significant consequence than those listed for the individual offenses. Referrals may be combined to determine the number of offenses.

Habitual/Multiple Class II offenses may result in assignments to ECAP.

Students may be assigned to their homes while awaiting placement in the Elmore County Alternative Program. It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to pickup academic assignments from the home school until placement date at ECAP or until assigned days are complete.
